King of Spain in London.

London, June 7.—The king of Spain opened a long program of engagements Monday with the reception of the diplomatic corps at Buckingham palace.

NO PEACE IN SIGHT.

Is the Present Opinion of London Diplomats.

NO NEGOTIATIONS NOW PENDING.

Terms of Settlement Satisfactory to Japan Three Months Ago Would Not Now Receive Consideration.

London, June 6.—Accounts of President Roosevelt's interviews with Mr. Takahira, the Japanese minister at Washington, Count Cassini, Baron Speck von Sternburg and other ambassadors which are alleged to have been along the line of efforts to bring mediation, are receiving much attention here but in diplomatic circles it is not believed that they will result in securing peace.

Peace reports come from Paris, Berlin and St. Petersburg as well as from Washington, but not a single definite indication of peace or even of intervention can be obtained.

At the Russian embassy it is declared that the war will be continued and at the Japanese embassy it is said there is no expectation of peace offer, while the foreign office states that it does not know of any movement toward peace.

As far as can be ascertained the British government has made no attempt to bring about intervention, though it undoubtedly is acquainted with the terms Japan will accept and is in a position to take up negotiations with France, Russia's ally immediately.

WHITELAW REID AT COURT.

American Ambassador Presented Credentials to King Edward at Buckingham Palace.

London, June 6.—Whitelaw Reid, the new American ambassador, had an audience with King Edward at Buckingham palace at noon Monday and presented his credentials. Three royal carriages were sent to Dorchester house to convey the ambassador and the members of the embassy to the palace.

Head Camp Royal Neighbors.

Topeka, Kan., June 6.—Most of the delegates are here to attend the head camp of the Royal Neighbors of America which will open here Tuesday.

Italian Warships Threaten Turkey.

Vienna, June 6.—A Constantinople correspondent reiterates the story that the Italian government, ten days ago, sent ten warships to the coast of Yemen, Arabia, and refuses to withdraw them until the Turkish government makes amends for the murder in Yemen of Italian subjects.

Railroads Will Fight Law.

Topeka, Kan., June 6.—Kansas railroads are preparing to fight the law passed by the last legislature and now in effect compelling the railroads to construct sidetracks to elevators and flour mills which may be built within one-fourth of a mile from any way station.

MUST BE INTERNED.

Russian Ships Must Not Repair in Manila Harbor.

DEFINITE INSTRUCTIONS CABLED.

Injuries to Warships Received in Battle Cannot Be Repaired in Neutral Port—May Leave at Once if They Wish.

Washington, June 6.—Admiral Enquist will not be allowed to repair his ships at Manila. This government has decided that as the injuries to the vessels were not caused either by the sea or storm they will be obliged to refuse permission for the vessels to be repaired there.

SASEBO HOSPITAL.

United States Naval Surgeon Is Well Pleased with What He Saw There.

Yokohama, June 6.—United States Navy Surgeon Braisted, who has just returned from the Sasebo naval hospital, where the wounded Russians are being treated and cared for, brings the first direct professional report from there.

According to Surgeon Braisted, the hospital is in charge of Surgeon Inspector Totsuka and a very able corps of surgeons. There are also some Japanese wounded there, all of whom are doing well. Rojostvensky is wounded in the forehead and right leg.

Train to See to Internment.

Washington, June 6.—After a conference with President Roosevelt Monday Secretary Morton announced that the Russian cruisers Aurora, Oleg and Jemchug, which arrived at Manila last week, will be interned at Manila. Secretary Morton said that orders for the internment of the vessels would go forward to Admiral Train at once.

Washington, June 6.—The Japanese minister here has formally inquired of the department of state what action the United States government intend to take respecting the Russian war vessels now in Manila bay.

Severe Michigan Storm.

Detroit, Mich., June 6.—Reports received here from various points in Lower Michigan show that the "thumb" district and the Saginaw valley bore the brunt of a severe electrical storm which swept Lower Michigan late Monday. Residences, schools and barns in the path of the storm were blown down, and half a dozen fatalities have already been reported early in the evening.

Statette of President.

Washington, June 6.—President Roosevelt was the recipient Monday of a beautiful equestrian statuette of himself as colonel of the rough riders, which is the latest work of the eminent sculptor, MacMonnies. The presentation was made at the White house by Miss Janet Souder, of New York, a pupil of MacMonnies, whose work has been accepted for the Luxembourg galleries at Paris.

Ship Channel Completed.

Galveston, Tex., June 6.—The Texas City ship channel has been completed and turned over to the government. The channel from Texas City through Galveston bay to the Bolivar channel is 3,400 feet long, 25 feet deep, with a width of 100 feet at the bottom. It has cost the government \$250,000.

One-Pace Rate for Harvest Hands.

Topeka, Kan., June 6.—The Kansas railroads have announced a rate of one fare for the round trip to Kansas points for the benefit of harvest hands. The rates will be in effect from June 25 to July 10.

Rojostvensky Doing Well.

Tokio, June 6.—The chief surgeon of the Sasebo naval hospital reports that Admiral Rojostvensky's condition is favorable. His pulse and temperature continue normal. There is no sign of brain complication.

To Get Back in Harness.

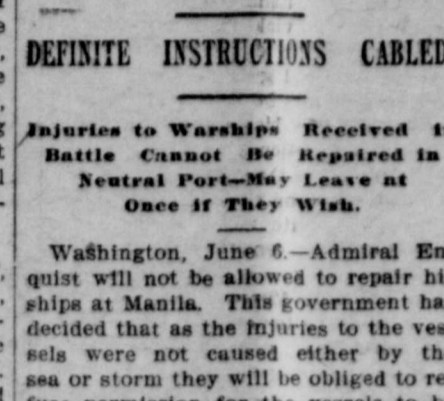

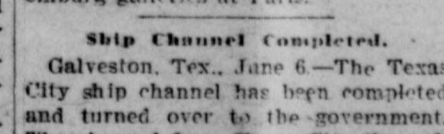

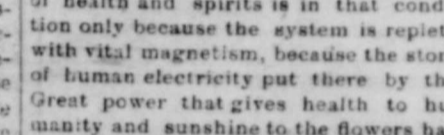
