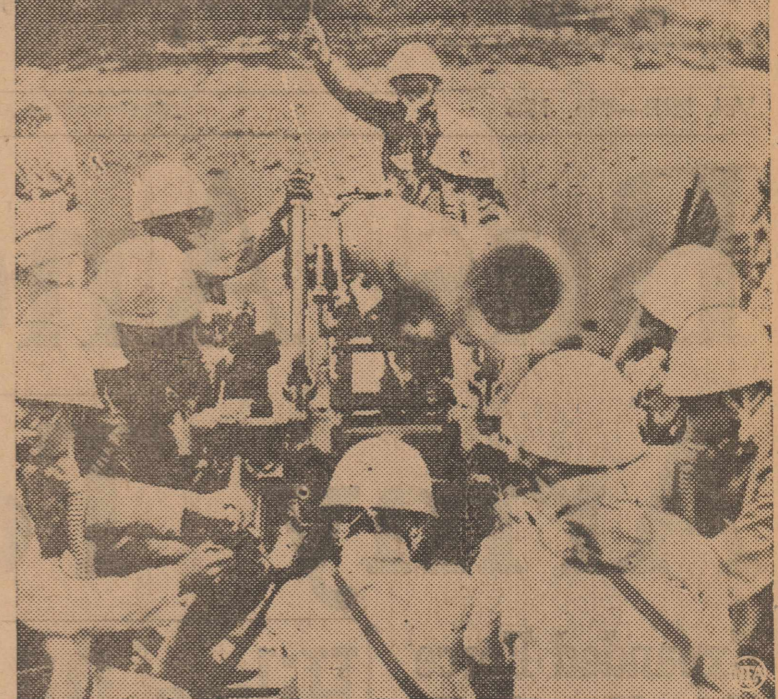
Britain And U. S. Agree To Furnish Soviet Materials

LONDON (AP) — Lord Beaverbrook told the House of Lords Thursday the United States and British missions to Russia had promised Joseph Stalin to make up Russia's losses in tanks and planes in the war against Germany by shipments from their two countries.

U. S. Promises Oil

Beaverbrook, who recently returned from the Moscow consultations disclosed that Stalin promised Great Britain raw materials from Russia to meet "many of our needs" and said the Russian leader "agreed to supply us with pitch, chrome, potash, magnesite, potassium, timber and canned salmon."

LONDON (AP)—Lord Halifax, British ambassador to the United States, was the target of a vigorous attack by Laborite Angus Bevan Thursday in a war debate in the House of Commons.

Referring to a speech made in the United States before the German drive into Russia, Bevan said: "Lord Halifax informed Hitler in the plainest possible language when he was assembling his troops to attack Russia that he need fear no attack from us x x x"

We Don't Know Our Strength

There is something going on in America—something so tremendous that few realize it at all. The productive capacity of the country is increasing, and increasing rapidly, after a long period of doldrums.

In 1917, Henderson surprisingly says, when the country turned to arms production, there actually was no increase in the total productiveness of the country. That remained static. It was thought a good trick to keep it from falling, in view of the quick enforced shift from the aims of peace to those of war.

A larger percentage of production must go, and will go, into defense. But that won't mean reduction in civilian production by the same amount. Some items of civilian production are going to climb right with defense.

Buy Defense Bonds and Stamps

The increasing importance of the territories and insular possessions of the United States is well shown by a study recently completed by the Tax Institute. This demonstrated that in 1940 tax collections in the Territory of Hawaii totaled \$21,000,000, or more than those of any 11 states.

These tax collections are a measure of growth of these territories and possessions and of their importance in a fiscal and business way. They suggest, since their trend is definitely upward, that their importance to U. S. economy and life will be even greater in the future than they have been in the past.

Brewster, member of the Senate committee investigating National Defense, said he would urge that this controversial contract be awarded to the low bidder at once despite Hillman's testimony that he feared such action might cause a "civil war" in Detroit labor circles.

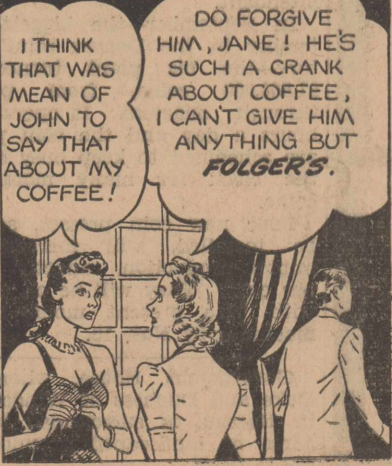
CRANE ARTISTS WORK TO ENTER DALLAS EXHIBIT

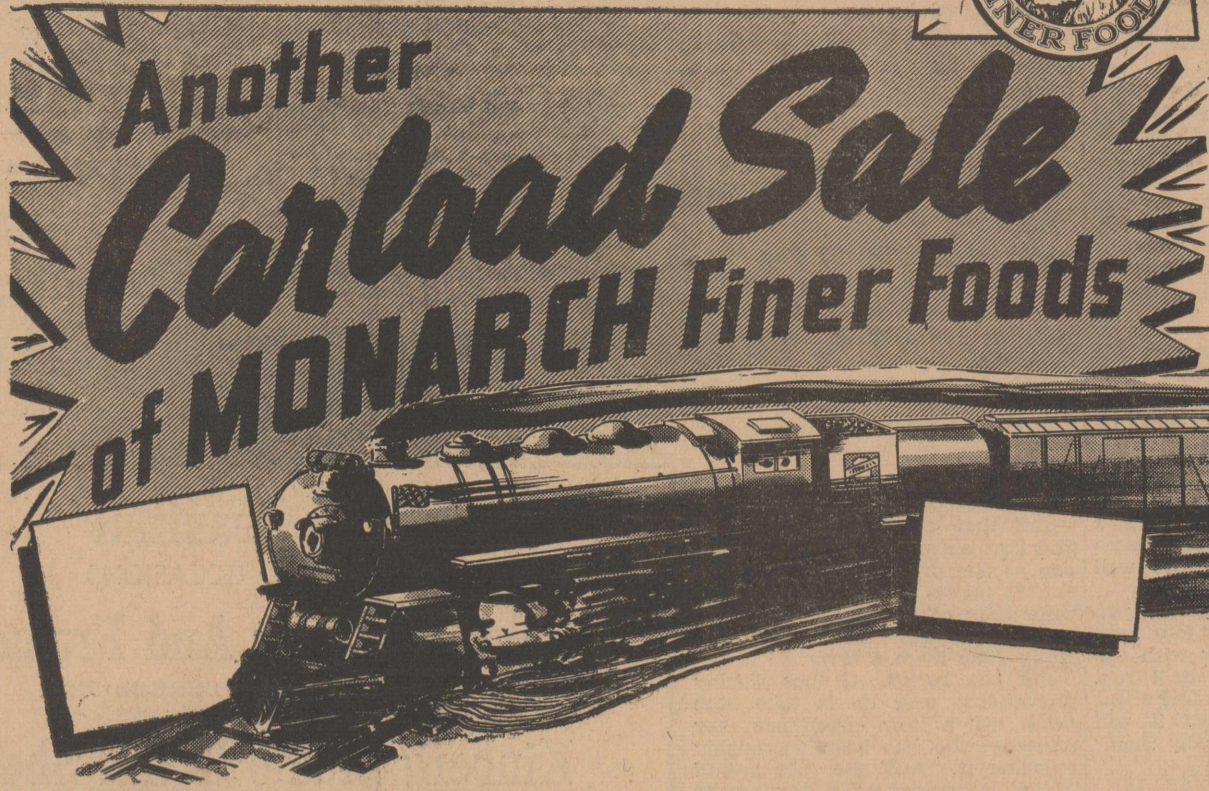
