SELECTING BEEF CATTLE.

In building up a herd for beef production select cows with a broad, deep and square body, cows with a good coat of flesh, for these, if bred to the right kind of bull, will produce calves that will prove profitable feeders.

When the calves are a few weeks old they should be castrated and the wound washed with some good germ-killer, so it heals rapidly. In the fall the calves should be weaned and fed on good nutritious food.
