OUTLINE FARM COURSE. Carlyle of Agricultural Department of Idaho University Tells of Work.

Moscow, Idaho, Sept. 8.—"We have just received and have ready for distribution the catalogues of our new school of practical agriculture," said Dean W. L. Carlyle of the agricultural department of the Idaho university, today.

"The same problem is everywhere," he continued, "how to keep the boys interested in and make them contented and prosperous on the farm. We are trying to solve that problem. It will be the aim and purpose of our practical school to show the boys the attractive side of farm life, to point out the little crooks and turns by which time, labor and money may be saved, and to teach them better and more practical farming."

Work in stock judging. "Early in the course the boys will work at the forge, learn to weld, temper, etc.—things that may save many a dollar on the farm. In the farm arithmetic they will compute rations for animals, measure hay in stack and barn and learn out many other farm problems. In stock judging the class will work with the animals assembled in the judging ring."

Other work in live stock will consist of a course in feeds and feeding, a study of breeds and animals adapted to the northwest, advanced stock judging and lectures on the principles of animal breeding. Sufficient veterinary work will be given to enable the farmer to identify diseases, apply emergency remedies and perform simple operations. The dairy work will consist of courses in butter making, milk testing, etc.

The dairy equipment is one of the finest in the west. Four different courses are offered in fruit growing and several courses of lectures in agronomy. The boys will learn farm machinery from the plow to the farm automobile. The irrigation work will consist of lectures upon the application of water to crops, measurement of water, etc. Enough practice will be given with the level to enable the student to run laterals and lay out farm drains.

Practical Farm School. "We call it a practical agricultural school for the reason that students are not only told how to do things, but actually learn to do them by means of practice work in the laboratory periods."

"Students will be admitted from the eighth grade and will be given a course extending over three years of six months each. The first year will open Oct. 17, 1910, and will close March 18, 1911. This is the first school of agriculture established in the northwest, and we hope to make it a prominent feature of our work in agriculture."

"The new catalogue explains in detail the course of study and terms of admission and can be secured by writing to the principal of the school of practical agriculture, Moscow, Idaho."

RAINS FISH IN NEBRASKA Small Chubs Carried by Cyclone and Dropped on Omaha Lawns.

Omaha, Neb., Sept. 8.—After an exceedingly heavy rain here last week, when the precipitation aggregated almost three inches, people residing in the north part of the city were astonished to find the streets and a large area of ground scattered over with small fish of the club variety. The storm came from the northwest and it has since been learned that in Platte county, eighty miles northwest, took on a cyclone form, whirling like a huge top. It swept along the valley of Shell creek, north of Columbus, for a distance of five miles. Shell creek is the only stream in the eastern portion of the state where chub fish are found.

The theory now is that as the cloud passed over this creek it sucked up the water, taking the fish at the same time, and did not drop them until it reached this section. The first newspaper was published in England in 1588.

CACTUS AS STOCK FOOD.

Use of Plant Becoming More General in South Texas Country.

San Antonio, Tex., Sept. 8.—Utilization of cactus as a stock food has been growing steadily in the San Antonio country. This plant, formerly termed an obnoxious weed, was first demonstrated by Dr. David Griffith of the U. S. department of agriculture as a valuable product for stock food. In dry years ranchmen have been in the habit of burning off the stickers and using the prickly pear variety of cactus as a supplement to grass feeding.

Acting on this suggestion Dr. Griffith established an experimental farm near this city and demonstrated scientifically the value of prickly pear as roughage. His experiments show that the prickly pear is as good per acre as sorghum cane, hay, or any other forage crop. Chemical analysis shows that the plant contains 83 per cent water, being as juicy as the watermelon, and that it contains protein and other nutritive elements.

Mills have been established at various points for grinding up the prickly pear and by mixing it with cotton seed meal a valuable stock food is made. Dr. Griffith claims that steers can be fattened for the market on this food at three and a half cents a pound. The average cost of fattening cattle for the market is five cents a pound.

During the present summer the dairyman have used the cactus for stock food with great success. Where it is combined with other foods it is said to be an excellent milk producer. Prickly pear grows wild in the San Antonio country in great abundance. However, some of the dairymen close to the cities are cultivating the pear as they would any other forage crop.

A tiny electric light generating plant has been devised suitable for mounting on an automobile to supply current for the lights. By the use of improved lamps a very superior illumination is secured.

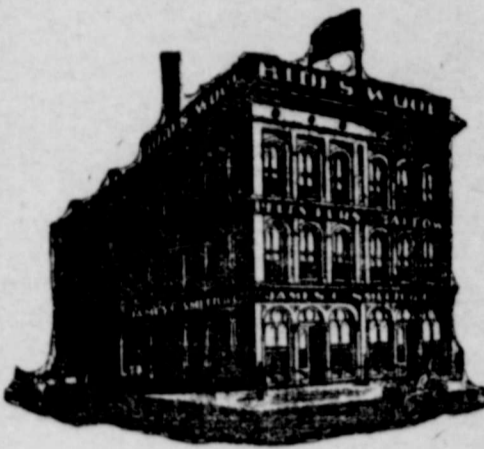

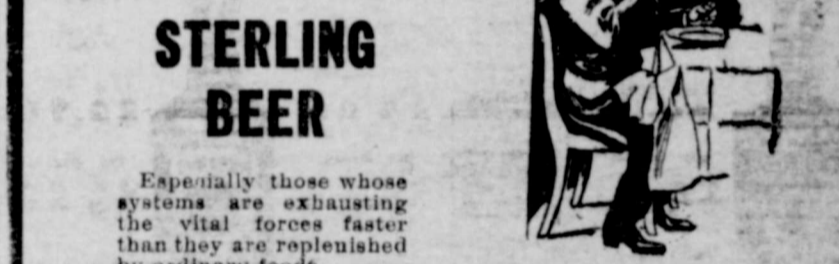
