

City Paving Mass Meeting At 7:30 Tonight

Paving costs, types of paving, and the cost of the proposed paving project in the City of Stratford will be placed before interested citizens who gather in the district court room at the court house in Stratford this evening at 7:30 P. M. by members of the City Council who have given their time in investigating the cost of the proposed paving as well as the types and cost of paving that has been completed in other towns of the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles.

It will be the intention of the City Council to lay the paving problem as it exists before Stratford citizens, answer any and all questions citizens who may desire available information may ask; giving any citizen a hearing for whatever discussion of the situation which he may desire to make.

Council members have been dogged by residents favoring and against the paving project in Stratford for several months. They believe that if sufficient citizens are interested in the paving of the streets they will attend this meeting at which time the cost of the paving will be discussed. If the citizens believe the cost of the paving project is within financial reach of Stratford's citizens, and want the streets paved, the Council expects these citizens to either let their desires be known at this meeting or let them rest in peace if the paving issue is forgotten.

It is conceded by all parties that if streets of the city are paved the best method of doing so is through cash payment of the citizens made to the City Council, and placed in safe keeping by the City government until the paving contract is completed, at which time the cost of construction is paid.

It is further conceded that if the City is to profit from any sizeable donations, these contributions will be mostly those made before the first of the year, when most income tax data is compiled.

Every consideration possible has been given by Council members over the paving controversy. Now that data has been compiled, the matter is being placed before the citizens for their approval or rejection.

There seems to be no difference in opinion as to the fact that Stratford needs more paving. The question foremost in the minds of the citizens is the problem as to whether the cost of such a civic improvement program is within the financial limitations of its citizens.

The meeting tonight will give citizens an opportunity to decide this prevailing question for themselves. If the paving issue is rejected, it is just another one of those conveniences desired by many, but outside the financial limitations of others.

Ps. 37:23. Order my steps in thy word." Ps. 11:133. Is it possible for even two to differ and both of them be right? It is impossible. If one says the horse is black and another says it is white we know one is wrong. If one says "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved and another says "baptism has nothing to do with our salvation we know one or the other is wrong. Jesus said "he that believeth and is baptized shall be saved. Man says baptism has nothing to do with our salvation, which one is right? If Jesus is right, man is wrong. He also says, "In vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." Mat. 15th chapter. Notice he says "doctrines of men." Doctrines is plural. The doctrine of Christ is never in the plural number. It is always singular. Christ has but one doctrine. Doctrines are always of men.

The idea that all of them prove their doctrines by the Bible is a mistake. No man can prove a falsehood to be true by the Bible. The Bible is true. It is true that all false teachers quote the scriptures trying to prove their doctrines, but they pervert the word of God in so doing. As to how you are to know which one is right, all you need do is just go to your Bible and read it for yourself, and you can easily tell which one is right.

Social Security Act Favors Vets

In August, 1946, the Social Security Act was amended to provide for payments, in some cases, to survivors of deceased World War II veterans. This legislation simply provided that if a veteran died within 3 years of date of his discharge, his survivors would be entitled to Old-Age and Survivors Insurance payments if they were not receiving, or not entitled to receive, Veterans Administration payments.

To illustrate the nature and importance of these payments, the following example is stated. The veteran in this case was never engaged in employment covered by the Social Security Act, having worked as a farmer before his military service. After his discharge he went into business for himself, was accidentally killed some months afterward. Upon filing application recently, his widow qualified for monthly payments for herself of \$24.18, with monthly payments for a 4 year old child of \$16.12, and the same for a 2 year old child. The total payments in this case, retroactive to the month of the veteran's death, amount to \$56.42 a month, and will be payable until the oldest child is 18 years of age. For the next two years the payments to the widow and younger child will amount to \$40.40 per month, with the widow entitled to a monthly payment of \$24.18 from age 65 to death unless she remarries. Total payments in this case, exclusive of payments to the widow after she is 65, will amount to approximately \$10,500.

J. R. Sanderson, manager of the Amarillo Social Security Field Office, urges the survivors of deceased World War III veterans to contact his office if they believe payments under the new legislation may be possible. He points out, particularly, that prompt inquiries should be made because after February 10, 1947, these payments cannot be retroactive for more than the usual 3 months. Before that date payments are retroactive to the date of death, even if death occurred as far back as the latter part of 1940.

City Health Building Fund Has \$4,030.00

Consumers Company Plans Expansion Program

A 48x60 foot brick addition to the Consumers Company building in Stratford will soon be under construction. The new building space will be used as a wash room, grease room and store house. L. L. Lyon has the construction contract.

Brick for the new building is to arrive this week and steel for construction work has been promised by December 20.

A proposed amendment to the Consumers Company charter which will be voted on at the annual stockholders meeting January 13, would authorize the company officers to issue 3 shares of stock to the holder of each share of stock in the company, increasing the shares from 200 to 800. It will be the privilege of the stockholders, if the proposed amendment is adopted, to either keep or sell the shares to other parties. A two-third vote of the stockholders is required to amend the company charter.

3 New Drilling Locations Are Announced

Three new drilling locations have been announced in Sherman County.

Cities Service Oil Co. No. 1 Langston, will be drilled in section 347, Block 1-T.

Phillips Petroleum Co. No. 1 Handlin, will be drilled in section 84, Block 1-C.

Phillips Petroleum Co. No. 1 Keith will be located in section 115, Block 1-C.

Phillips Petroleum No. 1 Virginia, located in section 234, Block 1-T, 2 miles southeast of Stratford, is drilling with rotary tools.

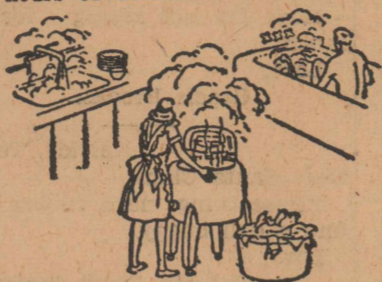

FIXING UP the HOME

Now that fall is here once more and school has started, I've been taking advantage of the cooler weather to have a real session of baking! My family is especially fond of homemade cookies, and I try to keep my cookie jar well filled for the children's after-school snacks. Applesauce cookies are particular favorites at our house, and my recipe is so simple that even amateur bakers have surprisingly good results with it. Perhaps you might like to try it.

APPLESAUCE COOKIES

- 2 cups sifted enriched flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon cloves
- 1 cup shortening
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 cup thick unsweetened applesauce
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Sift together flour, baking powder, soda, salt and spices. Cream together shortening and sugar until light and fluffy. Add egg. Beat well. Add flour mixture alternately with applesauce to creamed mixture. Add raisins and nuts. Drop from spoon on greased cookie sheets about two inches apart. Bake in moderately hot oven (350° F.) ten to fifteen minutes. Yield: Five dozen cookies.

I've found this recipe especially good! And I feel right at home baking with white flour again. There's nothing like fine-textured white flour to make fluffy smooth cakes, cookies or any kind of bakery goods. And I know if your family is like mine, they will shower praises on Mom for her baking prowess after the first nibble on a homemade applesauce cookie!

Mix equal parts of diced, broiled bacon and minced cucumber with mayonnaise. Spread on potato chips and garnish with diced green peppers and pearl onions.
 - Avocado Whip**
Mash pulp of 1 avocado and beat with a rotary egg beater until light and fluffy. Add 1 tbs. lemon juice, ¼ tsp. salt and ½ tsp. onion juice. Place on table or bar with accompanying bowl of chips or crackers, to be used as scoops.
 - Blue Cheese Canapé**
Put ¼ cup Blue Cheese (domestic Roquefort) through a sieve; add ½ pkz. cream cheese, 1 tsp. onion juice, 2 drops tabasco sauce, 1 tbs. sherry wine and 2 tsp. mayonnaise. Mix thoroughly and spread on potato chips. Garnish with paprika, parsley or strips of green pepper.

FIXING UP the HOME
By Diane Greeter

HOW TO CLEAN OVEN

KEEPING a new range clean, or cleaning up an old one, has always been a major problem for most housewives. Meat cooked without fat is almost always tasteless. Meat baked slowly will get tough. When fat is subjected to this fast cooking process it will splatter and splash over the inside of the oven. The result is a coating of grease which must be removed as soon as the oven is cool if one is to keep the appliance clean.

Do not use any abrasive material in cleaning any part of the range. The manufacturers put on a surface which is a first cousin to glass. If you scratch tiny lines into this surface, it will produce fine cracks or check marks later. A good strong soap solution will remove the grease easily, but do not use it until the range is cool. Putting cold water on this surface will break it, just as your glasswear will break if you put it in boiling water and then into ice cold water.

If the grease is not cleaned off and successive coats are allowed to remain, the whole will bake into a new and dirty surface as hard as baked enamel. To remove this, put a cup of strong ammonia in the oven overnight with the door tightly closed. In the morning most of the hard grease will be loose and can be easily washed off.

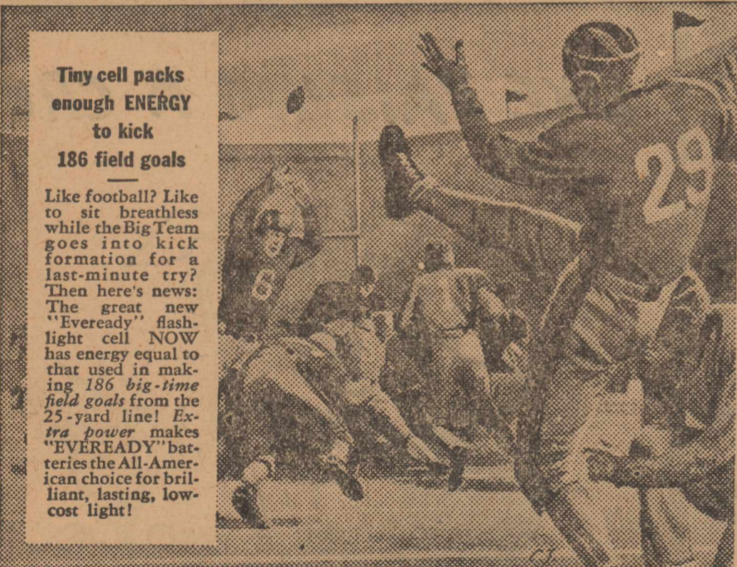

PHILEMON: A LETTER ON CHRISTIAN BROTHERHOOD

LESSON TEXT—Philemon 4-20.
MEMORY SELECTION—Now the Lord is that Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.—II Corinthians 3:17.

Christian brotherhood! That may not sound like a dynamic influence destined to change the world, but that is just what it has done. We study today a letter written about a slave boy at a time when slavery was accepted as right, but it stated principles of Christian consideration and brotherly love which were eventually to overthrow slavery. It is still at work today when and where we let it!

This letter, written by Paul and yet by the Holy Spirit, personal and yet eternal and spiritual in its application, is a model of letter writing, and equally a model of Christian brotherhood. It concerns one Onesimus, a slave who had deserted his master and probably defrauded him (v. 18). He had been converted and now was being sent back to his master.

I. "I Might Be Bold—Yet I Rather Beseech Thee" (vv. 4-9).

After a fine spiritual salutation (vv. 1-3), Paul enters upon an appeal to Philemon which is a model of tact and courtesy.

First he lets Philemon know of his prayerful interest in him. Paul had been praying for him, that's why he could say such a helpful word.

Then he recognizes Philemon's goodness and his effective testimony for Christ. This was an excellent approach to the making of a request, and be sure that it was not empty or hypocritical flattery. We do well to recognize the fine qualities of our Christian brother, and we could profitably speak of them more than we do.

Then Paul was ready to make his request. See how nicely he does it. He skillfully reminds Philemon that he (Paul) might make some demands, and especially in view of his age and his imprisonment. But he will not do so; rather he says, "I beseech thee."

II. "Without Thy Mind I Would Do Nothing" (vv. 10-16).

Paul, the aged prisoner, had found in his new convert, Onesimus, a real helper. He would have liked to keep him. In fact, says he to Philemon, Onesimus could do for me the things you would want to do if you were here (v. 13).

Paul could have felt sure of the willingness of Philemon. He could have assumed that the request would be granted. And in any case, Philemon did not even know where Onesimus was, so why not keep him? He did not reason thus.

True Christian consideration respects the personal rights and the property rights of another. We must not assume, or demand, or put pressure on anyone (v. 14) to get what they have or to draw out their service.

Another expression of consideration is found in verses 15 and 16. Philemon had lost a heathen slave, now he is receiving back a Christian brother. No worker will give less in service, and no master will demand more, because both are Christians.

Now Paul touches on one of the finest elements involved in Christian brotherhood, namely, co-operation. We are to live and labor together for a common cause. Pleading for his friend and brother, the young slave Onesimus, he says:

III. "If Thou Count Me a Partner, Receive Him" (vv. 17-21).

Partners share the benefits and the burdens of their joint enterprise. Partners in the gospel, like Paul and Philemon, shared not only spiritual blessings, but also the responsibilities. Paul was presenting such an item to Philemon in the return of Onesimus. Something had to be done about the debt of Onesimus, his failure as a servant. Paul says, "Charge it to me, your partner."

It has been pointed out that there is here a blessed example of the important doctrine of imputation, which is the "act of God whereby he accounts righteousness to the believer in Christ," because he "has borne the believer's sins in vindication of the law." So we note that verses 17 and 18 perfectly illustrate imputation.

Paul's promise, "I will repay it" (v. 19), was the legal phraseology of a promissory note in his day. It was a bonafide partisanship transaction, yet it was coupled with a reminder of indebtedness. Everything Philemon had and was he owed to Paul; but, says the latter, "I will not speak of that now."

No right-thinking person is content always to be on the receiving end. The humblest recipient of favor or the smallest child who feels the love of another wants to respond. The considerate friend will, therefore, not always insist on giving, but will graciously (like Paul) open the way for co-operation, for partnership.

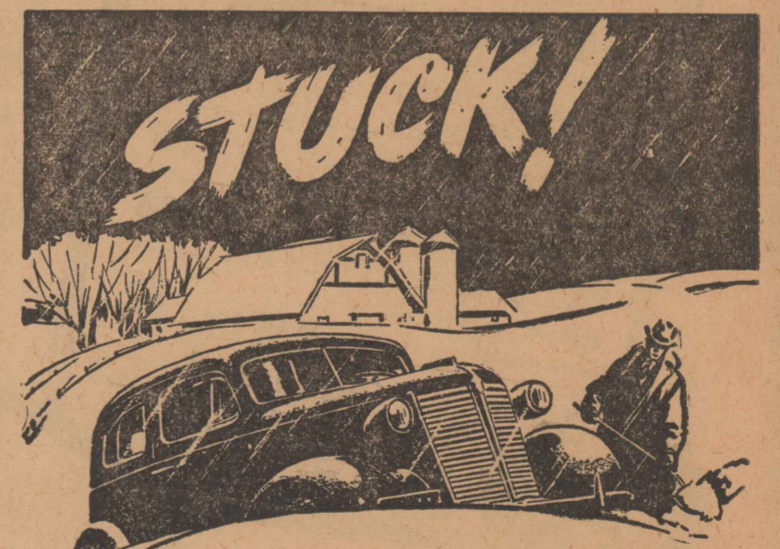

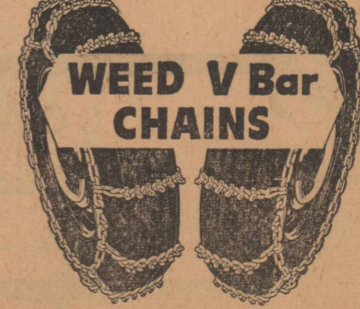

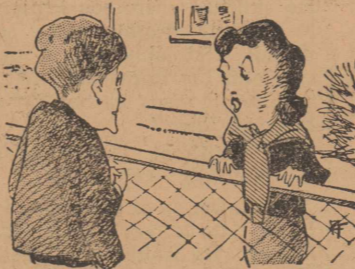
