Topeka, Aug. 7.—As to the result of the primary last Tuesday, so far as the Democratic nomination for governor is concerned, nothing really definite is known yet.

"I have had reports from three or four counties and these seem to indicate that I have been nominated by a good substantial majority."

CARDINAL GIBBONS IS ILL

AMERICAN PRELATE STRICKEN WITH INTESTINAL TROUBLE

Ordered to Take a Complete Rest And Placed on Liquid Diet in Rome.

Rome, Aug. 7.—The condition of Cardinal Gibbons, who was taken ill Wednesday at Castel Gandolfo and was brought to Rome in order that he might be treated for an intestinal disorder was better Thursday evening.

The attending physician has ordered the American prelate to take a complete rest and has put him on a liquid diet.

His holiness, when he learned of the indisposition of the cardinal, expressed his sorrow and the hope that he would soon recover.

Manager Farley, archbishop of New York, visited Cardinal Gibbons late Thursday evening and found him much relieved.

A dinner that was to have been given Thursday night in honor of Cardinal Gibbons and at which several other cardinals were to have been present, was postponed on account of his indisposition.
