And so any catalogue of the really important brands of the West must eventually list the tallies of what has been called the "Mother of the British Companies"

Its history is wrapped up in three great brands—the LITs in Texas, the JJs in Colorado, and the Cross Ls of New Mexico. All were great outfits, but the two northern divisions were so extensive that they still stir the imagination of men. The story of the Cross Ls begins on the San Saba, in Texas, where three brothers-Nath, Jim and William Hall-had settled before the Civil War.

About 1870, they drove their brand up the Goodnight Trail, across the high ridges of northern New Mexico, and into the Cimarron Canyon to locate the Cross L. ranch thirty miles northeast of the malpais cone of Capulin, one hundred miles south of Las Animas, and sixty-five miles from dends had reduced their capital

Plains, lean and weathered Texans invariably drove and trading with the Ute Indians to keep them off their grass, they more than held their own until the boom in beef brought a flock of Britishers. Early in 1881 they sold their herds, their range rights, and their twelve room house to the Prairie Cattle Company, of Edinburgh, and struck a trot back to Texas.

> A really fantastic venture in high finance and short grass began in December, 1880, with the organization of the Prairie Company. In the years that followed its first plunge, the story became one of the most determined struggles to turn disaster into success that was ever burnt in brands.

> During the first three years its officials declared dividends of from twenty to thirty per cent, and its annually printed reports swept then conservative Britain off its feet as other investors rushed to put their funds into this bonanza built on bulls.

Some cattle herds were out when the worst storm struck, and Henry Miller, who lost three men, left the town of Folsom, against the advice of all, saying:

"I'm going to the herd, or to hell,

When they finally found him, Bob Haley, boss of a Cross L Wagon, out at the same time, says that "He was a-settin' down with his bridle reins on his arm-and that's the way they found him." Haley kept his cook up all night, held his herd in spite of it all, and pulled his men and cattle through. 'Awful hard" he said, "to freeze a man when he's full and working."

It was characteristic of those who made the West-of the waddies who worked the herds and pulled the Prairie through. Soon after 1900 the company showed its first genuine profit, and saved the reputation of the Scotch. And so, with success achieved, in 1903 it sold the Cross L outfit, retreated to the north, and wrote the final chapter to its sturdy story in the traceries of its cow trails, across e

Because both the farm-er and processor can deal in con-tracts for future delivery, they can protect themselves against severe price fluctuations through "hedging" and thus avoid the ex-tra costs of doing business which would be imposed otherwise for such protection. This advantage is passed along to the public through lowered food costs.



#### **TREATY: Finns-Russ**

Russia had what it wanted from Finland-a buffer state to the northwest.

The two nations signed a 10-year treaty of mutual assistance which binds Finland to fight within its own borders in the event either country is attacked

Finland and Russia, stated the Three Diseases Take pact, would battle side by side to repel aggression by Germany "or another state allied with" Germany. The treaty circumspectly failed to mention any other state by name. Despite the fact that Finland's

delegation virtually had been commanded to appear at Moscow to sign a treaty with Russia. Premier Josef Stalin beamed expansively after the agreement had been concluded, hailing it as a "treaty between equals." And he said:

"I would like to see us pass from a long period of mutual distrust against each other, to a new period in our relations-to a period of mutual trust." Actually, the Finns got a better

deal from Russia than they might have hoped for. Their nation had not been forced into a tight, arbitrary military accord with the Soviets, nor had Finland lost its sovereignty although it was brought firmly into the bloc of states along

Russia's exposed western flank. **ATOM BOMB:**

Federal Judge T. Alan Goldsborough to answer a contempt of court charge.

Lewis was cited for contempt by Goldsborough, his 1947 nemesis, on the grounds that he ignored an April 3 court order to call off the strike.

Apart from the contempt of court citation, settlement of the coal strike was distinguished mainly by a slightly marvelous amalgam of political action and expedient compromise

Beginning of the end came when Speaker of the House Joseph Martin (Rep., Mass.) moved into the dispute by persuading Lewis and Ezra Van Horn, a mine operator, to meet with him in his office. Martin then suggested that Sen. Styles Bridges (Rep., N.H.) be named the third member of the board which administers the miners' welfare and retirement fund. (Lewis and Van Horn are the other two members.)

At a subsequent meeting of the three, Bridges proposed a plan that would give \$100-a-month pensions to 62-year-old miners with 20 years of service who retired after May 28, 1946, the date on which the miners' welfare fund was set up. Bridges' plan was accepted and the strike called off.

Actually, Lewis, in approving the New Hampshire senator's proposal, had descended several notches from his original demands.

Politically, the most fascinating aspect of the affair was how Joe Martin managed to take the play away from the administration in arranging for a settlement.

#### **EDUCATION:**

Nearly half of the 5,245,000 World War II veterans who entered special education and training programs under the G.I. bill of rights have abandoned their courses, Veterans' administration says.

More than 400,000 completed their work, however-382,000 of them under the G.I. bill and the rest under the rehabilitation program for disabled veterans. Many of those that quit plan to return later, it was indicated






