
These two boys won this trip for outstanding 4-H Club work done in the county. They have been top contenders in the county show rings and in accomplishments in their 4-H demonstrations.







Fried Chicken For Next Winter

Fried chicken can be a year round food for the family table if some of them are saved for the freezer locker, Gwendolyne Jones, food preservation specialist for the A. and M. Extension Service, suggests.

She says the young pirds are best for fried chicken and getting them ready for freezing is the same as for eating. But, it is easy to pick the chicken if it's dipped into a semiscalding water for half a minute. This means the water should be about 128 degrees.

Suggestions on freezing include cutting up the chicken into pieces exactly as you would cut them for frying. The next step is to cool the pieces and pack into moisture, vapor-proof containers or wrapping paper. Put the amount needed for each meal into a package. Make the chage as air-tight as noss Freeze quickly, and store at zero degrees or lower. If the home freezer is used, the chicken may be killed in the afternoon and frozen that night. If a commercial freezer locker is used, the chicken may be killed in the morning, and taken to the locker early in the afternoon.





In Selecting Textiles difference, just the right shade or intensity can add much to a woman's appearance, even to her morale.

Such factors as these are what make it important for the shopper to be familiar with all the aspects of colorfastness, according to extension clothing specialists. Fast color means different things for different fibers and uses. Some articles need to be fast only to light, others to both light and washing and still

others to perspiration. Wool clothing usually does not need to be fast to washing, since it ordinarily is dry-cleaned. However, the shoulders and sleeves of such woolen garments as coats and jack-ets are exposed to a great deal of sun during their lifetime, and the fabric therefore should be reasonably fast to light.

Certain colors in acetate rayons are susceptible to an entirely dif-ferent type of fading. This is called atmospheric fading. A bit of sul-phur in the air or even in the paper wrapping on a stored garment may cause the dye used on an acetate rayon fabric to change color. Only acetate fabrics dyed in colors containing blue-blue, violet, green and sometimes brown or gray-are affected. A finishing process has been developed which makes these colors resist the action of atmospheric gases. Viscose rayons are not susceptible to atmospheric fading. They can be dyed with the same chemicals that are used on cotton, and these are unaffected by the atmosphere.

Temperature and Air in **Trailers Now Controlled**

With trailer production mounting to 100,000 a year, rapid progress is being made in development of both mechanical refrigerators and air conditioners especially adapted to trailer use, it is reported by Refrig-eration Equipment Manufacturers association.

Already on the market are small-sized mechanical refrigerators specifically for trailer use. Some of them are built for hook-ups to electric power lines in trailer camps or wherever there is an available supply of electricity. Others, however, are operated by bottled gas or kerosene, and trailer owners are beginning to use small gasoline generators which provide electricity for refrigerator as well as lights. Such units make possible constant refrigeration in the trailer, no matter where the owner cares to travel. Improved insulation in the new trailers is making air conditioning more and more feasible, according refrigeration manufacturers. who are cooperating with the trailer industry in developing suitable structural designs in the trailers and in adapting the new "packaged" home air conditioners to trailer applications. Plans for custom-built trailers already provide for special air conditioning equipment.





Asbestos-A Mineral Asbestos is seemingly as common

as clay because of its popularity since the 5th century B. C. as the master of fire, but few people even know what it is. Many, for instance, think it's a plant, or that it grows on trees, or on bushes like cotton-or is sheared from animals. Teachers' Qualifications

Not so many years ago the schoolteacher was hired from among those persons interested enough and willing to "keep school." A bit of learn-ing might have been considered helpful, but was not essential. Some times an older sister or brother became the teacher for the younger children in the family and neighborhood. Slow but steady growth toward professionalization has changed all this. Today admission to the teaching profession is regulated by law, and schoolboards are prohibited by law from employing unqualified teachers. A teacher is "qualified" under the law when he has been certified. Before he is eligible for a certificate to teach, he must meet certain educational standards and possess certain personal characteristics.



Bacteria as Plant Food Increases Grain Yield

The use of bacteria as food for plants is the basis of a new preparation known as phosphorobacteria, developed at Leningrad institute. Each gram of the preparation con-tains up to 200 million specially cultivated bacteria, which on reaching the soil transform complex organic matter containing phosphorus into soluble salts from which the plant can draw nourishment. The bacteria increased crop yields.

II. An Illustration of Indolence and a Lesson in Prudence (Prov. 24:30-

IT IS striking that the Word of God presents the ant as the illustration of prudence, but when it comes to an illustration of indolence it directs our attention to man.

The illustration is that of the man who is lazy, who is void of under-standing. The Preacher visits him. Going to his field and vineyard, he finds it grown over with thorns, covered with vetches, and the stone wall broken down.

Instead of citing the particular lessons learned, the Preacher simply observes that he looked on. thought deeply, and received instruction. Perhaps the best antidote to laziness is to see it in its inaction. The squalid conditions, the inability to cope with emergencies that we normally see in the life of the man who wants only ease are sufficient to warn most of us against it.

Entirely apart from the dignity of labor, the homely recompense of being able to meet our own needs is the compensation of selfrespect that initiative and resourcefulness bring. May we have a higher goal as we labor than merely providing for our own needs, though this is certainly important. Beyond it, of course, is the ability to help others also (cf. Eph. 4:28).


III. A God-Given Reward for Labor (Eccles. 5:12).


