## Memphis ends

(AP) - Police and fire union leaders said today they had accepted a tentative agreement to end a strike that has kept Memphis clamped under a curfew for a week. <br> The agreement, worked out with the Chamber of Commerce which has still was subject to approval by city officials and the unions' rank-andfile. <br> David Baker, president of the Memphis Políce Association, and 1784 of the International Association of Firefighters, said their members would vote on the proposals today <br> Tommy Powell, president of the 60,000-member Memphis AFL-CIO president of the Chamber of Commerce, had given word of the tentative pact earlier. <br> Terms of the contract were not | immediately disclosed. <br> A federal mediator, Ed McMahon of the Federal Mediation and Concilinegotiations that had continued uninterrupted through the night. <br> One of the last stumbling blocks was the length of the contract. Mayor Wyeth Chandler said earlier the city had made curee separate ofertlement would involve a two-year contract.
