MAJOR PEARSON DEAD

Real Estate Dealer Expires Suddenly at His Home.

Major L. P. Pearson, a real estate dealer in the South End, died at his residence, 481 King Hill avenue, of congestion of the brain at 1:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Major Pearson had been ill for six weeks. He was first taken down with a slight attack of grip, while suffering from his illness, he came out of his head and eluding his nurses, wandered around the streets of the suburb in his night clothing in the middle of the night.

REGISTER NEXT WEEK. County Court Sets March 20 and 21 as Days.

The supplemental registration of the voters of St. Joseph will be held March 20 and 21. This was decided upon yesterday by the county court, which made an order to that effect.

The registration has been called in order that such persons as have moved from their homes since the last election may have a chance to register in the wards in which they now reside; also in order that those persons who have just reached their majority may register in order to cast their first votes in the city, as well as the country, state and presidential elections this year.

Less Wheat in Farmers' Hands. Washington, Mar. 10.—The crop reporting board of the Department of Agriculture in the bulletin issued Monday places the quantity of wheat in farmers' hands on March 1, 1908 at about 23.5 per cent, equivalent to 148,721,000 bushels of last year's crop, as compared with 28.1 per cent or 206,644,900 bushels of the 1906 crop, on hand March 1, 1907 and 24.6 per cent or 155,268,000 bushels the average for the past ten years.

Veteran Kansas Editor Dies. Columbus, Kan., Mar. 10.—J. M. McNay of this city, who died Sunday morning at 9 o'clock, was one of the veteran newspapermen of the state.

English Public Must Not Know. London, Mar. 10.—The government has decided to keep private the personal letter written by Emperor William to Lord Tweedmouth, first lord of the admiralty, in which, it was charged by the London Times, that his majesty attempted to influence legislation in the matter of the naval estimates of Great Britain.

Debts \$599,000, No Assets. Mobile, Ala., Mar. 10.—To relieve himself of an indebtedness of over a half million dollars, James Henry Mason, Jr., of New York City, contestant of the million-dollar will of his father, filed a petition in bankruptcy in the United States district court here Monday.

Railroads Assist Plague Fund. San Francisco, Mar. 10.—The Santa Fe Railroad company Monday morning sent in a contribution of \$15,000 to the plague fund, which the citizens health committee is raising to exterminate rats, make the city sanitary and prevent the spread of contagion.

ALFONSO IS BRAVE

The Spanish King Starts on His Trip to Barcelona Despite Anarchistic Threats.

Barcelona, Mar. 10.—Barcelona, the stronghold of Spanish Republicanism, the center of violent agitations for the past 20 years, and denominated by the royalists as a hotbed of anarchism, is preparing to greet the king of Spain. King Alfonso will arrive here Tuesday morning and every precaution, within the powers of the civil and military authorities, has been taken to safeguard him during his brief stay in this city.

A HOTBED OF ANARCHISM

Some of His Ministry Opposed His Going—Elaborate Precautions Have Been Taken to Protect the Royal Party.

Public buildings have been decorated and flags and streamers are flying everywhere, so that, outwardly at least, his reception will be a patriotic one. But that there is fear of attempts at demonstrations is shown by the fact that the official program of the visit has not been published and that all the houses along the streets through which the king will pass have been searched and will be guarded from now on.

An Austrian squadron is lying in the harbor. It is composed of the battleships Archduke Carl, Archduke Frederick and Archduke Ferdinand Max and the destroyers Uskoke and Scharf-Schutze. King Alfonso will visit the squadron on Wednesday.

Madrid, Mar. 10.—King Alfonso left for Barcelona shortly after six o'clock Monday evening. He will spend two days there, it being decided at the last moment that he should leave Barcelona at 5:30 on Wednesday afternoon, instead of on Thursday morning.

There is something very fascinating to one accustomed to the somewhat even and prosaic tenor of the English public life to gaze on a man who has seen such vicissitudes as the present prime minister of France, M. Georges Clemenceau. He was a boy during the Empire, when he was exiled; he spent four years in America—which is the reason why he speaks English so perfectly. Then think of what he has gone through since; to every man who challenged him he sent an acceptance, and a dozen, perhaps a score, of times he has taken his life in his hands and looked into the barrel of a revolver or at the sword of an opponent who had for him all the deadly hate of political animosity, and especially in a country like France, where religion and classes, as well as fierce personal ambition, divide men into such hostile and irreconcilable camps.
