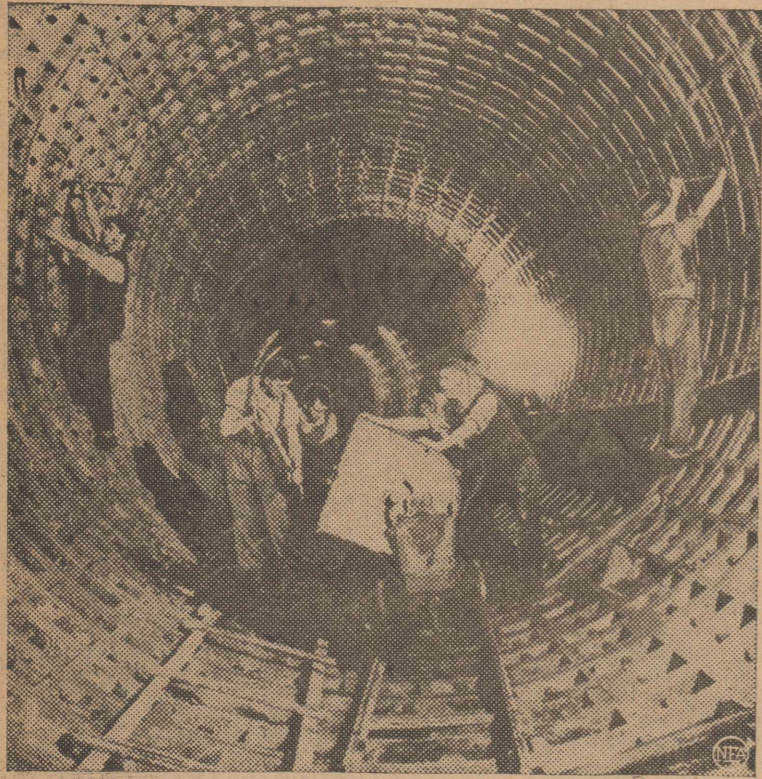


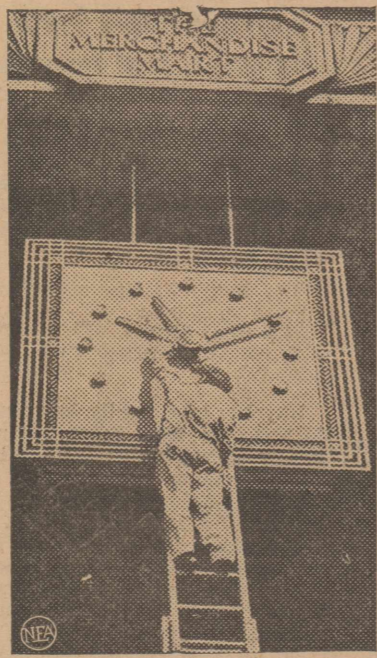

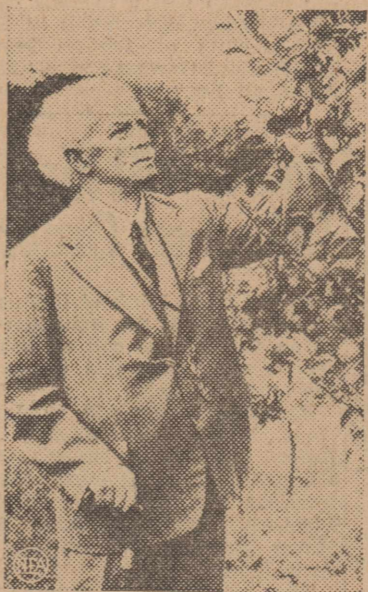

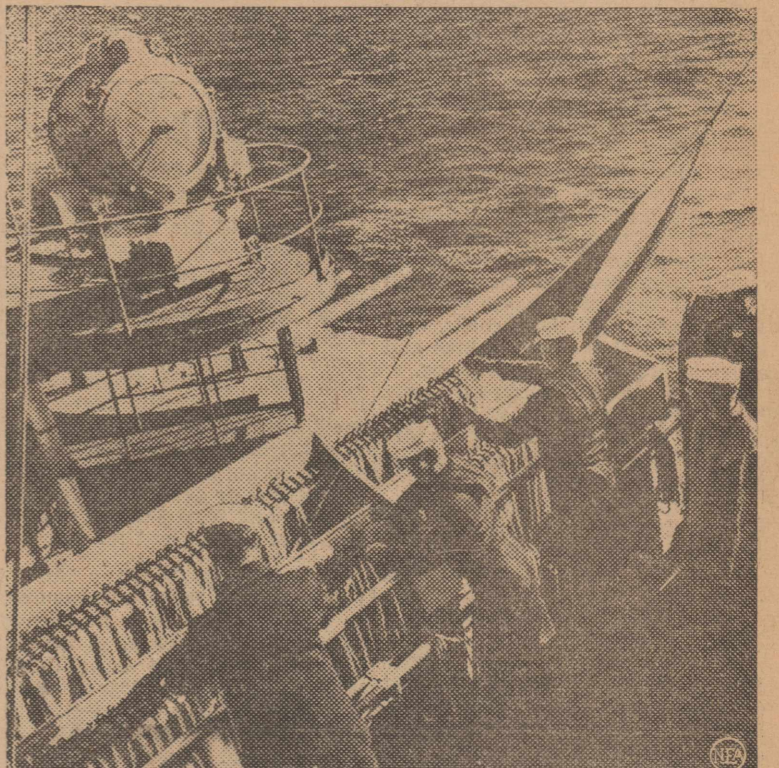

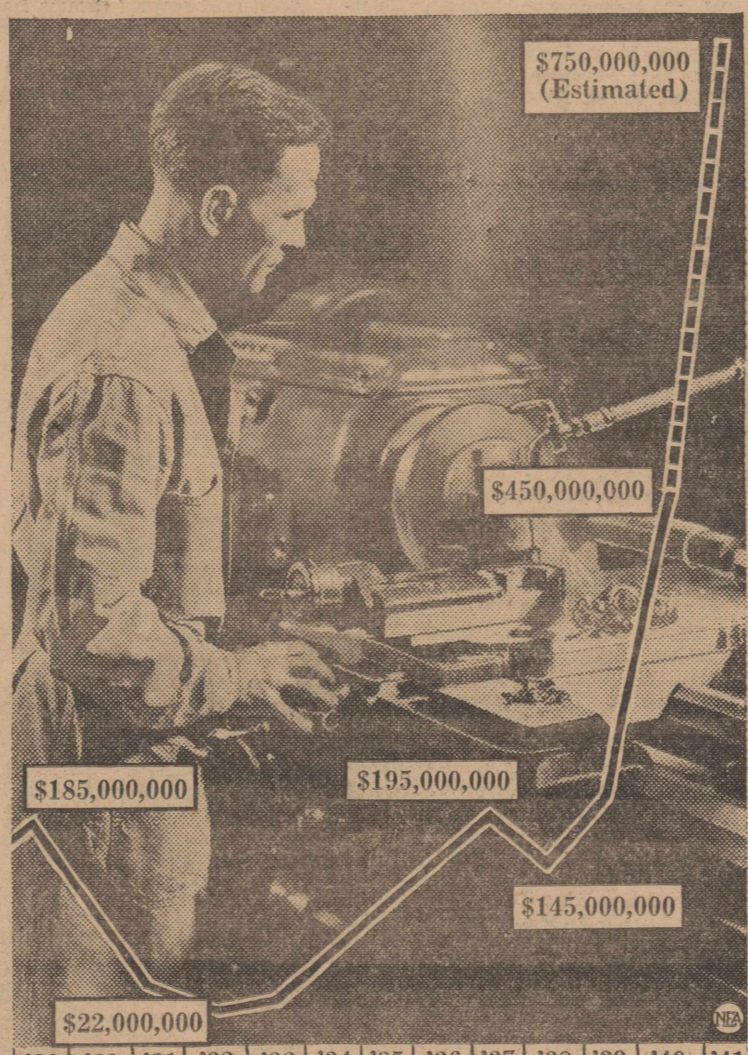
David Lloyd George, Britain's snowy-haired prime minister of World War I, enjoys life of retirement on his farm at Churt, England, and finds apple crop promising.

Rocket Rise of Machine Tool Output



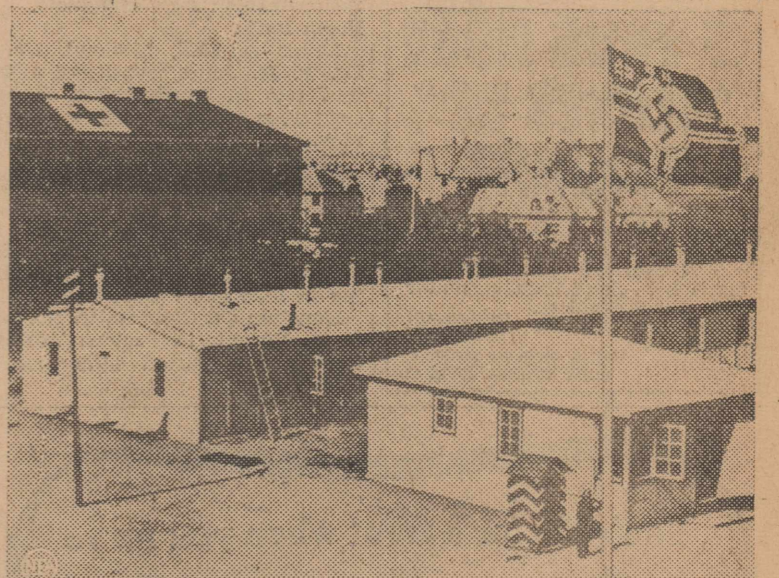

Double Cross on Red Cross in Norway



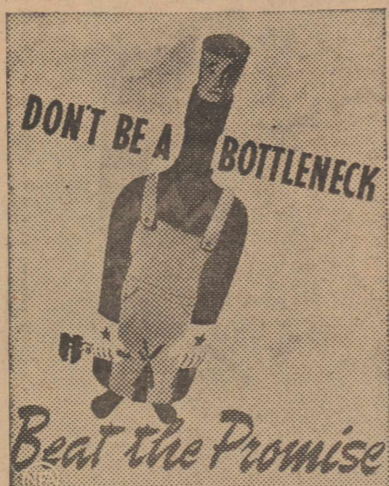

Shower on Shadeless Sand



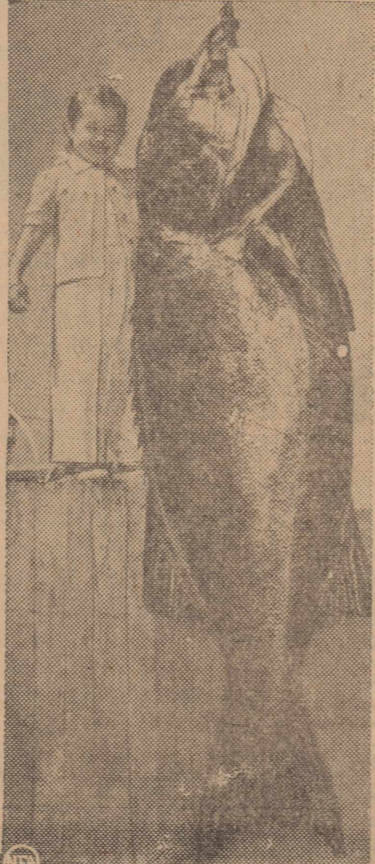
It's thumbs up even in this bathtub for member of British coastal defense gun crew at Tobruk, assisted in a shower by a comrade.

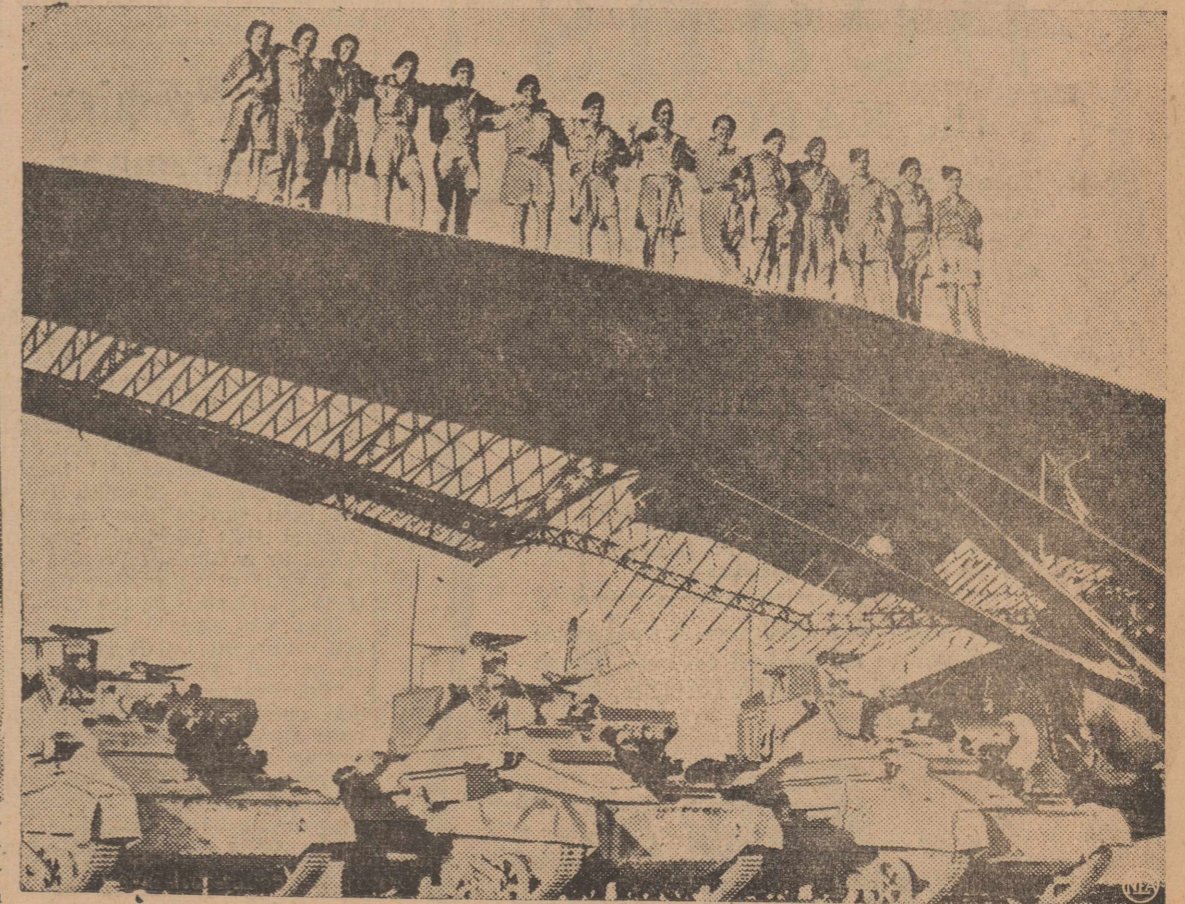

Conspiracy Case Against U. S. Set For Trial Oct. 20

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (UP) — Department of Justice agents are scheduled to describe an alleged "pattern for revolution" at the trial here of 29 persons on charges of conspiracy to overthrow the United States government by force.

The trial is set to open on Oct. 20.

The testimony presumably will be intended to show that defendants consulted with the late Leon Trotsky at his exile in Mexico for advice on gaining control of industry, labor and the nation's armed forces.

Those facing trial are reputed to be members of the Socialist Workers Party. In a federal grand jury indictment they were charged with conspiracy to disrupt the morale of the army and navy.

Smith Act Invoked

The case is the first to be prosecuted under the Smith Act, enacted in June, 1940, which makes advocacy of a revolution against the government a public offense and imposes penalties for seeking to affect the morale of the armed forces.

Defense counsel, in demurrers which were overruled, contended that the Smith Act is unconstitutional on the ground that it restricts freedom of speech.

The indictment was returned by a federal grand jury in St. Paul, July 15, after an investigation lasting two weeks. Among the defendants are James Cannon, New York, national leader of the Socialist Workers Party; Jake Cooper, once a bodyguard for Trotsky in Mexico; Felix Morrow, editor of

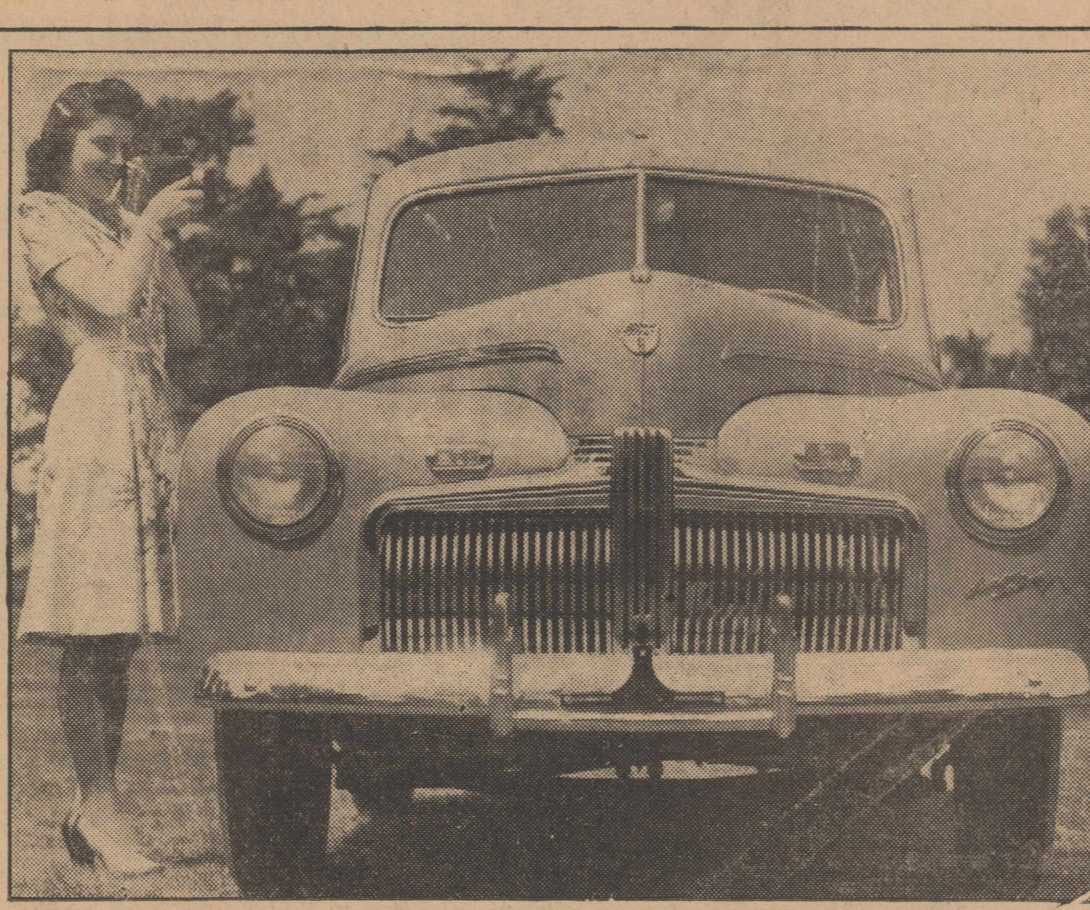
