Pamphlet Tells About Tax Laws

This pamplet explains how the property tax system in Texas operates, and highlights possible tax savings available to citizens. The publication was developed by the State Property Tax Board in accordance with Senate Bill 621, passed by the Texas Legislature in 1979. Information in the pamphlet is applicable to property taxes collected by all levels of local government, including counties, cities, and school districts.




