DEBATE CLOSED, VOTE BEGINS TO-DAY

Foraker's Speech for New Mexico Touched Upon Alleged Corruption in Several States and Started Hopkins, of Illinois.

Washington, Feb. 7.—The long-drawn-out debate on the bill creating two states out of the territories of Oklahoma and Indian territory and New Mexico and Arizona, was concluded yesterday with a speech by Mr. Beveridge which consumed the greater part of the day's session.

Mr. Beveridge based his advocacy of the bill upon the theory that congress has absolute control of the creation of new states, and in elaborating, he said the interests of the nation as a whole were paramount to the wishes of the people of the territories.

Mr. Beveridge contended that the creation of Arizona territory had not involved any contract to maintain the boundary thus established and his argument on this point caused an interruption by Mr. Alger, who stated that people who settled in Arizona had done so on a practical contract with the national government.

Referring to the character of the people of Arizona and New Mexico, Mr. Foraker said that possibly some of them are not as good as they should be, but he contended that they are not alone as a community in that respect.

CATTLE. An adverse factor in the cattle trade this week has been bad weather east, which has greatly interfered with the movement of eastern and export cattle and beef trains.

COWS, BULLS AND MIXED. The market for the stock held up rather better during the week than that for steers but the close finds trade in slow condition.

STOCKERS AND FEEDERS. Severe weather of latter half of the week has greatly curtailed the outward movement of stockers and feeders but fresh receipts have also been light and the close of business finds no large hold-over stock in the yards.

HOGS. Although receipts were not large, here or elsewhere, the market lacked spirit on account of efforts of buyers to depress values.

MONDAY'S BUSINESS

CATTLE. Weather conditions, especially in the east are still unfavorable to a lively and appreciating market for cattle. Movement of cars has been greatly hampered on eastern roads and the result has been the piling up of beef in stores at all the packing centers.

COWS, BULLS AND MIXED. In the she stock the line eastern car situation has not effected trade as much as it has the steer market and with very moderate supplies the opening trade of the week ruled fairly active with prices holding steady to firm on the last week's closing level.

HOGS. With only a light supply of sheep and lambs on sale, and a strong Chicago market reported, buyers soon cleared the yards at prices ruling strong to 10c higher than the close of last week.

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Further Labor Trouble in Chicago. Chicago, Feb. 7.—The closing down of eight sack, door and blind factories by which 900 men were thrown out of employment, together with a demand for an increase of two cents an hour by 1,600 woodworkers, has further complicated matters for the wood industries in Chicago.

Yield Bribes in Gold. San Francisco, Feb. 7.—Substantial evidence of police corruption was shown by the grand jury, when the former of that body deposited \$1,250 in gold coin on the desk of Presiding Judge Lawlor; of the superior court, which was paid in bribes.

New York to Be Electrified. New York, Feb. 7.—Frank Fur long, aged 19, who was convicted of killing his aunt, Mrs. Margaret Keeler, in this city on November 10, was yesterday sentenced to be hanged at Sing Sing prison in the West, beginning March 27.

Acquitted Man Charges Perjury. Bedford, Ind., Feb. 7.—Frank Evans, acquitted in court of a charge of complicity in the murder of Sarah C. Shaler after a hearing jointly with Elmer Browning, who was bound over to the grand jury, has filed affidavits for the arrest of George W. Riley, the newspaper man who was active in bringing about the arrest and prosecution of Evans and Browning. Riley is charged by Evans with perjury.

HOGS.

The severe cold weather during the latter part of last week and the heavy snow of Saturday afternoon and Sunday prevented country delivery of hogs which resulted in very moderate supplies at all points today. In consequence the selling element was very bullish in their views and were generally asking ten cents higher for their holdings.

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THREE MORE WIVES.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 7.—Following the allegation in the presentment of the grand jury last Thursday that syndicate vice exists in this city and that Director of Public Safety Smyth is responsible for the condition, Clarence Giboney, secretary of the Law and Order society, in a letter to Mayor Weaver, in reply, said: "I can get any evidence that there is any connection with a police official or any official under my control protecting vice in any way, shape or form, in this city, he shall not stay in the employ of the city.
