Baird Chamber of Commerce is preparing for the new fiscal year with three new board members and a quick start for its Events Calendar.

Court of Appeals. Wright will fill the vacancy created in July by the resignation of Chief Justice Bud Arnot of Abilene. To fill Wright's former seat on the three-member court, Perry announced Monday that he appointed Rick Strange, 45, a Midland lawyer and Hardin-Simmons University graduate. Terry McCall of Comanche is the other justice on the appeals court based in Eastland. All three are Republicans.

Eastland Native and 11th Court of Appeals Justice Jim Wright has announced that he will seek appointment to the position of Chief Justice of the Court, made vacant this week by the resignation of Chief Justice Bud Arnot who has announced that he will join a Houston law firm.

Clyde Teacher's Funeral Services To Be Held In Odessa

Funeral Services for Linda Arends, 58, will be held at 10 a.m. at Sunset Memorial Chapel in Odessa on Thursday, September 29th. Mrs. Arends died Friday, September 23rd from injuries she received in a two car accident on July 7 in Abilene. She had been hospitalized at Harris Methodist Church in Fort Worth since the time of her accident. She was a first grade teacher at Clyde Elementary school for six years. 



By Ed Sterling AUSTIN - Up to 3 million people fled from coastal areas as Hurricane

Rita lumbered steadily through the Gulf of Mexico toward the Lone Star State, Sept. 19-23.

Rita struck Saturday morning, Sept. 24, making landfall at Sabine Pass near the Louisiana border. The storm's 100-mph winds and torrential rains ripped buildings, downed powerlines and flooded homes and other property.

Sammie was easy to spot. I walked into her office without appointment, expecting nothing more than a perfunctory welcome-if that.

But that's not what I got. She ended a phone conversation and turned her wheelchair toward me in one motion. Then she flashed that "front-page kind of smile." I couldn't have been more surprised if she had broken into song-"If I'da known you were coming, I'da baked a cake."

It occurred to me that she perhaps thought I was from

the Publishers' Clearinghouse Sweepstakes, in town to hand her the check....

Within minutes I realized that material goods mean gets excited about taking her next breath, about meeting-and beating-deadlines, and about simply meeting new friends.

Sammie was stricken by polio during her mid-teen years. Though a wheelchair is a necessity now, she views the disease as a mere inconvenience-if that. Others may choose the "why me" path, but not Sammie. If she ever makes lemonade, someone else will have to furnish the lemons. She recalls no such harvest on her tree of life....

"No, honey, you'll have to turn in your rental car over at the other Enterprise office," she laughed as she ended a phone conversation. "At this Enterprise, we publish newspapers."

She said they get such calls multiple times each month. Some car renters race in, leave keys on the counter, and rush out before learning that they're at the wrong Enterprise! Luckily, people at the "two Enterprises" get along mighty well. And when people try to subscribe for the newspaper at the car rental place,
