THE PERCHERON

Some Insight into Care With Which Purity of Big Draft—er Is Guarded.

LE PERCHE, FAMOUS SECTION No Horse Bred Outside Can Get Registry in Books of Percheron Society.

Written by Chas. R. Kirk for Missouri Ruralist. Le Perche—a small district in France, defined by well established irregular lines of a thousand crooks and turns is only about sixty by seventy-five miles in its extreme width and length, and includes a part only of the four departments or counties of Orne, Sarthe, Eure et Loire and Loire Cher. Orne, on the north, being formerly a part of the old Normandie, which gave this breed the name of Norman horse. This district has the distinction of being the most isolated and exclusive breeding territory in the world and is governed by the strictest rules of registry known. Its limited extent and outline is the "Goose of the Golden Egg." Many attempts have been made to force this splendid association of high class breeders to enlarge or extend the irregular circle, or to register horses bred outside the "Golden rule ring," but to all appeals they have wisely turned a deaf ear.

fully rich valleys. The quality of pasturage in the valleys of the Huisne river and its branches produce more growth at an early age than any other fields or food known. The breeder of Le Perche, by cautious care in choosing both sires and dams—avoiding and wholly discarding weak points and faulty conformation—holding firmly to those of health, solidity, beauty and strength, has created a family—a race of horses, surpassing all others in the world; starting and re-starting, by choosing continuously the sire nearest perfection, with an effort to breed one still nearer the ideal, they have created a type more clearly fixed.

First, in uniformity of conformation. Second, in bounding action which which no other ton horse can even compare. Third, with hoof that stands all roads and all conditions, shod or bare. Fourth, in cleanliness of face and neck, boned, hock and pastern, free from meat. Fifth, in clearness of eye. (In twenty years I have never seen a blind horse in Le Perche. This said if one is found they eat him. Good thing, then, he won't perpetuate his kind.) Sixth, in springiness and proper slope of pastern, not too straight, and never down low and flat. Seventh, in shortness of back, with great length underneath, making a slope of shoulder for action. Eighth, in lung power—greater than all others and power to withstand lung diseases and go the route. Ninth, in fixed color—95 per cent gray or black. Tenth, in sense, tractability, docility and style.
