#### **WEAK TONE TO STEERS**

GENERAL TRADE IS SLOW WITH VALUES WEAK TO A DIME OFF.

#### A FEW YEARLINGS STEADY

Cows and Heifers Steady to Easy-Veals Decline-Buils Steady-Stockers and Feeders Sell Stronger.

First estimates on the local run of cattle today called for 2,300 head but this was whittled down to 2,100 later in the day. This stood 300 in excess of the supply for last Tuesday but 700 less than for the corresponding day a year ago. At the five leading markets the supply totaled 26,300 head as compared with 25,000 a week ago

and 22,900 a year ago.

There was another fair showing of beef steers, although the proportion of that class of cattle was not as large as on the opening day of the week. General quality of the steer offerings was not as good as on the initial day of the week. The duliness that en-veloped the trade in ordinary light, medium and heavy steers yesterday was still in evidence during today's operations. A few loads of yearlings of a useful and attractive sort sold in good season at about steady prices but on the plainer light and general run of medium to strong weight steers

COWS, BULLS AND MIXED. There was a somewhat larger per-centage of the day's aggregate cattle supply in butcher classes, but the of-fering was of only moderate size. The general market was regarded steady with the previous day but there was not the snap to the trade that fea-tured the previous session and here and there there were spots quoted a little easier. Few traders, however, were willing to quote any material change on any class of female killing stock. Medium helfers and medium grades of cows seemed to be the hardest to move and where any weakness was noted it applied to these classes. The early trade did not have the act ive tone that characterized the mar-ket yesterday but galesmen had made a big hole in the supply before 11 o'clock and at mid-day very little material was left in first hands. 




