Now, with a fine disregard of Swiss workmanship, the Soviets want to buy the machinery to make watches, but not many timepieces. In the first half of 1947, only 104 watches were sent to Russia. Early in 1948, an agreement was signed providing for the export of about \$750,000 worth of watches.



QUESTION: "When we moved into our apartment, we purchased from the previous tenant the inlaid linoleum on the kitchen floor. 
