Dictatorship And The Childhood Urge

Psychologists hedge their ideas in a thicket of big words. They invent and use words of their own; words which have a different meaning to them than to you and me.

Sometimes it is hard to discover what they are driving at. Nevertheless, some of their ideas are quite simple, and equally sensible, when you break through the verbal bushes.

Psychologists have an explanation of the appeal of dictatorship in these days, and it was well stated by Dr. Margaret E. Fries to the American Orthopsychiatric Association. Don't let the association's name scare you; follow the argument:

Deep down in every person, no matter how old or how experienced he becomes, there lies buried a memory of childhood. Even if we don't realize it, some part of our consciousness remembers the time when we were warm, protected, dependent. We didn't have to think much then; our thinking was done for us. We weren't held very strictly responsible for our little misdeeds. We didn't have to worry—things were done for us.

Men and women grow up. They have to struggle for a living. They have to think, always a painful and repeated process. They have to bear responsibility for their acts. Nobody sees to it that they are warm, and protected, and safe.

Down deep underneath the welter of mental struggles over personal responsibilities and public cares, lies still that hidden, perhaps forgotten, impress of a time when all was safe, secure, unthinking, warm.

And so, when someone comes along and offers conditions to the adult which are a little like that, the hidden childhood impress comes to the surface and responds. The grown man or woman welcomes a situation in which he is told what to do, told what to think, relieved of responsibilities and of guilt for cruel desires or acts.

Thus there is a certain amount of appeal in dictatorship for all of us. But it does not dominate. Most Americans are grown up. They are men and women. They welcome the chance to stand on their own legs, think their own thoughts, bear responsibility.

Freedom is a condition which only mature, strong, independent men and women can maintain. To relapse, by turning over affairs to a dictator, into a condition of adult childhood, is a horror to most Americans. The child has no doubts. Even the mental doubts and turmoil we are going through are a mark of maturity.

Every lover of freedom today should set as his slogan the iron words Paul wrote to the Corinthians:
Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong.

Wheat Specialist Plans Secret Trip To England

WASHINGTON, March 3—(AP)—Thomas D. Campbell, the mass production wheat specialist who gave Soviet Russia expert advice for the first five-year plan, will fly to England this week on a mission shrouded in secrecy.

A rangy, grey-haired Montanan, Campbell has spent the last month here, calling frequently at the White House for confidential talks with President Roosevelt, and conferring with a number of top-ranking administration officials.

He insisted, however, that he could not discuss the purpose of his trip abroad.

Dardanelles May Be Barometer In Balkan Quarrels

The Dardanelles, battle zone of the ages, likely will be the barometer that will tell us whether a hurricane is to sweep the Balkans or whether Herr Hitler is right in thinking that he will get calm weather for his further military maneuvers.

The situation today is tense. Any Nazi threat, or suggestion of threat, against the Dardanelles probably will let hell loose.

This strait—one of the most important positions strategically in the whole world—is vital to many powers, who would like it for themselves, and at least insist that this gateway between the Black Sea and the Mediterranean remain unmolsted.

We have a position in which Russia might strike if the strait were endangered, or at least give Turkey moral and material backing to defend this position. If Turkey ever would fight, it would be to protect this great trust and heritage, which involves her sovereignty.

Turks Eye Russia.
So once more we come bang up against the conclusion that much depends on Turkey's attitude, and that in turn hinges in large degree on the stand adopted by the Muscovites.

The Nazi press declares that the military occupation of Bulgaria will enable Germany to prevent any British effort to "disturb the peace" in the Balkans, that is, to open up a new war front in that zone. The indications thus far are that Hitler's desire is to avoid an upheaval, and it isn't unlikely that he may achieve this if he doesn't threaten Turkey, and the Turks decide not to fight for Greece but only if they themselves are in danger.

The German papers also predict that Greece, which they describe as the "unhappy orphan of the storm," will have to pay for her British alliance. It appears to be Hitler's hope that he now can squeeze the Greeks into submission by a mere threat of striking at them across the Bulgarian frontier.

Authoritative sources in Yugoslavia predict that she will join the Axis shortly. That wouldn't be surprising in view of her great danger in being all but surrounded by Axis forces.

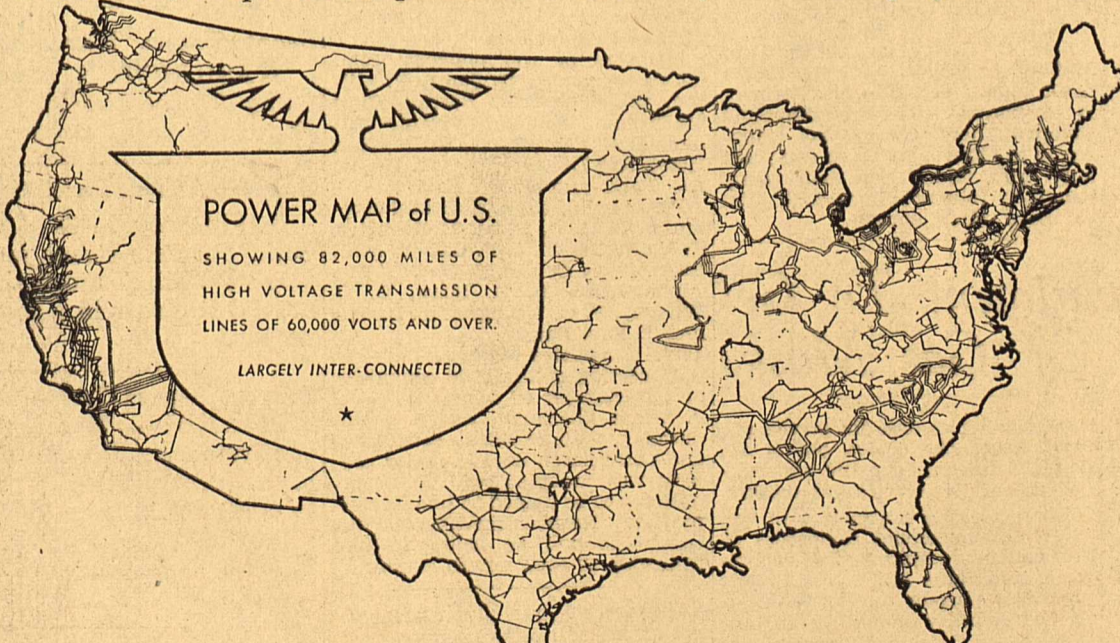

This is the first of a series of six articles on hands that were played by the country's outstanding experts—otherwise they would not have worked.

You see, the expert is so fine in his analysis of his hand, that when he is playing against another expert, he knows he can depend upon that opponent to make just the correct play. So occasionally one expert will lay a very fine trap which the other expert cannot help but fall into.

This first hand was played by Oswald Jacoby against one of the country's greatest card analysts. Would you have fallen for the same play?

Jacoby was sitting South. The opening lead held and North continued with the jack of clubs, at which point Jacoby overtook in order to lead the king of hearts, which West won with the ace.

A small diamond was led to the king and the deuce of diamonds returned. Jacoby split his honors, the ace and led a small diamond, trumping in dummy. Jacoby played the queen of diamonds, deliberately establishing declarer's ten-spot.

Jacoby's purpose was to cause West to misread the hand. West had to reason thus:

"South had either two or three clubs. He did not have more than four hearts, or he would have rebid hearts instead of bidding three clubs. His play of the diamond queen meant that he had only three diamonds, therefore he has at least three spades."

So at this point, West led the spade king, returned a spade and finessed the ten-spot, since, according to his reasoning, North should now have no more spades. Thus Jacoby's well-planned defense worked and the card analyst's contract was defeated when the queen of spades won.

U. S. To Export Many War Products To Isles



Engineers Cite Figures For Waterways In Texas

WASHINGTON, March 3—(AP)—Congress was informed today by army engineers that \$27,136,900 could be profitably expended on Texas waterways during the 1942 fiscal year, including \$15,360,200 for continuing construction at the Red River Dam near Denison.

The sum was in addition to any unexpended funds already available for Texas improvements. For the Denison dam it was estimated that with expenditure of the \$15,360,200 the \$54,000,000 flood control-power project would be 59 per cent complete at the end of the fiscal period beginning July 1.
