
News of the Sick

Legend Surrounds Highest Navigable Lake in World

Lake Titicaca in Peru is the highest navigable lake in the world. Because horse eyes are not suited for close binocular vision, says the Better Vision institute. The lens in the eye of a horse is relatively large, and the ciliary muscle is weak, unable to bring about accommodation of the lens for near and far vision. Also, the eye muscles are unable to converge the two eyes for close focusing. Accordingly, the horse sees objects at a distance binocularly (with two eyes), but must use one eye for focusing objects close by. To overcome the lack of flexibility of the lens, the retina of a horse's eye slants from the visual axis, like a tilted egg. The principle of this arrangement is similar to that seen in slanting a camera in photographing a tall building so as to get near and far points into focus on the plate.

Plant Food

To assure adequate supply of food in the soil, house plants should be fed with complete plant food. For your convenience, it's available in tablet form, thus avoiding all mixing and muss. These complete plant food tablets supply house plants with all the elements they need for best growth. Plants should be fed at the rate of 2 tablets for a 6-inch pot. For plants in 10-inch pots use 4 tablets. Vary the number of tablets proportionately for plants in larger or smaller pots. Always place the tablets along the edge of the pot, about an inch away from the rim. Space them about 6 inches apart. Make holes about 1 inch deep and drop the tablets in these holes, then cover with soil and water thoroughly. Application should be made approximately every 4 weeks during the growing period.

FIRST AID to the AILING HOUSE

by Roger C. Whitman

QUESTION: Is there anything that I could use to fill rather wide cracks which have appeared between baseboard and moulding?

ANSWER: That joint can be closed with a form of moulding called quarter-round. This should be attached not to the baseboard or flooring, but by long nails passing at an angle through the opening between baseboard and flooring and into the timber behind. There will be continual movement in the flooring and baseboard through the seasons, and secured in this manner the joint will remain covered.

QUESTION: Can linoleum be painted?

ANSWER: Worn linoleum can be painted with any good brand of floor paint or deck enamel, but there is no special kind of paint made for that purpose. For best results all traces of wax should be removed from the linoleum. A stripped effect in two colors (two shades of tan are practical) will show dirt less than one solid color.

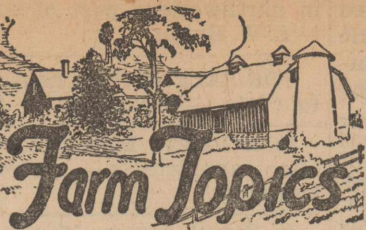

New Strain of Corn Withstands Drouth

Guatemala Crossbreed Also Resists Root Rot

Possibility of producing corn that would withstand root rot and other diseases as well as prolonged dry spells appealed to Earl E. May and Iowa State college officials.

Knowing that Guatemala had been producing corn for more than 2,000 years in an isolated region, which had resulted in a highly inbred strain which could withstand dry spells as well as certain diseases and pests, Iowa research workers collected

1,200 varieties of corn from Central America.

New Guatemala-U.S. crossbred corn has been tested at Ames, Iowa. The new corn outyielded three commonly used U.S. hybrids as much as 25 bushels to the acre. While the Midwest varieties withered and died during hot weather, the Guatemala-U.S. crossbreed remain in full ears. College officials believe that early results give promise of a new strain that will withstand long dry and hot spells in any part of the United States. James Moore, K.M.A. station, reports that work in Guatemala has proven entirely successful and he believes that the new corn soon will be grown on many farms in the United States.

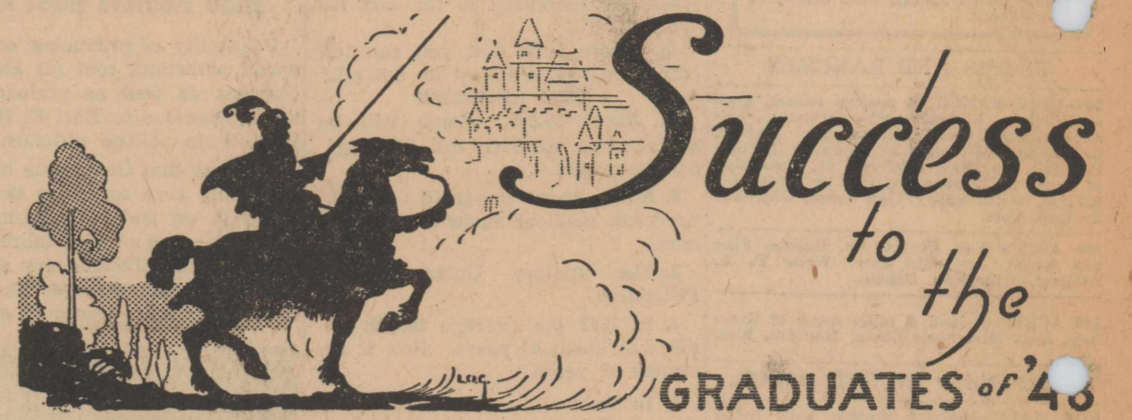
