Of Edison Days By JEFF SOUTH Gwin Harris sat at a drafting table, still in his naval uniform. It was just after
World War I and the young ensign hadnt had time to don new clothes before reporting to his civilian job as a lab trainee in West Orange, N.J.
Five other engineers were busy at their desks, Harris recalls. In walked an eiderly gentleman. He stook by Harris' table, glanced at the employee's work
and then left the room. and then left the room
Harris nudged a colle herris nudged a colleague at the next desk. "Who was that fellow, the janitor? Edison". "erty not," replied his co-worker. "That was the Old Man himself - Mr Gaster Chander Harris was working in the personal laboratory of America's
master inventor. Thomas Alva Edison. Since that chance meeting in the draft ing room Harris had the fortune of assisting Edison for more than a decade un-
inf the Old Man s death in 1931 . Harris, now 83, today shared thoughts The Old Man, as Edison was affectionately dubbed. "affected your lives more than you would believe - not with just the things he invented himself, but with the e inventions that came from or were inspires dy his oun ideas," Harris said.
"Edison built the cery foundation, the basis for almost the entire industrial economy of America." he said.
It was Edison. Harris noted, who invented the phonograph, the telephone rransmitter, cyindrical records, storage battery, mimeograph machine, motion
pictures, incandescent lamp and techniques for generating electricity The inventor also discovered what is now called the "Edison effect," the fore-
runner of the radio tube. said Harris, one of the few remaining persons who wner of the radio tube said
