 One of the most interesting duplicate games I played in Annapolis was at Cavalry Hall. The game is conducted by Mrs. Wilton McCarthy and directed by Mrs. Allan Westcott. Here we find the private citizens and the retired officers participating in this weekly contest and the strategy employed by this group was well demonstrated in this hand I saw played during my visit. North held off on the opening lead. East continued with the jack, forcing the ace. Declarer at once cashed five clubs, South discarding a heart. East found trouble in discarding. He let go two hearts, then a diamond. When the fifth club was cashed, East saw the danger of letting go his last heart, which might be necessary for exit, so he discarded a second diamond. But declarer was equal to the occasion. He realized that West must hold the king of hearts and probably another spade. To try the heart finesse would probably lose the game. So he cashed the ace of hearts, balling East out of the suit. Then he led dummy's ten of spades. East cashed three more spade tricks, but that was all for the defense. West had to blank his king of diamonds to hold the king of hearts, and declarer guessed the situation when East exited with the nine of diamonds.



Italy Withdraws Embassy Attache

ROME, April 9—(AP)—The Italian government has withdrawn Admiral Alberto Lais, naval attache, from the Italian embassy in Washington under protest that the seizure of Italian ships in American ports was unfriendly and illegal, it was declared authoritatively today. The Italian government was said to have taken the view the ship seizures were violations from the moral viewpoint and under international law. (The United States asked Admiral Lais' recall last Thursday in connection with alleged orders for sabotaging some of the seized ships which were found to have been damaged.)




