

Green Thumb Workers Trained To Deal With Alcoholism

Former Congressman Wilbur Mills, Doc Severinson of the "Tonight Show", and Ralph Waite of "The Waltons" all have at least two things in common: they used to suffer from alcoholism, and they now have much better lives after coming to grips with the disease.

The stories of these prominent people were part of the information provided to more than 60 Green Thumb workers attending a special alcoholism training session at the Senior Center in Fisher County on May 16, 1983.

Green Thumb amploys, about 1,000 persons aged 35 and over in community service projects across the state.

In a film entitled "They Do Recover," Waite, Mills, and Severinson discussed the development of their alcohol problems

and the paths they followed to find relief.

"The fact that these well-known people are alcoholics helps to show the disease--- and alcoholism is a disease--- can strike anyone, rich or poor, lonely or in the spotlight," said Green Thumb district director Susan Armstrong, who conducted the training.

"Mills and Severinson suffered from severe blackouts, and Mills was afraid he had a brain tumor until examinations revealed his problem was alcoholism," she said.

demonstrate that alcohol will only
make any existing problems
worse."

She said some of Green Thumb's enrollees have lost their jobs because of drinking, and for these people the future is dim. "They've lost their income and their self-respect, and few of them will have the resilience and energy to fight back. Prevention, whether you're young or old, is the best answer."

The Green Thumbers also heard a program update from state director Diane Parrish of Waco.

County Towns Receive Sales Tax Checks

State Comptroller Bob Bullock today sent checks totaling \$94.5 million in local sales tax payments to 974 cities that levy the one-percent sales tax

one-percent sales tax.

The City of Robert Lee received \$5,435.96 payment for this period, a slight increase from the 1982 payment of \$5,084.30. The 1983 total payment to date is \$15,747.64 down from 1982 payments to date of \$17,103.95.

The City of Bronte received \$2,746.29 for the present period, down from last year's payment to date of \$3,871.56. Total payments for 1983 to date is \$8,785.80 down from 1982 payments to date, \$11,497.18.

The City sales tax is collected along with the state sales tax by merchants and rebated monthly to the cities in which they are collected by the Comptroller.

The May checks were for taxes collected on sales made in March and reported to the Comptroller by the end of April.

WTU Taking **Tougher Stand** On Theft

Electric Utilities in Texas, including West Texas Utilities Co., are taking a tougher stance these days on theft of electricity.

Reasons for the crackdown are a change in the State Penal Code making meter tampering a penitentiary offense and the fact that the cost of producing electric energy has gone up.

"We view any form of stealing electric power as a serious crime," said Don Welch of Abilene, WTU vice president and director of customer services, "because we feel a strong responsibility to protect the interest of our good paying customers."

"It costs money to produce electricity," Welch said. "If one customer manages to get some of it free, the other customers have to make up the difference."

The State Legislature amended the criminal mischief statute in 1981 to make diversion of any utility service a third degree felony with a possible punish-ment of a maximum fine of \$5,000 and from two to ten years in prison. The law also allows authorities to make the assumption that the person in whose name the service was last billed is the responsible party.

Convictions have been obtained in several Texas cities since the law was passed, and WTU recently filed charges which resulted in a felony indictment being issued against a customer.

Welch said that meter tampering not only is a serious crime which is becoming more easy to detect, but that it is extremely dangerous.

"Many people do not understand the danger involved," he said. "property damage, serious injury. or even death can result."


