ing Ing of all traffic rules to thy aver
age driver are those relating to age driver are those relating to
"Right of Way" at an intersection.
In trying to understand the In trying to understand the laws
regulating intersectiing trafic, it is
best to start off with the premise best to start off with the premise
that all strees a are of equal dignity,
legally speaking. Traffic signs and legally speaking. Traffic signs and
signals may vary this rule somewhat,
but when in doubt it is safest to as but when in doubt it is safest to as-
sume that all drivers crossing your
path have a claim to the right of path have a claim to the right of
way equal to your own. Obviously, however, in many cas
es one driver or the other will b
legally entitled to the right of way
When it becomes necessary to deter legally entitled to the right of way.
When it becomes necessary to deter-
mine right of mine right of way in a particular
situation,the driver who reaches the intersection first, or who is going to get there first, is ordinarily fa-
vored. But when two automobiles are an
equal distance from the intersection that one approaching from the oth right o way.
"Some intersection are known a
"courtesy corners," having a sto courtesy corners," having a stop
sign or a flashing red signal facing each direction of approach. The first
driver reaching the corner and driver reaching the corner and ocom-
ing to a complete stop will nomally
hay $\left(\begin{array}{l}\text { ing to a complete stop will nomally } \\ \text { have the right of way over other } \\ \text { wehicles not alreat }\end{array}\right.$ vehicles not already in the intersec-
tion. However, don't depend too much on the other fellow's courtesy,
and be sure to keep a "proper lookand be sure to keep a "proper look-
out" and your car under "proper

At intersections involving one

a stop sign, a driver approaching a stop sign, a driver approaching

stop is ordinarily said to have the
right of way over vehicles approach stop is ordinarily said to have the

ing on the through street but not aiing on the through street but not ai-
ready in the intersection.

However, this last rule must be qualified by saying that you should not proceed, cross or turn onto the
through street until you can do $\left\lvert\, \begin{aligned} & \text { through street until you can do so } \\ & \text { without interfering with oncoming }\end{aligned}\right.$ traffic. In other words, if an approaching car will arrive within the
intersection before you are comintersection before you are com-
pletely clear, wait just a little longer. The same rules apply to enter ing a highway from a side road con-
taining a stop sign. taining a stop sign
Many drivers
Many drivers violate the rules of
right of way covering left-hand turns at intersections. When turn ing left, you should always be on the inside (or center) lane, display
ing the proper hand signal You ing the proper hand signal. You msut
allow all cars coming from the oppo allow all cars coming from the oppo
site direction, already in the inter section, to pass through before com
pleting your turn. Even when the in pleting your turn. Even when the in-
tersection is clear tersection is clear, do not proceed
unless other oncoming traffic is far unless other oncoming traffic is fa
enough away to be able to see you signal and slow down to allow you
to turn with safety to all to turn with safety to all concerned.
