Coke County Cablevision's Tower Goes Up Between Bronte and R-Lee

Coke County Cablevision has erected its new 100 foot receiving tower about half way between Robert Lee and Bronte on property of Joe McCutchen. The tower will receive television and FM radio signals for both Coke County towns as soon as cable installations are completed.



Tommy Bailey, who is in charge of installation of cable TV in Coke County, said signals received at the new tower "were loud and clear and will provide high quality reception in both cities."

Western Tower Co. of San Angelo built and erected the tower. It

was moved in Friday of last week and work was completed Saturday. Six antennas have been installed on the tower for Channels 3, 8, 9 and 12, plus two FM radio antennas. Bailey said a UHF antenna should be coming in soon and will be installed before service is begun.

"We're still shooting for completion by May 1," Bailey reported. He said all additional equipment has been ordered and delivery is expected soon.

Virtually all the cable has been laid in Robert Lee, and most of the bores under streets have been made in Bronte. Work on laying cable in alleys of Bronte will begin next week and should be completed in three weeks, Bailey said.

The cablevision firm has purchased telephone poles from General Telephone Co. and will run lines on them into Robert Lee. Approximately two-thirds of the lines into Bronte will be buried, with the remainder mounted on the poles.

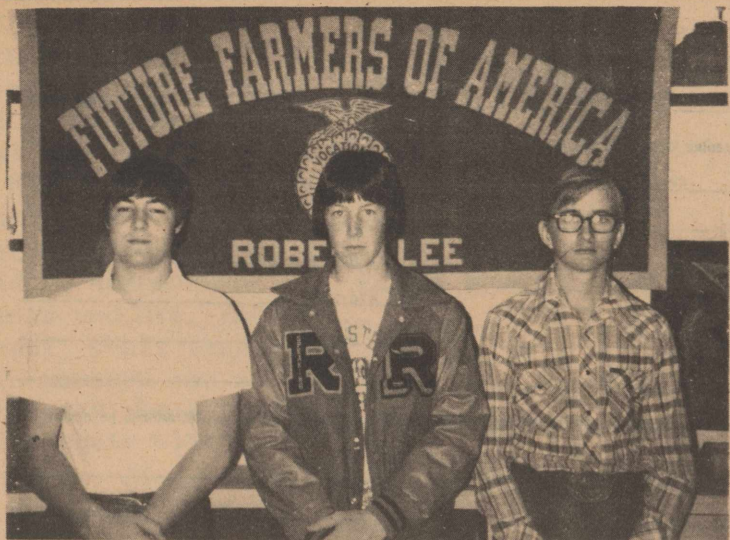
It's A Game Children Play

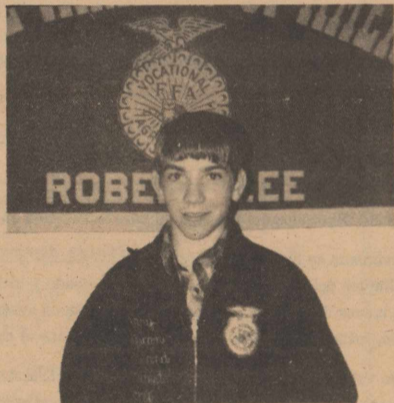

ELECTION ORDER AND NOTICE

THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF Coke

On this the 17th day of January, 1980, the Board of Trustees of Robert Lee Independent School District convened in Regular session, open to the public, with the following members present, to-wit:

- Philip C. Ray, President
John E. Stephens, J. C. Wallace, Jr.
Joe Flowers, Ray Aldridge
Wayland Drennan, W. L. Metcalf

and the following absent: none
constituting a quorum and among other proceedings had by said Board of Trustees was the following:

WHEREAS, the term of office of two

members of the Board of Trustees of this School District will expire on the first Saturday in April, 1980, said first Saturday being April 5, 1980, and on said date a trustee election will be held in said School District.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for this Board to pass an order establishing the procedure for filing for and conducting said trustee election;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF Robert Lee INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. That an election be held in said School District on April 5, 1980, for the purpose of electing to the Board of Trustees of said School District two trustees

2. That all requests by candidates to have their names placed upon the ballot for the above mentioned election shall be in writing and signed by the candidate and filed with the secretary of the Board of Trustees at the superintendent's office not later than 30 days prior to the date of said election.

All candidates shall file with said application the loyalty affidavit required by Art. 6.02 of the Election Code.

The Secretary of this Board of Trustees shall post on the bulletin board in the building where the Board of Trustees meets the names of all candidates that have filed their applications in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Order, and said Secretary shall otherwise comply with the terms and provisions of Art. 13.32 of the Election Code.

3. That said election shall be held at the following places, and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers for said election:

- (a) In election precincts numbered one at public school Building, in Robert Lee, Texas, in said School District, with Mary Patterson as Presiding Judge and Eula Fay Blair and Gloria Hubbard and Yvonne DeVoll, Clerks.

The polls at the above designated polling places shall on election day be open from 7:00 o'clock a.m. to 7:00 o'clock p.m.

4. Joyce Stephens is hereby appointed Clerk for absentee voting, and and are hereby appointed Deputy Clerks for absentee voting. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at Superintendent's office at the public school building.

within the boundaries of the above named School District and said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official State holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee Clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent.

Absentee voting, both by personal appearance and by mail, shall be by paper ballots and shall be canvassed by a special canvassing board, and Joyce Stephens, as Presiding Judge, and as Clerks, are hereby appointed the Special Canvassing Board for said election.

6. The manner of holding said election shall be governed, as nearly as may be, by the Election Code of this state, and this Board of Trustees will furnish all necessary ballots and other election supplies requisite to said election.

7. Immediately after the votes have been counted, the officers holding said election shall make and deliver the returns of said election and perform all other duties as provided by the Election Code.

8. The Board of Trustees shall give notice of said election, and this combined Election Order and Notice shall serve as Notice for said election. The President of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and instructed to post or cause to have posted said combined Election Order and Notice at three public places where notices are customarily posted in this school district, and said posting shall be made at least 20 days before the date of said election.

The President shall also cause a copy of this combined Election Order and Notice to be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in the county where this school district is located. Said publication shall be not more than 30 days nor less than 10 days before the date of said election.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary posted written notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting on the bulletin board located in the central administrative office of this school district, a place convenient and readily accessible to the general public, and said notice, having been so posted, remained posted for at least 72 hours preceding the scheduled time of said meeting.

It is further found and determined that in accordance with an order of the Board of Trustees, the Secretary furnished a notice of the date, place and subject of this meeting to the county clerk of Coke County, Texas, the county in which most, if not all, of this school district's pupils reside.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that the same do pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Board voted AYE: John E. Stephens, J. C. Wallace Jr, Joe Flowers, Ray Aldridge, W. L. Metcalf, Wayland Drennan
