State Cards Tax Nearest Approach To Gambling Law

AUSTIN, June 3—(AP)—Imposition of a state tax on playing cards was about the nearest approach of the 47th legislature to gambling regulation.

The tax of five cents a packet, part of the \$29,000,000 omnibus tax bill, represented almost the sum of finally-enacted bills affecting games of chance.

There was one permitting grand juries to finance gambling investigations with coins seized from slot machines but otherwise gambling legislation fell into the also-ran

category as the session drew near an end.

Offers Wager Proposal

Two attempts—both uncompleted in the waning days of the session—were made to alter the status quo of gambling privileges and prohibitions.

Relegalization of horse race betting, perennial debate-invoker, made two runs from the paddock but never reached the track for a final test.

Rep. John J. Bell of Cuero offered a measure restoring parimutuel wagering. Twice his bill was reported favorably by committee, the second time after it had been recommended for more hearings, but unless the session continued indefinitely or recessed and then reconvened to again take up its calendar, the bill apparently was buried.

Mrs. White is quick on the trigger when it comes to doubling, but she can defend a hand as shown in the following example.

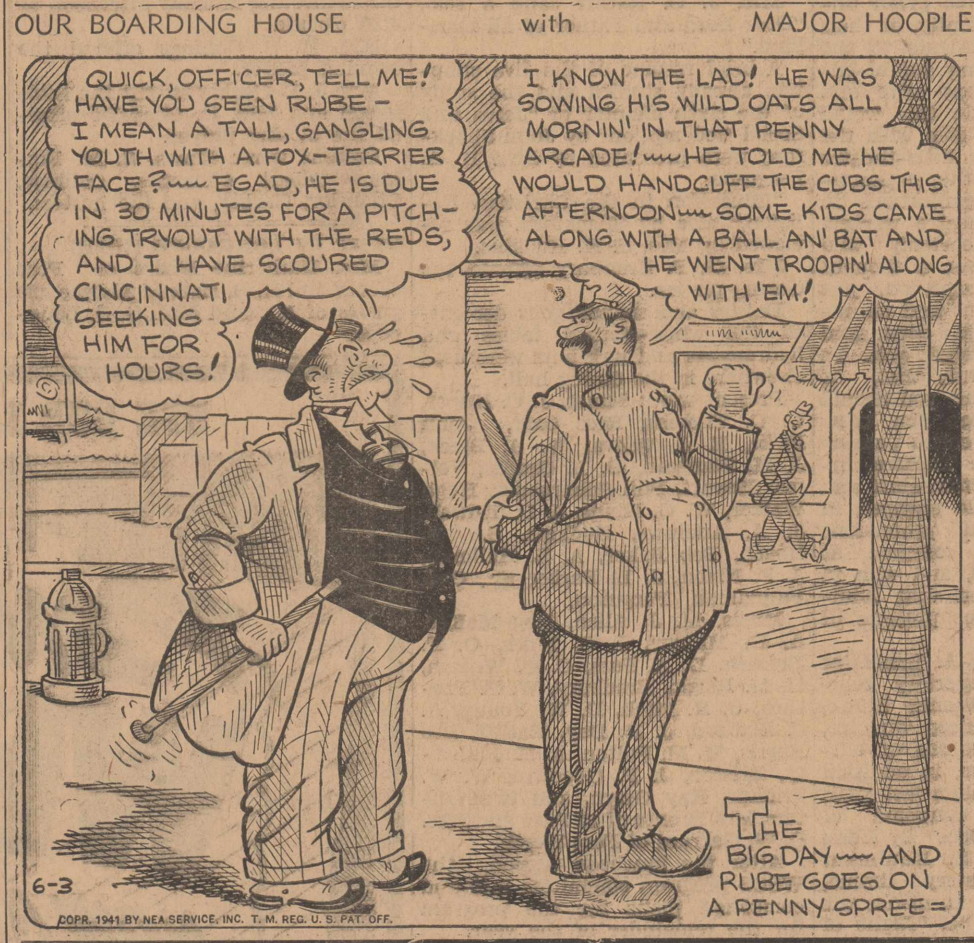
It is easy to say that East's heart bid was rash, but certainly many weaker overcalls are made without running into such disaster.

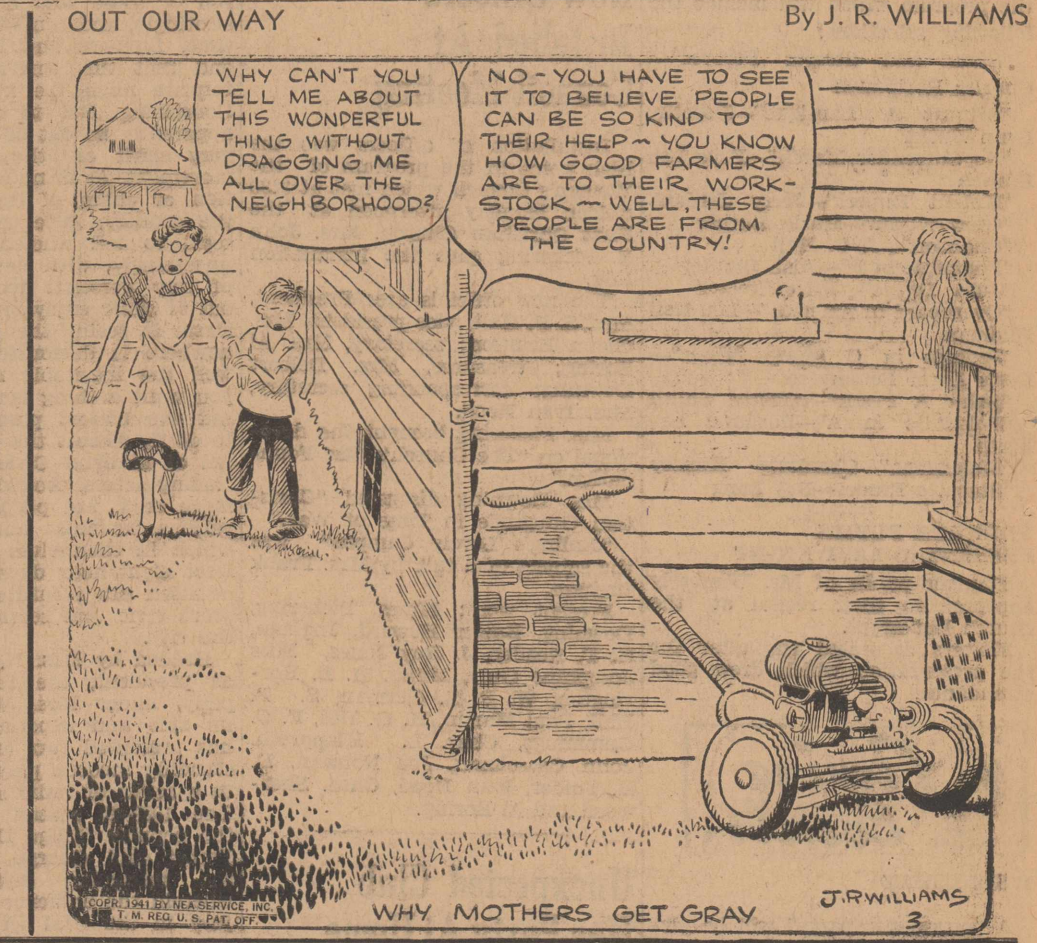

Seeing a pistol in the man's hand, DeFoe drew his own gun and ordered the man to drop his weapon. The officer picked up the gun, discovered it was a toy.

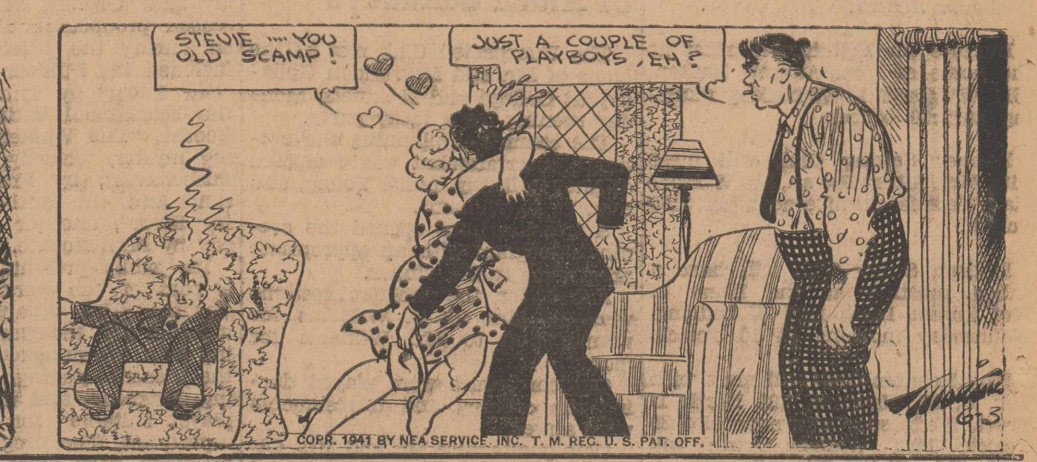
The passenger signed a statement and admitted he robbed Roberts of \$1.95.
