## Puss in Loo



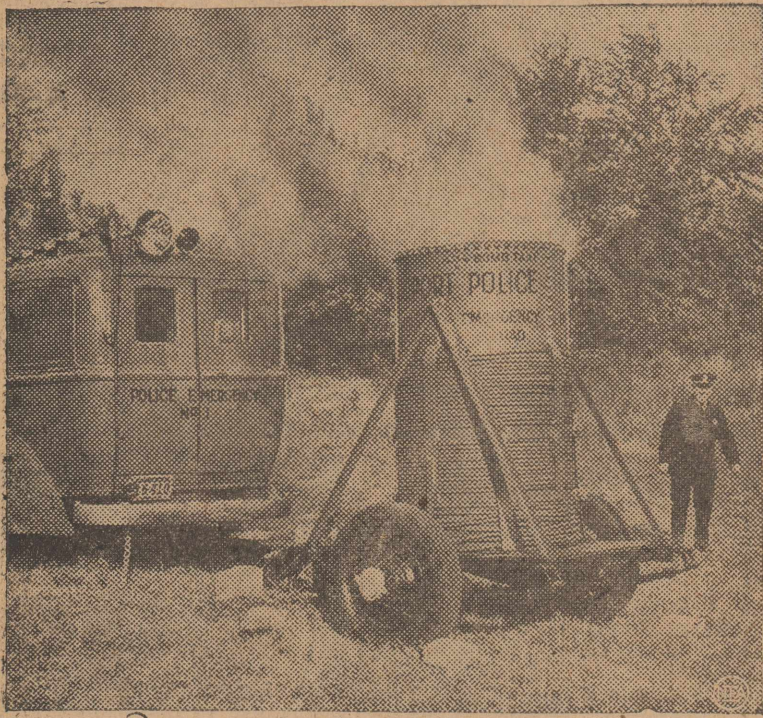

## Leads Australia



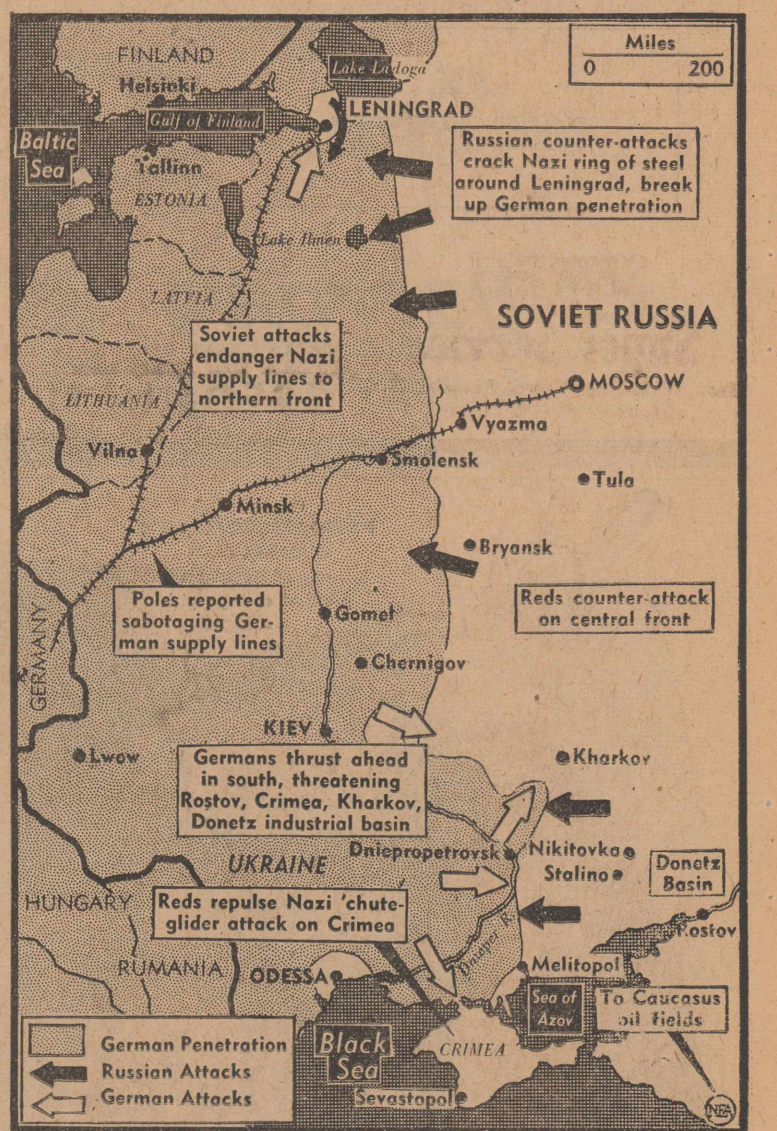
John Curtin, above, Australian Labor party leader, is forming new cabinet at Canberra, following resignation of Prime Minister Arthur Fadden.

## Economic Warrior



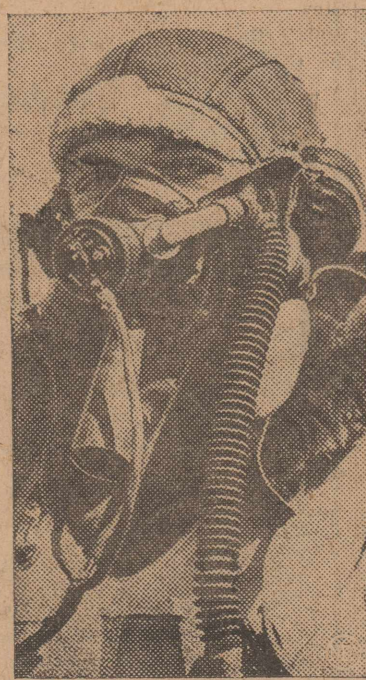

## Picture Proof of Nazi Seed Sown in South America

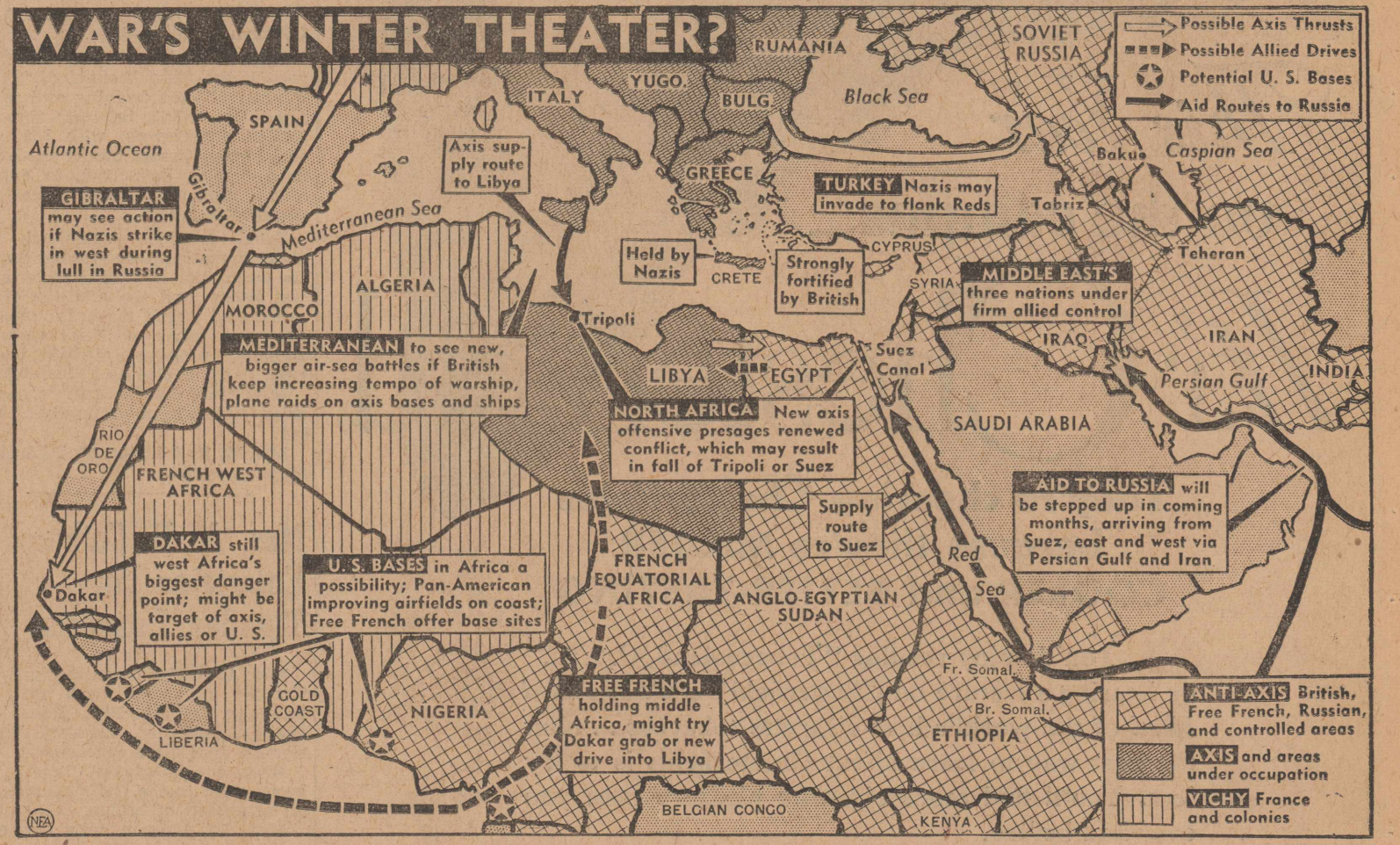
