ABSENTEE VOTING IN LOCAL ELECTIONS NOW UNDERWAY

Absentee voting started Monday in the three elections which will be held here on Saturday, April 4. Those who want to vote absentee must fulfill certain requirements and have until the end of the business day of March 31 to cast their votes ahead of time.

CITY ELECTION

Those who want to vote absentee in the election for officers of the city government of Robert Lee must cast their ballots at the city hall where City Secretary Edna Havins is the absentee voting clerk. There is little question as to the outcome of the city election, since three candidates are running for three places on the city council. Candidates are

Road Closing Is Protested

Apparently a number of citizens of Robert Lee and the area are not pleased with action taken last week by the Coke County Commissioners' Court when it voted to close the county road known as "Friendship Lane."

It was reported to this newspaper that a petition with 289 names on it was presented to the commissioners asking that the road not be closed.

On the other hand, it was reported that a petition containing eight names requested that the road be closed.

An ad in this week's paper is announcing a public meeting to be held at 7:30 p.m. Monday, March 23, to form an organization to oppose the closing and ask the commissioners to rescind their decision last week.

A spokesman for the opposition to the closing said they "will take court action if necessary to keep the road open."

The main objection to closing the road is that it leads to the favorite fishing place on Lake Spence for many local fisherman.

HOSPITAL ELECTION

The election for directors of the West Coke County Hospital District is a little bit tighter, as three candidates are running for two vacancies. Persons who want to vote absentee should contact Mildred Reese in the county clerk's office, who is the absentee clerk. Candidates are Jodie Rodriguez, Mrs. Barbara Chesney and Teddy Pitcock.

SCHOOL ELECTION

Voters who want to vote absentee in the school trustee election should go to the school tax office on the school campus where Kay Grim is absentee voting clerk. This race is not too warm, either, since only three candidates bothered to run for the two positions which become vacant this year. The two incumbent board members, W.L. Metcalf and Phillip C. Ray are running for re-election. A third candidate is Mary Herring.

The above resume of the April 4 elections show there is not too much opposition to the present regimes of the school, city and hospital. However, voters do have a choice in two of the elections.

Rep. Shaw To Hold Discussion

Rep. Shaw said he will review his own legislative package and discuss the more controversial bills facing the Legislature.

"The main reason for the meeting, however, is to give Coke County residents the opportunity to tell me what their concerns are and to ask any questions they might have about what's going on in Austin this session," Shaw explained. We'll try to keep it very informal and open and I hope anyone who is interested will take the time to drop by and say Hi."

Shaw said he plans to hold a "Town Meeting" in the county seats in each of the six counties in District 63 during the next few weeks.

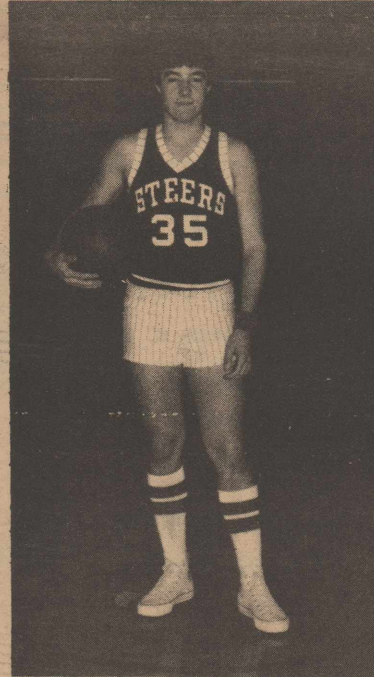

Chief Appraiser Urges Citizens To Apply For Tax Exemptions



Reba Roberts, chief appraiser for the Coke County Appraisal District, today urged local citizens to apply for available exemptions which may help residents save on their property taxes.

Mrs. Roberts noted that for the first time, taxpayers in Coke County may apply for all applicable homestead exemptions or productivity valuation on their agricultural land by contacting the appraisal district office which is located at 710 Austin St., Robert Lee.

The chief appraiser explained that taxing jurisdictions in Coke County are voluntarily participating in early implementation of the countywide appraisal office. Beginning next year, countywide appraisal will be mandated by law for all of the state's 254 counties.

According to Mrs. Roberts, taxpayers previously had to file their property rendition statements and exemption applications with each jurisdiction which levied an ad valorem tax on their property. Additionally, if they thought the property was valued too high, a separate appearance was required before each jurisdiction's board of equalization.

"Under the countywide appraisal district, not only can applications be made at one place, but a single appeal of the property valuation can be made," the chief appraiser added.

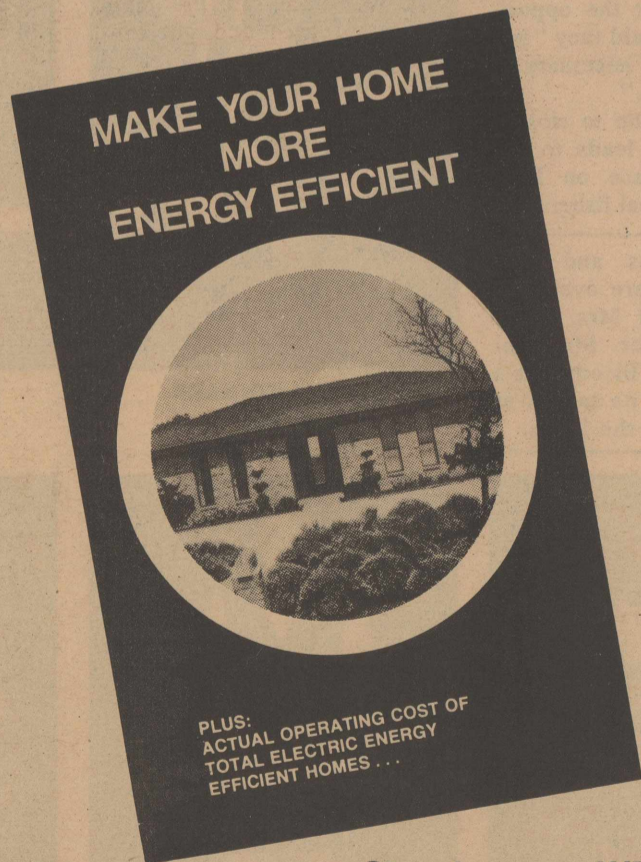

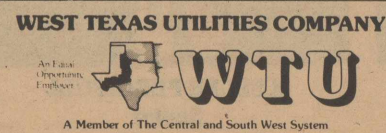



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE WEST COKE COUNTY HOSPITAL DISTRICT, COKE COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION I: That an election be held on the 4th day of April, 1981, with the West Coke County Hospital District for the purpose of electing two Directors for said District and said election shall be held under the General Laws of the State of Texas regulating general elections, except as the same are modified by Chapter 315, Acts of the 58th Legislature, Regular session, and only resident qualified electors shall be entitled to vote.

SECTION II: That the ballots for said election shall be prepared in sufficient number and in conformity with Chapter 6, V.A.T.S. and written or printed thereon shall be the names of the candidates who comply with the provisions of Chapter 315, Acts of the 58th Legislature, Regular Session.

SECTION III: No person shall be eligible for the office of Director unless he is a resident of the District, owns land subject to taxation therein and unless at the time of such election he shall be more than 21 years of age.


SECTION IV: The polling places where the election shall be held and presiding officers at each of the said polling places as follows:
