WEDNESDAY'S BUSINESS

CATTLE.

Live stock trains were all more or less delayed today on account of the storm that is still prevailing. Cattle came stringing in all forenoon but were met with a steady demand that held prices to a full steady level although Chicago had an unusual Wednesday run and sharply lower market while outside river points were moderately supplied with markets reported steady and lower. The small contingent of steers here included a bunch or two of fairly fat good quality steers of medium weight such as have been very scarce of late. These found ready outlet at around \$4.75 to \$4.90 and were fully steady compared with recent markets. The bulk of beef steers were of the styles of poor to half-fat light to medium weights that sell from about \$4.40 down, actual sales of the day in load lots ranging largely at \$3.85 to \$4.30 and cattle selling within this range were steady to weak with former days of the week. Common light killers were also steady at \$3.25 to \$3.75. Fully fat, choice to prime heifers can be quoted at \$5.40 to around \$6.00.

THURSDAY'S BUSINESS

CATTLE.

It is not at all unlikely that severe weather was largely responsible for the meagre run of cattle showing up here and at outside markets today. Total at five points was only about 34,000 or close to 10,000 less than Chicago alone had yesterday. While the supply of dressed beef steers on the local market was very small it appeared to be fully equal to immediate demands. Trade had equal tone from the start and obtainable prices were not better than steady to weak on the Wednesday level or weak to 10c lower than on first days of the week. In discussing the cattle situation this morning a local dealer gave it as his opinion that there would not be much increase in the total number of cattle arriving at leading markets in the near future but, said he, "people are eating pork, mutton and poultry and the cattle supplies appear to be large enough for the present." Of the steers here there was nothing of improvement in quality noted. On a slow week basis the bulk of medium half-fat offerings went at a range of \$3.75 to \$4.25 with fair to good weight offerings quotable at \$4.25 to \$5.00 and choice to prime \$5.25 to around \$6.00. Common light killers \$3.25 to \$3.50.
