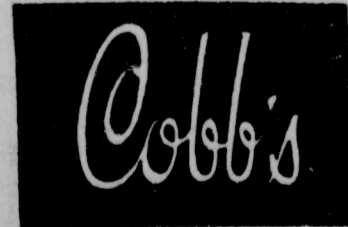

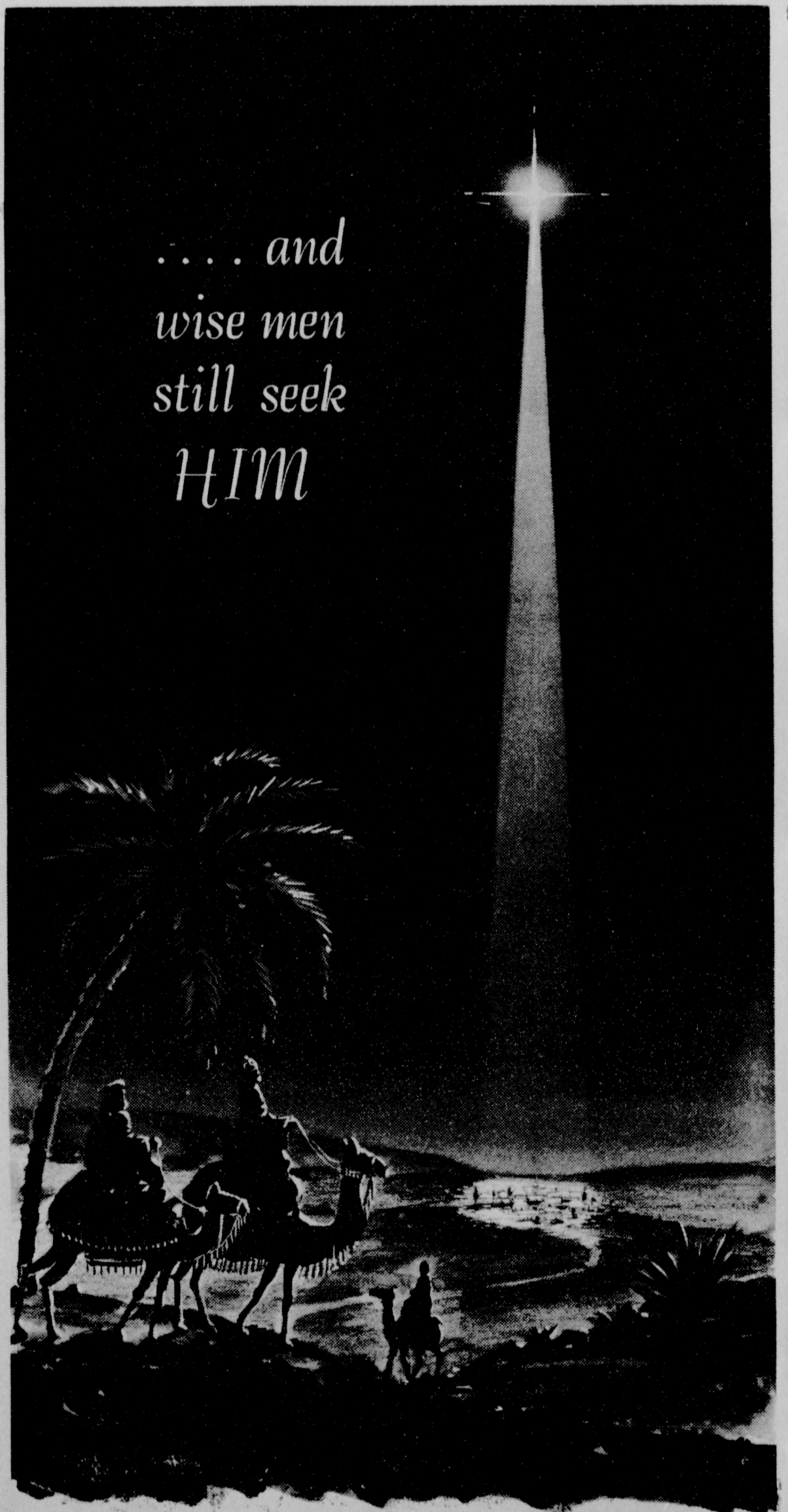

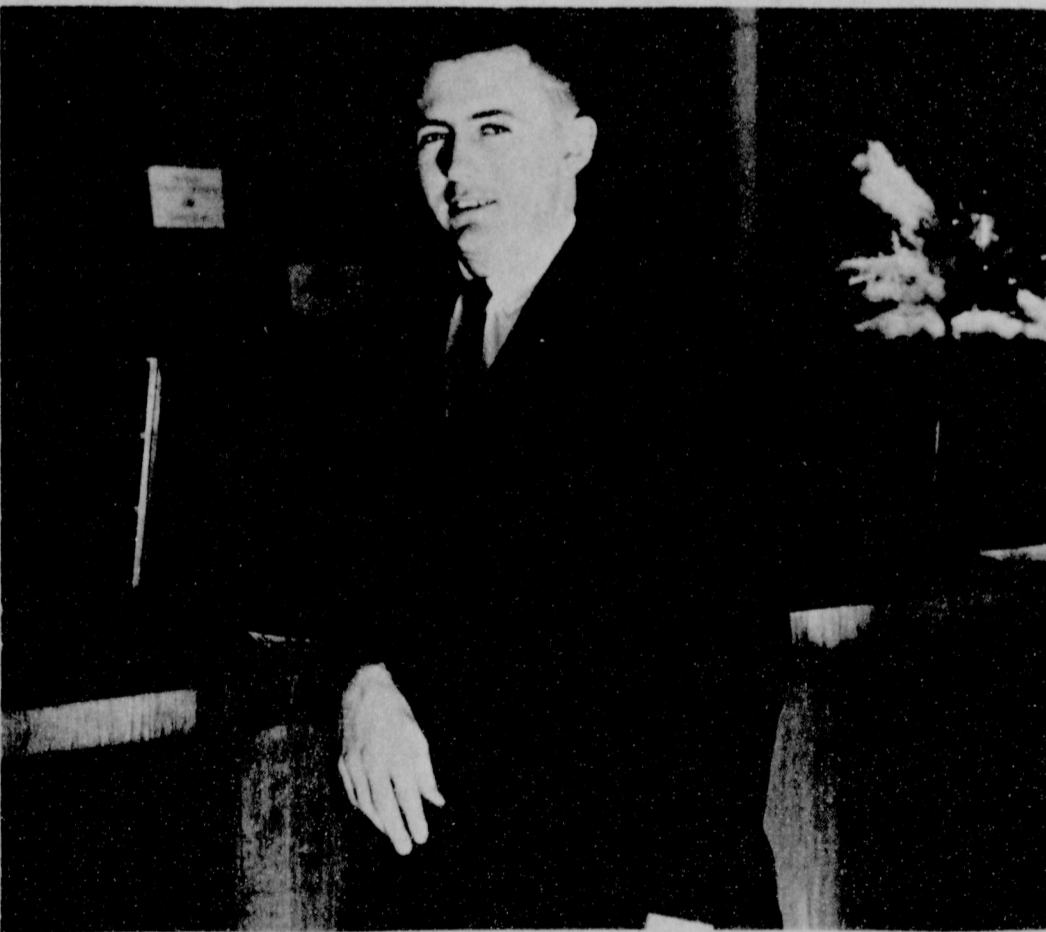
2 & 1/2 cups flour
3/4 teaspoon salt
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 & 1/2 teaspoon sugar
2 eggs
2 & 1/2 cups milk
3/4 cups melted shortening or cooking oil.

METHOD:
Beat eggs and milk together then add melted shortening or cooking oil. Sift together dry ingredients and stir into egg and milk mixture. Bake on hot waffle iron until golden brown. Makes delicious pancakes by using only 1/2 cup of shortening. May be made and stored in refrigerator over night.

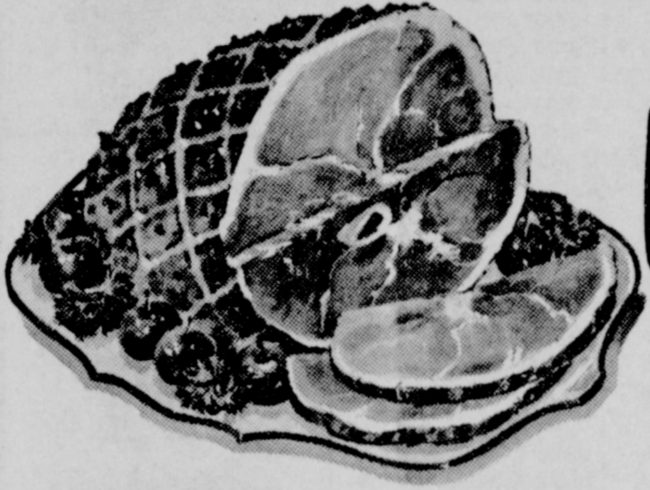

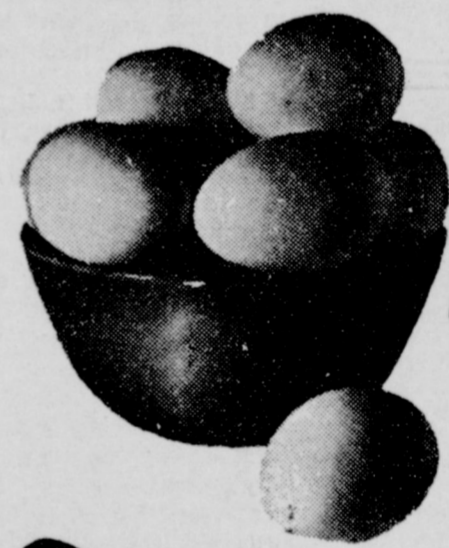
