# Wallace rally to wind up Massachusetts campaign

BOSTON (AP) - A rally scheduled for Alabama Gov. George C. Wallace tonight, the eve of the nation's second presidential primary, is helping to keep attention fixed on the volatile and divisive forced busing issue in Massachusetts.

The state's primary is scheduled for Tuesday, and the race is considered so divided and unpredictable that a relative handful of votes could change the order of finish among the eight major Democratic candidates.

Throughout the campaign here, candidates have either exploited or tried to avoid the busing issue. Today they were fanning out across the state for final campaigning.

Unlike the New Hampshire campaign, when the spotlight was on the Republican race, neither major GOP candidate has set foot in the Bay State

in recent months, nor are they expected. President Ford is heavily favored, and has spent \$200,000 in an effort to ensure the victory.

Ronald Reagan has no official campaign under way in the state, although much of his New Hampshire media advertising was seen here.

Although 43 GOP delegates are at stake, Reagan's Northeast coordinator said his candidate doesn't view Massachusetts as crucial.

"Massachusetts is not one of those primaries that is convincing to other Republicans as an indicator of the attractability of the candidate," said James Lake. He said that the state's Republican party is a more liberal party than the GOP as a whole.

In the Democratic race in the Bay State - the only state to favor Democratic Sen. George McGovern in the 1972 presidential election - 104 delegates are at stake.

The election here is attracting far more national attention than a simultaneous primary in Vermont. The major reason is that more delegates are at stake. But the busing issue in Boston is also a factor - the chance to measure reaction in a city that for two years has been divided over a court-ordered plan to integrate its schools.

Opponents of forced busing spent much of Sunday urging 3,000 marchers to vote for antibusing candidates. Meanwhile, most of the candidates found themselves being questioned about the issue on television panel shows.

Sen. Henry M. Jackson of Washington, who has tried to capture the antibusing vote here, was quizzed about Senate votes on ABC's "Issues and Answers' program.

He said he had voted against some legislation favored by antibusing groups because "the Congress cannot by statute change a court order directing busing where that court order is based on an interpretation by the court of the 14th Amendment."

Much of the antibusing vote is expected to go to Wallace, the only candidate mentioned at an antibusing march on South Boston High School

Rep. Morris K. Udall said on the CBS program "Face the Nation" that he doesn't like to have judges running schools. "I think we're all being tested and the real question is whether we're going to have some presidential leadership on this.'

On a local television panel in suburban Needham, Sargent Shriver acknowledged that most people don't want forced busing of school children for racial integration. But he said he supports court decisions when they decide busing is the only workable alternative.

Sen. Birch Bayh of Indiana, who has criticized Jackson for "demogaguing" on the busing issue, said he would seek "an incentive to school boards to do the right thing" by creating magnet schools and rejuvenating the worst schools to attract students.

Meanwhile, Daniel Patrick Moynihan, newly returned to his Harvard teaching post after resigning as United Nations ambassador, endorsed Jackson in full page newspaper advertisements today and was to appear with the senator at a news conference.

On Sunday, Shriver appeared with

his family and Cesar Chavez at a "Family Day" at Faneuil Hall, and Bayh continued his attack on former Georgia Gov. Jimmy Carter.

Carter, who received the largest single portion - 30 per cent - of the Democratic primary vote in New Hamp hire last week, was in Greensboro, N.C., urging an end to United States military involvement in other nations "unless there is a direct and obvious threat to the security of

"I think Jimmy Carter ought to tell us fust where he differs from (President) Gerry Ford on the economic problems of Massachusetts," Bayh said. "If the Carter position prevails, if the Ford position prevails, the cities of Massachusetts will lose \$68.9 million in countercyclical revenue sharing."

# Ex-Lockheed employe bares more payoffs

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) - Lockheed Aircraft Corp. and its competitors made Christmastime cash payoffs and promised post-retirement jobs to U.S. Air Force colonels in a position to steer foreign military business their way, says a former Lockheed official.

I have a few names," said Ernest F. Hauser, who left Lockheed as a customer relations officer after suffering a heart attack in 1964. But he declined to make the names public, saying, "It's been a long time and I don't know what good it could possibly

Hauser, who lives in suburban Paradise Valley, said the payoffs are 'small potatoes compared with the huge bribes you read about in the

Lockheed officials have admitted the firm gave millions of dollars to government officials in several European countries and Japan, but Hauser is the first individual to allege publicly that American military officers also received payoffs from aircraft firms in connection with foreign contracts.

A Lockheed spokesman responded to the allegation Sunday by saying: "To the best of our knowledge, there is no indication that Lockheed has ever offered gratuities such as alleged to NATO officers.'

Hauser has testified before the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission and a U.S. Senate subcommittee on multinational corporations about payoffs to foreign officials. On Sunday, the Arizona Republic quoted him as saying cash payoffs of \$10,000 to \$20,000 were made to the American officers at Christmas as Pentagon

officials looked the other way.

"I wouldn't call it a bribe. It's just keeping them sweet. The military would get very upset if you called it a bribe." Hauser said in a subsequent interview with The Associated Press. 'Even big companies, like Hughes Aircraft, every company tries this.'

Hauser acknowledged his information is at least 10 years old, but added: "It's been going on for years. Officers in the Military Advisory Assistance Groups (MAAGs) we have in many countries are approached by people in the industry. They become military salesmen."

MAAGs are U.S. units in foreign countries which give defense advice. The colonels helped to influence foreign officials on what type of aircraft to buy, and while the cash payoffs were on a smaller scale than those to foreign officials, the colonels sometimes exacted a high price for their favors in other ways, Hauser

"There was a two-star (U.S.) Army general in Germany. I know his name but I don't want to give it to you. He wanted to get hired because he was going to retire. He really put the pressure on and we had to hire him.

"The aircraft business, I think it's something nobody realizes, it's a dirty business," Hauser said. "But I can't understand why they always pick on Lockheed. Except that Northrop was very clever.

"You find in these MAAGs, colonels are very solid with Northrop. That's the trouble Lockheed had, most of the colonels were well entrenched with other manufacturers."

# State starts voter registration effort

AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) - Secretary of State Mark White announced a statewide campaign today with the aim of giving every Texan an opportunity to register to vote.

White told a news conference there are an estimated 8.2 million Texans who are old enough to vote but only about 4.8 million are registered at the present time.

In the 1972 presidential elections there were 5.2 million Texans registered to vote, although only 3.5 million turned out at the polls. White pointed out that during

February almost all tax assessorcollectors mailed blue voter certificates to all persons on their voter

"Those persons who have not received their blue voter certificates by mail are probably not registered to vote," he said.

He said anyone with questions should call their county lax assessor-collector or call the secretary of state's toll-free number 1 800 292-9602.

A voter registration application will be as near as the nearest telephone. White was asked about reports that some Texas counties have not com-plied with a U.S. Justice Department

requirement that material concern-

ing registration must be mailed out in both English and Spanish.

"I have not heard those reports," he said. "And we have notified every county tax collector in the state that all such material must be bilingual."

# Italy's lira halts slump

ROME (AP) — Italy reopened its official foreign exchange markets today after a 40-day shutdown and after an early dip the lira held steady, drawing a sigh of relief from Premier Aldo Moro's minority government.

Any worsening of the monetary crisis could spell disaster for the Christian Democrat government, only 19 days old and already beset by scandals stemming from revelations of Centeral Intelligence Agency and Lockheed activities in Italy. The lira slipped to about 778779 to

the dollar in early trading but then settled at 771, unchanged from Friday's late quote in interbank

LOS ANGELES (AP) - Former President Richard Nixon has returned to the privacy of his San Clemente compound after a trip to China that drew honors from his hosts but criticism from some at home.

There was no word whether Nixon would meet with Secretary of State Henry Kissinger, who was on the West Coast at the Palm Springs home of actor Kirk Douglas when Nixon returned on Sunday from the eight-

Several Ford Administration and State Department officials said during Nixon's journey that the former president would be debriefed upon his return, as would any visitor returning from China. However, Kissinger had said he would not do the debriefing himself.

Nixon is the only Westerner to have had extensive contacts with the acting premier of China, Hua Kuo-feng. While in China, he talked with Hua for two hours and met for more than an hour with Communist Party Chairman Mao Tse-tung.

# Party congress vote endorses Brezhnev

MOSCOW (AP) - Delegates to the Soviet Communist party congress today unanimously approved Leonid I. Brezhnev's report on the progress and future course of the Soviet

The endorsement of Brezhnev's

speech of last Tuesday, which pledged both the intensification of detente and assistance for Marxist movements throughout the world, was expected. Prior to the hand vote by the 4,998 delegates in the Kremlin Palace of Congresses, the 69-year-old leader again took the podium to thank the scores of speakers who praised the Soviet party's course.

Although at least three foreign Communist leaders delivered remarks that showed a divergence with Moscow's version of the proper direction for the Communist party. Brezhnev saw total unity:

"The words (spoken) about proletarian internationalism, about the friendship of peoples and the struggle for peace resounded in one voice. This is our policy and we will not retreat from it." Without speaking directly against the Soviet party line, both the Italian and French Communist delegates showed their parties have chosen independent courses aimed at more participation in Western democracies than the Soviets would like.

District Judge Perry D. Pickett has asked for dismissal of a federal civil suit in which he is accused of violating the constitutional rights of C. Dean Hubbard, a former county jail prisoner under Pickett's charge.

pre-radar days, "and primarily from surface observations. Then, Mooney said, weather stations were "very widely scat-tered" and had "not much in-formation to go on."

Forecasters depended, too, upon radio reports from fliers.

"In those days, they just had to move from city to city," Mooney said of aviators. "There were no airways in those days." Radio was the primary navigation aid.

"You did pretty well to forecast a few hours back in the early '30s," Mooney said.

Today, weather forecasters have outdistanced that by multi-hours running into days. But, still, they depend heavily on experience to interpret the weather firsthand and to read the output of electronic gear. "It's not an accurate science yet,"

Mooney said of forecasting.
Lunney agreed. "Experience means a lot, rather than just going to the old textbook . . .

"They've about reached the point," Lunney further said, "where the computers are as good as experienced forecasters.'

Yes, said Mooney, but "I don't think you can underestimate either." And they, as comrades, were in agreement.

Moments after Mooney's last hour as a weather forecaster came to a close, Lunney offered his friend Hank a firm handshake: "... . You made it, you made it," he said. "Thank you. by golly," said the man of the hour. "I'm sure glad . .



# SALT II political storm said pending

WASHINGTON — "It is imprudent
and implausible," wrote the
respected scholar Theodore Draper in the February issue of Commentary magazine, "to conduct a foreign policy based on holding back the new Soviet expansionism while still officially enmeshed in the doctrine of detente. One of them must go.'

Draper's article, "Appeasement and Detente," is only one of a number of documents being compiled by a growing group of senators and congressmen committed to a showdown with the Ford administration and Secretary of State Henry Kissinger on detente and SALT II. or a strategic arms limitation treaty with the Soviets.

In fact, even those who favor a SALT II agreement are reported alarmed at the lengths Kissinger is prepared to go to achieve such an agreement. Sources here tell me that members of the National Security Council, the Joint Chiefs of Staff and even members of the Arms Control Agency believe the secretary of state is throwing both caution and national security to the wind.

As a consequence, a major political storm is about to break over SALT II. In the center is a coalition of senators and congressmen who are out to not only scuttle detente and SALT II but are privately gearing up to attack President Ford openly and will not be

satisfied with anything short of Kissinger's resignation.

The first indication that SALT II and detente would be made into a 1976 political issue and a Ford liability was when Kissinger returned from Moscow in late January and details began leaking out of the concessions made to the Soviet Union. The testimony of Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld and Kissinger before the Senate and House on the defense budget was the crucial element that angered lawmakers.

Testifying before the Senate Finance Committee, Kissinger confirmed to Sen. Harry Byrd Jr. of Virginia that the current defense budget was based on the assumption that an arms agreement with the Soviets would be concluded this year. Byrd was shocked by this admission and wanted to know how Congress could approve such a budget when the substance of that agreement was still unknown

'Secretary Kissinger denied that an agreement had already been reached," Byrd told me. "Perhaps our negotiators already have decided what concessions they will make. Or, a secret agreement has already been reached. Either way, it is bad news for our national security."

Byrd, a ranking member of the Senate SALT II subcommittee, feels, along with a number of other senators and congressmen, that Kissinger and Rumsfeld were less than forthright with Congress. Sen. Henry Jackson, chairman of the Senate SALT subcommittee and a presidential aspirant, is expected to join in a coalition of senators in fighting Kissinger on SALT II and detente, particularly in the face of Soviet-Cuban aggression in Angola.

The upshot of all this is that a bitter political battle is about to break.

Center stage will be President Ford's secretary of state. Demands are expected that if U.N. Ambassador Daniel Patrick Moynihan resigned because he wanted to be tough with the Soviets and their supporters in the U.N., Kissinger should resign for being too soft in a detente policy, which is really appeasement of the Soviets. The argument being advanced by those who want Mr. Ford to fire Kissinger is that, like the liberals on Angola, conservative members of Congress are reasserting their control over American foreign policy. The sentiment among liberals that Kissinger should resign for entirely different reasons is now being vigorously advanced by conservatives. Caught in such a cross fire, it appears that the secretary of state will get the ax when he becomes a serious political liability for the President.

# Howard Hughes eludes IRS

WASHINGTON - The incredible story can now be told how Internal Revenue officials let the elusive Howard Hughes slip through their fingers in 1972 after his lawyer made several midnight telephone calls to

IRS agents were prepared to serve a subpoena on the phantom billionaire at the Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., airport in the early morning hours of Dec. 24. 1972. At the last minute, however, they were forbidden by their superiors from boarding his plane.

A Customs inspector finally was admitted on board. He turned a flashlight on a bearded man, with a black hat pulled down over his head, who identified himself as Hughes. The recluse was then allowed to go on his way, believe it or not, although there

was a subpoena out for him. Agents from at least two federal offices - the Internal Revenue Service and the Securities and Exchange Commission - would still like to determine whether Hughes is dead or alive. If they should establish that he is no longer alive, it could lead to a multi-million-dollar fraud case.

The man in the black hat suddenly appeared in Florida after an earthquake drove him out of Managua, Nicaragua. U.S. Customs in Miami was alerted that Howard Hughes would be coming through Miami

International Airport from Managua. Customs officials recalled seeing Hughes' name on a "stop list." A computer check confirmed that the IRS had . a subpoena to serve on him . Customs alerted the IRS, which dispatched its agents to the Miami airport.

They eventually learned that a private Lear jet, flying out of Managua, was expected to arrive not at Miami but at Ft. Lauderdale about midnight. But the IRS agents. meanwhile, had received astonishing instructions from Washington not to serve Hughes with the subpoena.

Nevertheless, a top Florida IRS official, G.T. Register, directed the agents to seek a meeting with Hughes. Register instructed them to insist on a face-to-face meeting.

The agents rushed to Ft. Lauderdale where they found a soaped and pressed Hughes aide, Charles Waldron, waiting for the billionaire at a remote hangar in a corner of the airport.

The Hughes jet landed and taxied into the dark, distant hangar. The IRS agents sent word with Waldron that they wished to speak to Hughes. Waldron returned from the plane with the response that they should telephone Hughes' attorney, Chester

Davis, in New York City. Davis asked the agents to hold off any action until he could contact their superiors in Washington and Miami. They agreed to wait 30 minutes. A few minutes later, Davis called back triumphantly to notify the agents that

they had to cancel their assignment. The agents said they weren't accustomed to taking orders from a private attorney and that they didn't intend to wait all night. This was followed by a flurry of calls.

standoff broken. A man with a nasal voice and Texas accent could be heard protesting, "No. no." But finally, a Customs inspector was allowed to board the plane and read the IRS statement to Hughes.

The inspector found Hughes concealed behind a blanket draped across the aisle and seatbacks. When the agent reached the blanket, he turned his flashlight on Hughes. .

Caught in the beam was a man with a black hat pulled down over his ears. His face was extremely thin, and he had a full beard. The agent asked whether he was Howard Hughes. The man mumbled yes. The agent then began reading the message, but Hughes interrupted. He indicated he was hard of hearing.

The agent handed Hughes a card containing the message. The billionaire then asked for a magnifying glass and was offered a pair of glasses.

Hughes read the card and the agent repeated it simultaneously in a loud voice. The agent asked whether Hughes understood, and the man in the black hat said he did.

That's the last the U.S. government has seen of Howard Hughes.

LUCKENBACH, Tex. (AP) -More than 3,000 persons celebrated the nation's "buycentennial" on the extra day of 1976 Sunday with a good-natured nose-thumbing at bad taste.

A group of San Antonio residents and the self-appointed mayor of this colorful resort hamlet just north of San Antonio, calling themselves the 'Non-buycentennial Commission," presented awards to those they said "have exceeded all others in their abuse and vulgarity of the Bicentennial."

Jack Harmon of San Antonio kicked off the first bad taste

award to the National Football League for its \$25,000 scholarship contest for an essay detailing the NFL's relationship to the Bicentennial.

But top honors went to the Midwest Breeder's Cooperative of Shawano, Wis., for its Bicentennial semen sale.

Complete with a picture of George Washington, the breeders' advertisement offered seven quarts of bull semen for the price of six.

Two firms tied for the product in worst taste - Falstaff Brewing Co. for its Bicentennial beer cans and Jackson Casket Co. of Jackson, Miss., for its red-white-and-blue flag-lined Bicentennial coffins.

An x-rated history of the "Red, American Revolution, Hot and Blue," by Hugh Best of Lansing, Mich., won the Bad Taste Work of Art award.

Another bad taste award was presented to the manufacturers of t-shirts promoting the event who showed up with "Luckenbach" misspelled. Luckenbach's mayor and co-owner, Hondo Crouch, refused to allow the shirts to be sold Sunday.

# New comet now visible

getting up before sunrise this week should be able to see a bright, newly discovered comet as it swings back into deep space following a rendezvous with the sun.

Comet West passed within 75 million miles of the earth Sunday on its closest approach and is in a position the rest of this week for good naked-eye viewing from the northern

hemisphere. Dr. Brian Marsden of the Center for Astrophysics in Cambridge, Mass., says the comet will be best visible from Wednesday to Sunday about an

hour before sunrise. Comet West should appear like a bright, elongated streak of light just above the eastern horizon, slightly scuth of the rising sun. On Wednesday, the comet should appear about 5 degrees above the horizon, pears at 14 degrees by Sunday.

Marsden said the planet Venus will appear in the general area but should not be confused with the comet.

"Venus will be brighter and, of course, won't have a tail," he said. Marsden said observers using binoculars or small telescopes should be able to see the comet, the brightest in the northern hemisphere since Comet Bennett in 1970, for the rest of

the month. The sky show will not be for

amateurs only. The National Aeronautics and Space Administration says it and other scientific organizations will mount a major effort to study Comet West. NASA will study the comet from earth and in space, using telescopes, rockets and airborne

While their composition isn't specifically known, comets are thought to be "dirty snowballs" of ice, methane, ammonia and dust. Scientists say comets could be remnants of the material from which our solar system was created.







# Officers arrest more than 100 at fencing 'party

WASHINGTON (AP) -A fencing peration secretly operated by police nd FBI agents did \$2.4 million worth business before the lawmen ended neir ruse and arrested more than 100 ersons, including 60 guests at a party celebrate the ring's prosperity.

Those arrested included assistant S. Atty. Donald E. Robinson Jr., vho was charged with accepting two ribes and fired from his post.

The bogus fencing operation, ubbed by police "The Sting" and ased in a local warehouse, also resulted in the recovery of 1,500 stolen credit cards, 460 government checks, 225 typewriters and calculators, 700 savings bonds, 18 cars and trucks and an electrocardiac machine stolen piece by piece from a local hospital.

U.S. Atty. Earl J. Silbert, in disclosing the scheme Sunday, said the loot also included \$1.2 million in checks signed by the Department of Housing and Urban Development and sold to the fencing operation for \$750. The checks were reportedly stolen from an unattended HUD vault during office hours. "No theft report has been filed to date by HUD," Silbert noted.

Silbert reported that transactions in the five months the fencing operation had been under police auspices totaled more than \$2.4 million, although police purchased the stolen items for only \$67,000.

On Saturday evening, police began their crackdown when some 60 unsuspecting guests were arrested at a "party" for the warehouse's clientele.

The party, supposedly to celebrate the fencing ring's success, drew a stylish crowd to the warehouse and many of the guests were wearing expensive jewelry, tuxedos and boutonnieres and arrived in expensive cars, according to police.

Upon entering the warehouse, the suspects were asked to check their guns and were told they were going to get to see the "big boss, the Don," who "is so proud of what you did for

One guest who did not have time to change for the party arrived in handcuffs having just escaped from the metropolitan police robbery squad. He asked an undercover policeman to saw them off for him.

The guests were then ushered into a room where they were introduced to helmeted police wearing flak jackets who advised them of their rights, placed them under arrest and herded them into rented trucks for a ride to the police station.

"They were stunned," said Police Lt. Robert Arscott. "They went into an abrupt shock."

Silbert told reporters that the stolen goods were kept with P.F.F. Inc., a warehouse in northeast Washington.

The warehouse was secretly operated by District of Columbia police and FBI agents acting as out-of-town crime syndicate members. The name, "P.F.F. Inc." came from "Police-FBI Fencing Inc.," although none of its patrons were so advised, Silbert

Each transaction in the warehouse was videotaped and recorded, Silbert

The arrests at the party were followed by other arrests in the Washington area over the weekend. In addition, police said they were seeking additional suspects.



# Economy cars halting highway construction

DALLAS (AP)-Economy cars are saving gasoline and motorist dollars.

But the "economy" of it all is wrecking Texas' highway construction program and has caused the layoff of 1,900 construction workers. More layoffs are planned.

"The highhway department definitely needs more revenue but all we can say right now is we're going to look at all possible sources of money," says Wade Lorenz, chairman of the Texas Good Roads Associa-

In Texas, gasoline taxes pay for most of the construction and maintenance of the millions of miles of highways in the state. As motorists burn less fuel in their gas-saving cars, they pay less in fuel taxes.

And therein lies the rub. With tax income down, and costs going up, the state Department of Highway Public Transportation is virtually destitute, struggling to meet day-to-day expenses and desperately seeking ways to carry out an \$11 billion highway program schedueld for the next 20 years.

The department has since last Septemeber laid off 1,900 employes and predicts another 20 per cent cut-

Additionally, major highway projects have been shelved.

One possible source of additional revenne could come in the form of a gasoline tax hike-the first since 1955. "We've got everything on hold. We're only contracting as money becomes available," said Marcus Yancey, state assistant director.

"What we're going to have to do obviously is to downscale some of the facilities to lower the standards of design. It's better to build a two-lane road from Austin to Dallas than build a four-lane roadway

The highway department has committed itself to an \$11 billion building program between now and 1995 but has only \$1.9 billion in known available revenue to do the job.

Other alternatives could include increasing the motor vehicle registration fee or turning back to the highway department funds now used to support the

Department of Public Safety. That was an option recommended last week by Gov. Dolph Briscoe, who conceded that the highway



The Saints had fought off financial ruin since December, but withered into nonexistence Saturday noon. The players, seeing no chance of the club's survival, voted not to go to Cincinnati for a scheduled Saturday night game. Saints President Wayne Belisle

then gave all players their unconditional releases, making them free

"Their contracts have been breached," said Belisle, anttorney. "If the league wants to claim them, they'll have to pay their back salaries."

But the World Hockey Associ-ation league office doesn't see things that way. A WHA spokesman said the Saints franchise had "temporarily suspended" operations and had not

Players were told there would be a dispersal draft, said defenseman John Arbour, who said he was 'waiting for the ax to fall.' But Keith Hanzel, attorney

players Bill Butters and Pat Westrum, told The Associated Press he would file suit to ensure his clients free agent status.

"Take Billy Butters," Hanzel said. "He's a good player and probably would go high in a dispersal draft. But that would mean a team low in the standings would draft him, and he could negotiate only with that club. He'd go from a contender to a nobody with no chance to do anything else."

Hanzel said National Hockey League President Clarence Campbell had told NHL general managers to leave Saints players alone until they had been waived through the WHA.

"This is a case of antitrust violations," Hanzel said. "I'll sue both leagues if I have to.'

Officials of both the NHL and WHA could not be reached Sunday for comment on Hanzel's charges.

The Saints first missed a payroll Dec. 31 and the players voted to keep skating in hopes that a franchisesaving deal could be worked out. Payrolls due Feb. 15 and Feb. 28 also were missed, and last-minute attempts to salvage the club failed.

# Nicklaus, Snead share time machine replay

LAUDERHILL, Fla. (AP) - It looks like a replay.

"I think we're lost in a time machine," one tour official said. The third Tournament Players Golf Championship appears to be a duplicate of the first one

J.C. Snead and Jack Nicklaus are fighting for the title-just as they did in 1974. There's been rain, storms and muggy heat-just as there was in 1974. And, just as in 1974, the championship of the touring players is ending a day late.

But there are differences. In Atlanta in 1974, the rangy Snead ranked among the game's long hitters. Now, suddenly, mysteriously, he's lost 40 yards off the tee.

"I don't know what the trouble is," he said, a puzzled look on his face. "If I knew, I'd correct it.

"But I'm hitting my irons the best of my life. If I can just get it someplace that I can put some iron on

He hit irons six feet or closer to the cup on six holes Sunday on his way to a 68 that gave him a share of the top spot with Nicklaus at 204, 12 under par on the 7,128-yard Inverrary Country Club course, a layout still partially flooded from the rains and storms that washed out Saturdays play. Nicklaus, who beat Snead in that

1974 showdown for the title in this ambitious event, pulled his game together just at the close of Sunday's action and salvaged a 68 with some brilliant putting.

"I wasn't as sharp as I could be." admitted Nicklaus, who has had his problems in late rounds this season, 'but somehow I managed to get it in the hole when I needed to.

The most critical example came on the 15th hole. Nicklaus appeared to be struggling. He'd just bogeyed the 14th. He was falling back in the pack.

He got it in casual water off the green in two on the par-five hole and dropped the ball for the fifth time of the day. And then, from 40 feet out, he chipped it in for an eagle three that put him back in the race.

His 20-foot birdie putt on the 17th gave him a share of the top spot, just one stroke in front of a couple of tour newcomers, Roger Maltbie and Mark Hayes, tied at 205. Maltbie, the 1975 rookie of the year, shot a blistering, seven under-par 65 and the 26-yearold Hayes had a 67.

British Open champion Tom Watson was at 207 after a 70. Don January, the 46-year-old veteran who led at the end of two rounds, slipped to a 73 and a tie at 208 with Hale Irwin. Irwin shot a 70 despite a double bogey.

# Training camps remain closed on opening date

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. (AP) Baseball marked its traditional openng of spring training today with owners and players sitting around a bargaining table here and all but one training camp completely closed.

Major league heirarchy agreed to keep camps closed while negotiations are under way with the Players Association on the reserve clause, which binds players to teams for life unless traded, sold or released.

Only Bill Veeck has opposed the plan to keep camps closed, opening his Chicago White Sox camp in Sarasota to 25 non-roster players.

Veeck would like to go farther and have his entire roster in camp, but faces the prospect of retaliatory action from the American League.

"This is as far as I can go," Veeck said Sunday night. "To do anything else would be subjected to who knows what unknown terrors.'

# Fighting Saints fold; squad refuses game

ST. PAUL, Minn. (AP) - The Minnesota Fighting Saints' winter of discontent finally has ended, but tte future of the folded franchise's players remains in doubt.

The Saints had fought off financial ruin since December, but withered into nonexistence Saturday noon. The players, seeing no chance of the club's survival, voted not to go to Cincinnati for a scheduled Saturday night game. Saints President Wayne Belisle

then gave all players their unconditional releases, making them free "Their contracts have been breached," said Belisle, anttorney. "If the

league wants to claim them, they'll have to pay their back salaries." But the World Hockey Associ-ation league office doesn't see things that

way. A WHA spokesman said the Saints franchise had "temporarily suspended" operations and had not Players were told there would be a

dispersal draft, said defenseman John Arbour, who said he was "waiting for the ax to fall." But Keith Hanzel, attorney for

players Bill Butters and Pat Westrum, told The Associated Press he would file suit to ensure his clients free agent status.

"Take Billy Butters," Hanzel said. "He's a good player and probably would go high in a dispersal draft. But that would mean a team low in the standings would draft him, and he could negotiate only with that club. He'd go from a contender to a nobody with no chance to do anything else.'

Hanzel said National Hockey League President Clarence Campbell had told NHL general managers to leave Saints players alone until they had been waived through the WHA.

"This is a case of antitrust violations," Hanzel said. "I'll sue both leagues if I have to."

Officials of both the NHL and WHA could not be reached Sunday for comment on Hanzel's charges.

The Saints first missed a payroll Dec. 31 and the players voted to keep skating in hopes that a franchisesaving deal could be worked out. Payrolls due Feb. 15 and Feb. 28 also were missed, and last-minute attempts to salvage the club failed.



# Record \$2.65 billion budgeted by industry

industry has budgeted a recored \$26.5 billion for 1976 domestic capital spending despite serious economic setbacks last year.

The budget represents a slight increase from the estimated \$26.4 billion spent in 1975, the Oil and Gas Journal reports. But it is 22.9 per cent higher than the \$21.5 billion outlay in

The Journal estimates 62 per cent of the 1976 budget will go for exploration-production activity. Reduced spending, however, is due for petrochemical projects, refinery expansion and marketing. Transportation spending will level off.

Many respondents to the Journal's annual capital-spending survey caution their 1976 budgets will be monitored more closely. Both major companies and independe-ts say budgets could be changed if adverse cash-flor or profits trends develop.

The U.S. budget comes as a surprise in view of the 25 per cent decline in 1975 profits, the Journal says. The industry sustained setbacks from the loss of percentage depletion, the crude-oil-price rollback, and continuing uncertainty over possible further harmful federal actions.

One explantion for the higher-thanexpected budget is that projects undertaken during 1974's betterprofits picture are included. Another factor is the trend to restrict foreign spending in favor of more stable domestic investments.

U.S. drilling expenditures should be about one per cent this year to \$8.48 billion, the Journal says. This money will drill a total number of wells slightly ahead the 38,900 drilled in

# **ENERGY**

Industry's three-year trend to boost production will continue in 1976. Such spending includes workover of old wells to boost output, new recovery projects, and heavy investment in offshore production facilities. Production spending soared 105 per cent last year from \$2.1 billion in 1974 to \$4.37 billion. It is expected to jump to \$6.67 billion this year, the Journal

An area of spending uncertainty this year involves lease bonuses for offshore acreage. Companies spent only \$1.08 billion last year at federal sales. This was a 78 per cent drop from the more than \$5 billion spent in 1974. One major says the decline probably reflects growing industry caution toward high spending in highrisk areas coupled with a shortage of funds. Spending in 1976 is expected to total about \$1.25 billion.

Reduced spending is the general trend for other areas of the industry.





\$2 bill making return

The shiny new Bicentennial coins jingling in our pockets are about to be joined there by an old bill with a new

On April 23 the \$2 bill returns after an absence of 10 years. Like the Bicentennial coins, it, too, will be just in time for the nation's 200th birthday celebration.

The new bill will carry the Gilbert Stuart portrait of Thomas Jefferson that was on the \$2 bill which was taken out of circulation back in 1966. But the reverse side will show a reproduction of John Trumbull's painting of the signing of the Declaration of Independence instead of Jefferson's home at Monticello.

The old \$2 bill was discontinued simply because the public wouldn't use it. It had a superstitious stigma attached to it and was often considered a bad luck omen.

But things can change in 10 years. For one thing, inflation is a factor which may make the \$2 bill more attractive. Since fewer and fewer items can be bought for less than a dollar, there would seem to be a need for a new bill with a higher value.

At the very least, it is expected to save the Bureau of Printing and Engraving a bundle of \$1 bills in printing costs over the next five years - an estimated \$27 million of them, in

Over the next five years it is expected to replace at least half of the \$1 bills now in circulation and that is where the savings comes in. It costs the government just as

much to print a \$1 bill as it does a \$2 or a \$20 or any other denomination, so printing costs will drop sharply. Now there is also speculation that

the \$1 bill might be discontinued altogether, to be replaced by a coin of the dollar denomination.

But for that to work effectively the public would first have to "take" to the dollar coin now available. But the Ike dollar gets little use today and is seldom used as change. Its size is the deterrent. For that matter, the half dollar, too, sees little circulation because it is too large to carry around in any great quantity. (I'm not sure they make pants pockets equipped to hold many of the bigger, heavy coins).

What may be necessary if the government is to do away with the dollar bill altogether is to make today's present coins smaller - from the cent on up.

For the public to circulate dollar and half-dollar coins as intended, they are going to have to be considerably

In fact even our largest coin may not circulate freely unless it is close to the size of today's most prominently used coin - the Washington quarter.






