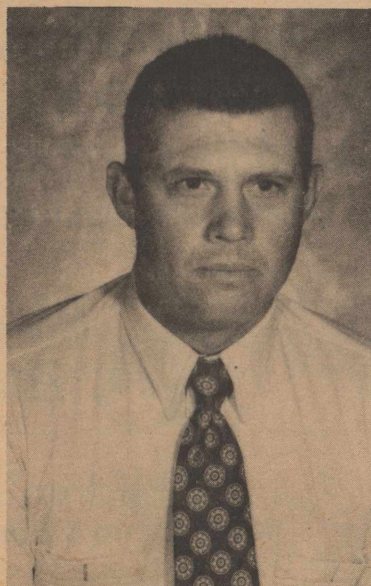

The Robert Lee Independent School Board employed Nelson Coulter in a board meeting May 12, 1980, to teach Junior High math and work as assistant in coaching. His wife, Janie Coulter, who has taught

in Robert Lee School for the past year, will be reassigned to teach 2nd grade during the next school year. Mr. Coulter was a student of Angelo State University and did his student teaching in the Robert Lee School this past year. He and Janie are both graduates of Bronte High School and Angelo State University.

Lake Spence Gains 4 Feet of Water From Big Rains in Counties to North

Reports to the Observer Tuesday were that Lake Spence has come up about 4 feet from

the rains received over the area last week.

Although Robert Lee and the surrounding area only got an inch of rain (some parts less and others a little more) the big benefit came from the 7 inch rains that fell in the Snyder area as well as heavy rains in the Colorado City area which put the Colorado River on a big rise.

The lake elevation was reported to be at 1852.53 before the runoffs. Tuesday morning the reading was 1856.35 with water still running in. Full spillway level for the lake would be 1898.00.

With thundershowers in the area Tuesday night, it was hopeful that the lake would be getting even more gain.
