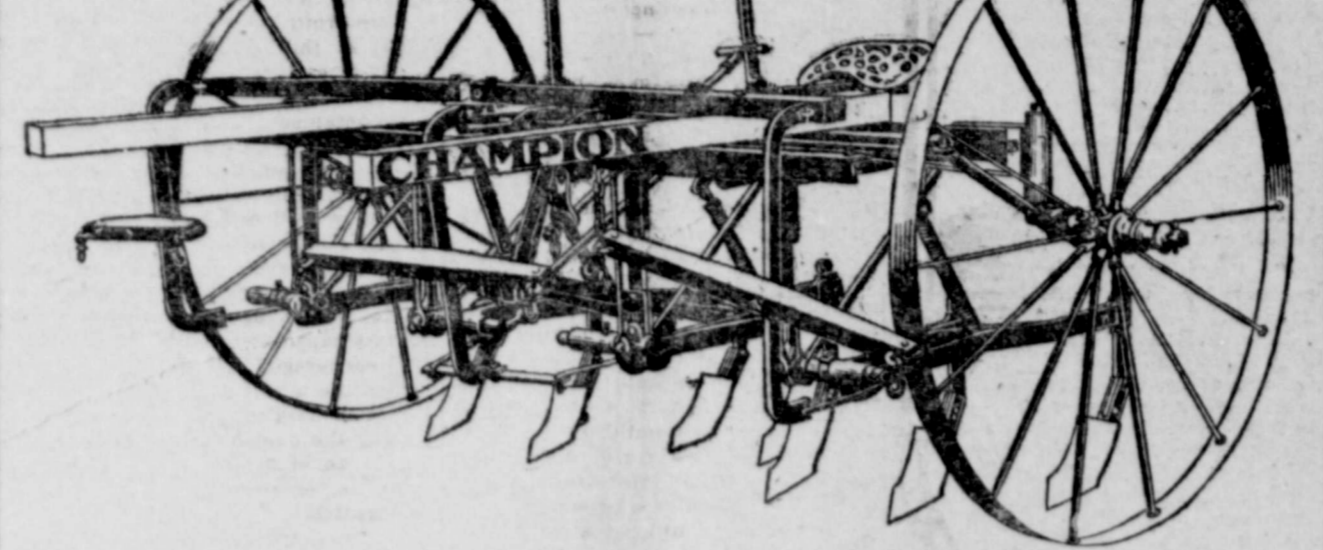
BUSINESS MEN'S CLUB.

BILL BEFORE CONGRESS TO RECOGNIZE VALOR IN '60'S.

Washington.—Congress gives scant recognition to heroes. Unless a deed of danger and daring be performed in the full glare of publicity, it is likely to remain unknown and its performer to go down in history unused.
