Sometimes a good woman player is said to play a 'man's game'. I don't know that there is such a thing as a man's style of game.

Most good women players, however, have no weakness that would call for a differentiation of this kind. Certainly, Mrs. Horn was anything but timid when she jumped to six diamonds on today's hand.

She led the nine of diamonds to dummy's queen and ruffed dummy's last club with the diamond king, then cashed the ace and king of hearts.

This play squeezed the East hand. If East discarded the queen of hearts, dummy's ten was good; while if she let go the jack of spades, declarer would cash the king and ten of spades for the last two tricks.

Ex-Long Lieutenant Enters Penitentiary

ATLANTA, Nov. 22 (AP)—Grim faced and pale, Seymour Weiss, wealthy New Orleans hotel man and lieutenant of the late Huey P. Long, entered the Federal penitentiary today to begin serving a four-year term.

Brought with him from New Orleans by two Federal Agents, were Louis C. Lesage, former oil company official, and J. Emory Adams, a relative of Dr. James Monroe Smith, former president of Louisiana State University who is now in prison.

Weiss, former treasurer of Long's political organization, pleaded guilty Tuesday to three charges of income tax evasion and one conspiracy to violate the Connally "hot oil" act.

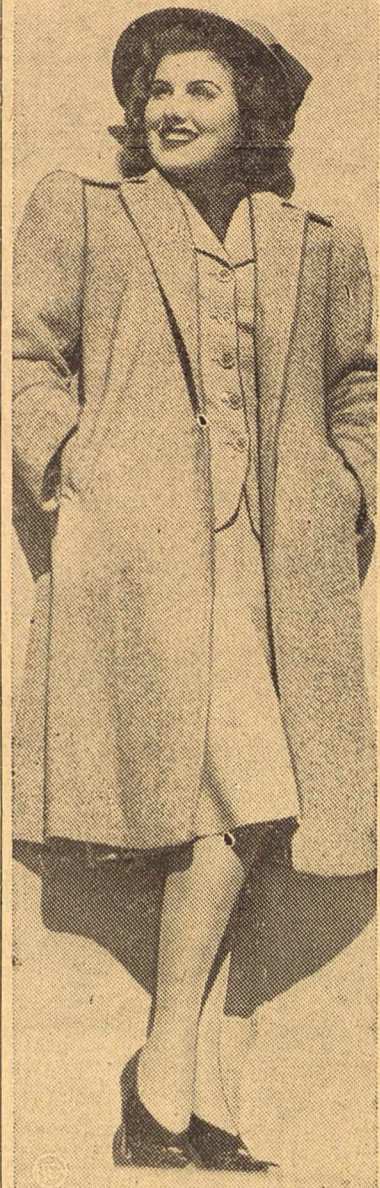
Lavada Bickley Is Athletic Queen For Second Time
