

Santa To Arrive In Stratford By Plane At 2:00 P. M. Saturday

Old Santa himself, a quiet appearing chap in inconspicuous civilian clothes was in Stratford Thursday morning to announce that he would drop from the skies in a plane if weather conditions permit, to visit the children of Stratford's trade territory at 2:00 P. M. Saturday afternoon and distribute sacks of Christmas treats.

Santa was jubilant over his plans to returning to Stratford this year but was a little displeased over the manner in which gifts were distributed last year. As a matter of fact he plans an orderly distribution of gifts this year.

Last year he says that when the fire truck drove up to the Christmas tree many of the more active youngsters scampered on to the truck and took two or three sacks of candy while the more timid little boys and girls stood back patiently waiting for the distribution of gifts and just did not get any.

This year Santa has enrolled the assistance of the uniformed Boy Scouts of Troop 38. The scouts will assist in lining up the youngsters in four rows and gifts will be distributed from the fire truck but no children will be allowed on the truck as they were last year.

Santa believes he will have sufficient treats for every boy and girl who is present on the streets Saturday afternoon and will look with approval on their orderly conduct when directed by scouts to line up for the orderly distribution of gifts in this annual Christmas event.

Young Mullican lived here with his grandparents during the summer of '46 and was employed by his uncle, Grady Mullican, in the operation of Grady's Cafe. He was well known among the younger set who were shocked by his tragic and untimely passing.

Mullican's five companions have appeared before the county grand jury for their version of what took place on the fatal night and their stories have not been made public.

Stratford Health Clinic Starts Operation As A Modern Medical Unit

Veterans Open Cage Winning Streak

The American Legion sponsored Independent basketball team romped to another victory Monday night over the Texline club with a final score of 50 to 27. Since it was Texline which handed the Independents their only defeat of the season, the boys especially enjoyed this game. Sam Roach and Rod Ellison were high point men with 14 points each.

Last Thursday night the club trounced the team from Continental Carbon Company 60 to 25. Rod Ellison was the man with 24 points and Ross Wells trailed closely with 21.

The next scheduled league game will be played here with Sunray January 5. Other games have been matched and one will be played Saturday night, December 20, in the Cactus gymnasium. The Stratford Independent team is made up of a fine group of men who are playing better ball every game under the excellent guidance of Coach George Allen.

To date the Independent cage games have been free of admission.

The club has incurred some expense for league entrance fees, transportation, and needs some equipment, but with its policy of a free gate, has no form of income.

Promoted entirely as a recreation club for the entertainment of the general public, it will be necessary for the organization to ask for donations.

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Stratford's City Health Clinic which represents contributions of time and money from practically every resident of Stratford and Sherman County started operation this week as a recognized modern medical unit.

The reception room furniture was presented by the Stratford Lions Club.

Dr. Pearson has installed his office fixtures and a modern X-ray unit especially designed for diagnosing injuries but by split second timing may be used for diagnosing internal diseases.

The modern operating room has been furnished by the doctor and equipped for emergency operations and gas anaesthesia makes possible almost painless child birth.

The laboratory and linen room includes an electric autoclave for steam sterilization of medical instruments, surgical gloves, medical and surgical towels, gauze and bandages.

One patient room has been furnished by the doctor.

The Sherman County Farm Bureau has delivered a modern hospital bed to the room which it will also furnish with sick room furniture.

With erection of the X-ray equipment and laboratory units the City Health Clinic has started operating as a complete medical unit capable of offering medical care for sickness, accidents and injuries which may befall the citizens of this section.

Although the building and equipping of the modern medical unit does not bring back to Stratford the old doctor who in some unknown way toyed with a baton while the patient told their story and then gave a diagnosis in more serious cases which our modern clinics after days of scientific examination found to be true; it has brought to Stratford a young physician and surgeon who had he been hand picked would not have had more of the old doctors characteristics in the straight forward manner in which he deals with his patients.
