AUSTIN - A blister could well be called the modern version of the mythical Achilles heel. Much as Achilles - the Greek

ideal of youth, strength, beauty, and valor, was fatally wounded by an arrow piercing his vulnerable heel, a tiny blister can spoil a game of gof or tennis or even a whole vacation.

The clister merits closer attention than we usually grant it. And the admonitions which apply to our athletes also are sound tips for the millions of weekend and vacation athletes.

A blister is caused by pres sure and friction on a localized area of the skin. Fluid collects between the inner and outer layers of skin. If pressure i not continued, it hurts. Even if no inter before it breaks from fricfectio follows, the pain can cause a limp that isn't much fun for the golfer or hiker, and it can upset the customary grip on a tennis racket, golf club, oar or canoe paddl.

The best approach to blisters, as to disease, is prevention. Proper fitting shoes are fundamental. There should be room beyond the big toe, room across the top, fitting of the ball of the foot into the widest part of the shoe with no slipping of he heel. Wearing two pairs of socks, a lightweight pair under sweat socks, is recommended for athletics. Hands can be protected by taping or by special sports

A decision on whether or not to puncture a blister is based on location, size, and inflammation. If there are signs of inflaumation or irritation, medical attention is indicated. Sometime it is advisable to puncture a blister before it breaks from friction. Wash the area with soap and water and sterilize with al cohol. The puncture is made with a sharp needle held in a forceps (small pliers) and sterlized in a flame. The puncture s made at the side of the blister






