The Texas Supreme Court had not ruled as of Sept. 23 on the state's appeal of a lawsuit by more than 300 shool districts that claim the state's way of funding pubic education is unconstitutional.

A year ago, a lower court uling found in favor of the laintiffs. When the state Legislature failed to solve school funding and the related issue of property tax reform, the state appealed. Oral arguments were heard July 6.

## Making A Difference

Is Cartoon Violence Supplying What Want?

For some time now I have become increasingly concerned about the amount of violence shown in children's cartoons and now also computer games. I know that makes me sound like a prude, but I'm not talking about punching and slapstick comedy. I'm talking about murder, grotesque creatures whose very appearance and names are designed to recall violence, combat which is vicious and bloody, and "bad guys" who are the heroes not the villain of the story. So what should we think about all this? First of all, I do not believe that government, Hollywood producers, or computer game companies should somehow be regulated or restricted. Such censorship does not work and is dangerous to our civil liberties.
I prefer to think of this as an example of free enterprise. People produce what sells. What sells is what we the American people want. We want what our values lead us to want. If our moral values are suspect, our wants will be suspect. In recent years, we've wanted more violent cartoons and puter games, just like we've wanted more violent movies and TV shows. We're getting what we asked for.
The cartoons, computer games, movies, and TV shows will change for the better only when our values

## Sammie was easy to spot.

 I walked into her office without appointment, expecting nothing more than a perfunctory welcome-if thatBut that's not what I got.
She ended a phone conversation and turned her wheelchair toward me in one motion. Then she flashed that "front-page kind of smile." I couldn't have been more surprised if she had broken into song-"If I'da known you were coming, I'da baked a cake."
perhaps thought I was from
the Publishers' Clearinghouse Sweepstakes, in town to hand her the check..

Within minutes I realized that material goods mean little to this woman. She gets excited about taking her next breath, about meet-ing-and beating-deadlines, and about simply meeting new friends.

Sammie was stricken by polio during her mid-teen years. Though a wheelchair is a necessity now, she views the disease as a mere inconvenience-if that. Others may choose the "why me" path, but not Sammie. If she ever makes lemonade, someone else will have to furnish the lemons. She recalls no such harvest on her tree of life.

## "No, honey, you'll have to

 turn in your rental car over at the other Enterprise office," she laughed as she ended a phone conversation. "At this Enterprise, we publish newspapers."She said they get such calls multiple times each month. Some car renters race in, leave keys on the counter, and rush out before learning that they're at the wrong Enterprise! Luckily, people at the "two Enterprises" get along mighty well. And when people try per at the car rental place
they're sent on down to the with red tie. She's so excited other Enterprise.... ighly in favor I'm highly in favor of regional accents, and I nominate Mrs. Carter to represent the South. She speaks with an unhurried gait; words fall slowly from her lips like molasses, embroidered with blossoms of magnolia, crepe myrtle and azaleas.
"Honey" creeps into many of her sentences, and her grip on "talkin' southern" is locked up. I was caught up in the warmth of a genuine welcome at the Enterprise..

Sammie quickly turned to the joys of her life. Loved ones come first, of course, including hubby Gene, whom she married 43 years ago. There's also daughter Clarice, and grandson Jonathan, associates at work, and a community she cherishes.
And then there's the Red Hat Society. Her local chapter is the Late Blooming Roses; sometimes called the Red Hots." (It's a national organization for women over 50 years of age, with almost million menbers in than 30,000 chapters across the land. $\qquad$
She joked about an organization with no rules, except the singular requirement of wearing red and purple. Sammie handed me a photograph made at a "Red Hat" function.
