The Mule Memorial: How It All Began

V.H. Torrance, Austin historian and writer, noting the absence of the mule at the Ft. Worth Stock Show, became concerned over the rapid disappearance of the mule from the American scene.

The late Dr. J.B. Barnett read the story, sent in a contribution, and a suggestion that a memorial to the mule be erected at Will Rogers Coliseum, Ft. Worth. George Dolan, a columnist, wrote of the movement to erect a mule memorial.

Gil Lamb, owner of radio station KMUL, and Carroll Pouncey, manager of the Muleshoe Chamber of Commerce, wrote Dr. Barnett and Dolan listing reasons why the memorial should be in Muleshoe.

Mrs. Middlebrook's fourth grade class sent Dr. Barnett a contribution and a plea to have the memorial erected in Muleshoe. Dr. Barnett flew to Muleshoe and organized the National Mule Memorial Association.

More than 700 contributors, from the U.S. and abroad, joined the campaign that culminates here in Muleshoe today.

The sculptor was Kevin Wolf, and the memorial was done by Fiberglass Menagerie of Alpine, Calif.



Muleshoe is located northwest of Lubbock between Sudan and Farwell on US 84 and Hwy 214, and is the seat of Bailey County.

The town grew rapidly in its early years. In 1930 it had nearly 800 residents. The population was 1,327 in 1940, 3,871 in 1960, and 5,225 in 1970, when the town had 200 businesses, two hospitals, two banks, a library, a newspaper, and a radio station. It's population in 2010 was 5,158.

On the main street is a highly prized statue of a mule, affectionately named "Pete," a memorial to the animal's contributions in World War I.

Annual events include a junior livestock show in February and the World Championship Muleshoe Pitching Contest on the Fourth of July.






