## DOES PROHIBITION PROHIBIT?

We think that every informed person will agree that prohibition is a miserable failure in Midland County as well as in other sections of Texas. Bootlegging was carried on throughout the period of State-wide prohibition.

The Texas Liquor Control Law has very strict provisions regarding the retail sale of alcoholic beverages and the conduct of those who are licensed to sell them. Any objectionable conditions can be corrected by strict enforcement of the law.

A dealer's license can be cancelled for any of the following reasons

1. Sales to minors
2. Sales to persons visibly intoxicated. 3. Purchase or sale of liquor on beer
3. $\begin{aligned} & \text { premises. } \\ & \text { Unsanitary conditions. }\end{aligned}$
4. Unsanitary conditions.
5. Permitting disturbances to occur on

There are many other rules and regulations too numerous to mention which control a licensed dealer. The bootlegger is subject to none of these regulations and has no license to protect.

## Rooseveli's Attitude:

- A vote for prohibition is a slap at the entire program of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. We can all recall the great part that President Roosevelt took frankly and openly advocating the repeal of national prohibition and in advocating the legalization of alcoholic beverages when he was convinced of the miserable failure of prohibition throughout the country.
