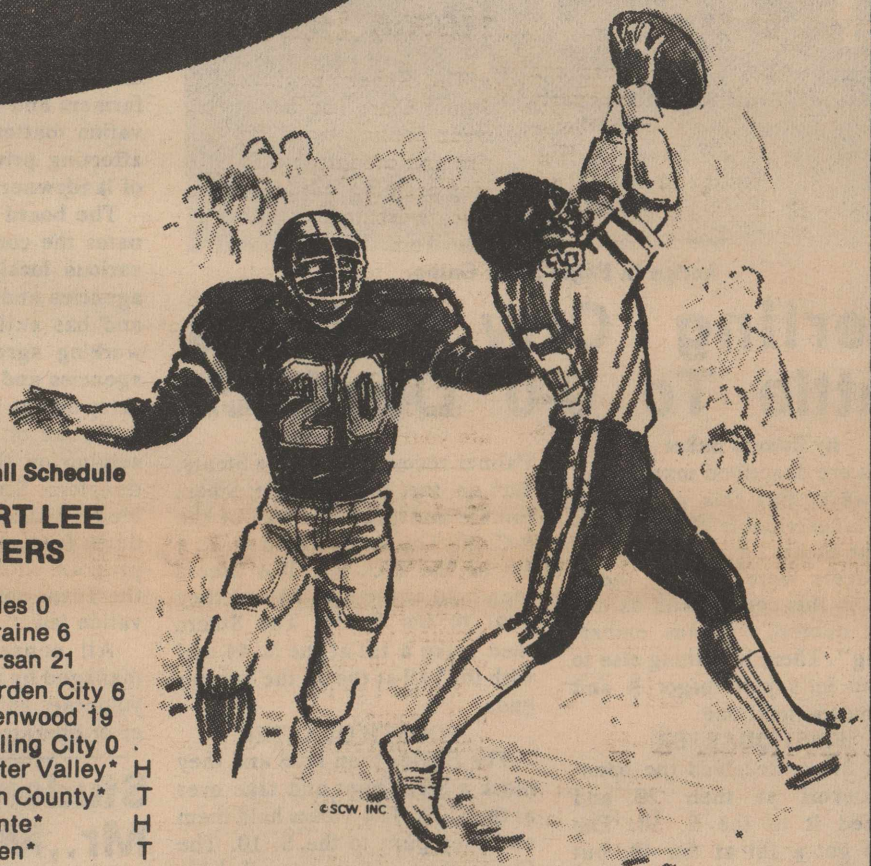

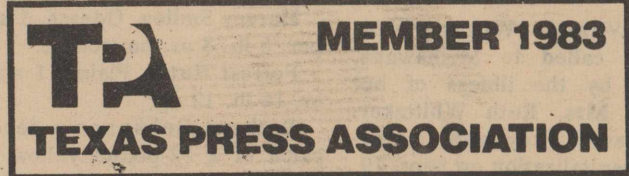

AGRICULTURE

With the lack of available pasture and projected high feed cost this winter, producers with a supply of hay might consider hay ammoniation. This process has been tested in this area and is gaining in popularity.

Ammoniation of hay breaks down the fibrous cellular wall and makes the hay more readily digestible plus increasing the nitrogen protein content. In several tests conducted in this area, protein has been increased from 4-6% up to as much as 10-12%. Ammoniation works extremely well on older hay stacks that have lost a lot of their original protein.

General guidelines for ammoniation are:

1. Do not stack bales very high or wide so ammonia can penetrate the stack.
2. Cover with 6 milliliters plastic and seal edges by covering with soil. Duct tape all seams and openings.
3. Inject ammonia under the plastic. Add a total of 2% of the

total weight of hay being treated.

4. Leave covered and sealed 2 weeks during warm weather and 4 weeks during cold weather.

5. Remove and feed as needed. Hay will be dark in color, but cattle will like it.

Producers interested in ammoniation can contact the County Extension Office for more details.

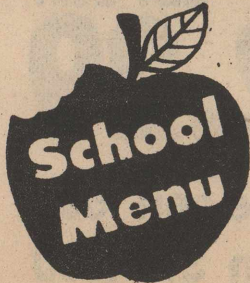

HOW LONG CAN FROZEN FOODS BE STORED?

As long as the temperature of a home freezer is held at zero or below, properly packaged foods will keep in excellent condition for months. However, each food has a storage life when it is best, after which the quality declines. After storage for too long a period, the food loses its flavor.

SAFE STORAGE PERIODS AT 0 DEGREES F

9-12 Months- All vegetables, all fruits (except citrus)

9 Months- Lamb, Veal, Game Animals, Eggs (processed), Beef (except ground beef), Poultry (except broilers), Butter, Cheddar Cheese, Cookies, Fruit Cake (baked)

6 Months- Game birds, Broilers, Turkeys, Ducks, Most fish, Poultry (Cut-Up), Unpeeled shrimp and oysters, Baked Bread and Rolls, Mushrooms

4 Months- Ground beef, Geese, Most Shellfish, Some fatty fish, Baked Pies, Beef Liver, Heart, Tongue, Thick cream, Pork (except ground pork), Baked Cakes and Cupcakes, Most cooked foods

2-3 Months- Citrus fruits, Ham (not sliced), Bacon (not sliced), Ground pork, Unbaked pies, Baked quick breads, Cooked shrimp (peeled), Packaged cut poultry

Less than 1 Month- Ice Cream, Sandwiches, Frosted Cakes, Left-over Foods, Chiffon Pies, Homogenized Milk, Unbaked Rolls, Brown 'n Serve Rolls, Cake Batters, Unbaked Yeast Dough, Unbaked Quick Breads

Keep this list posted by the freezer. Label items with the date placed in the freezer. Check the dates occasionally to make sure your meals will be flavorful.

Instead of reaching for the salt shaker, consumers are being urged to reach for their wallets to buy costlier salt substitutes. Salt substitutes may cost up to \$17 a pound, compared to 27 cents a pound for table salt, says Mary K. Sweeten, a foods and nutrition specialist with Texas A&M's Agricultural Extension Service. Most salt substitutes are simply potassium chloride, with added ingredients to improve its flavor, provide shelf stability, control acidity and perform other functions. "In the long run, it may be less expensive and safer for most people to cut down on salt without developing a need for salt substitutes," says the nutritionist. Simply putting the salt shaker away can cut the average person's salt consumption by 25 to 30 percent. Lemon juice, herbs and spices contain virtually no salt and also add flavor to food, notes the specialist.

To Engage in Weather Modification Operations Within the State of Texas
Prepared: September 19, 1983

NOTICE IF HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Colorado River Municipal Water District of P.O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79720, holder of Weather Modification License No. 83-1 of the State of Texas, has applied for a permit to engage in an operation to change or attempt to change by artificial methods the natural development of appropriate atmospheric cloud forms or precipitation forms which occur in the troposphere. An application has been filed with the Texas Department of Water Resources for consideration to conduct a weather modification operation to increase precipitation within the area described and by the method stated below:

1. The equipment, materials and methods to be used to conduct this operation include: a weather radar set, meteorological analysis information, a twin-engine aircraft, air-to-ground radio communications, and wing-mounted racks to hold silver iodide flares; a meteorologist directs the aircraft to a radar-selected cloud to begin cloud-seeding at cloud base to increase rainfall in the target area.

2. The area intended to be affected by the operation is the target area which is bounded by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, Texas and running along Highway 87 in a northwesterly direction to Lamesa, thence north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County, thence east along the northern boundary lines of Dawson, Borden, and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence south-southeast to Maryneal; thence southwest to Silver in Coke County; thence south-southwest to Highway 87 at a point approximately 13 miles northwest of Sterling City; thence northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas.

3. The area in which the equipment is to be operated includes the operational area and the target area. The operational area is the land-area between an outer boundary which is defined by a line that encompasses the block of counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Fisher, Nolan, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, Martin and Dawson, and an inner boundary which is that of the target area.

4. The persons approved by the Department to be in control and in charge of the operation are Ray Pat Jones and Owen H. Ivie, P.E.

5. The period of the operation is expected to be March 1

through November 30 during the years 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987.

6. The initial Texas Weather Modification License was issued to the Colorado River Municipal Water District Dec. 18, 1974, and has been renewed each year.

The Commission shall, if requested by at least 25 persons, hold a public hearing in the area where the operation is to be conducted prior to the issuance of the permit. No public hearing will be held on this application unless a request for a hearing is made within 20 days following the date of publication of the first of three consecutive weekly notices of intention to engage in weather modification operations.

Special Care For Iris Beds-- Early fall is the time for planting or renovating bearded iris beds, says a landscape horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. For existing beds, dig up and separate rhizomes and replant only those that are clean, strong and disease-free. Put new plantings in well-drained soil that is high in organic matter, spacing them 12 to 18 inches apart. Shallow planting is best, so place the rhizomes just below the soil surface. Cut back foliage by one-third when transplanting iris.
