



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE
LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Secton 1. That the Constitu-tion of the State of Texas be and the same is hereby amended, by adding a new Section to Article III of said Constitution to be designated Section 48-b, reading s follows:

"Section 48-b. The Legislature thall have the authority to provide for the organization county-city health units and the operation thereof and to authorize counties and cities to provide a tax of not to exceed twenty cents (20c) on the One Hundred Dollar (\$100) valuation of tax-able property in counties and cities for the purpose of financing the said county-city health units; provided that no such tax shall be authorized except by a vote of the people residing in the city or county in which said tax shall apply. British Dentists Pull Teeth, Fill Cavities by Stopwatch LONDON.-British dentists are

pulling teeth and filling cavities by the stop watch this week. The purpose is to determine how

much time they spend treating each patient and why dentists under the socialized health scheme are earning such high salaries.

It is a ministry of health experiment. Five hundred dentists working the health scheme are doing the timing. Another 50 dentists who practice privately are filling out the same questionnaires as a check. They were chosen at random.

Health Minister Aneurin Bevin's calculations on the costs of "free" dentistry were thrown completely out of line by the fat paychecks of the dentists. He therefore halved all gross payments over 4,800 pounds (\$19,200) a year "because of the urgency of the situation." Dentists admitted they were making more under the health scheme, but protested what they called an "arbitrary cut." They blamed Bevin's system of fees.

Bevin fixed the rates at 10 shillings (\$2) for an extraction, 20 shillings (\$4) for a simple filling and 30 shillings (\$6) for a more complicated filling. He figured dentists would work 33 chair side hours a week and, at these rates, earn a gross annual income of 3,800 pounds

(\$15,200). Many dentists, however, claim they can work much faster than Bevin calculated. The time check was designed to show whether

Bevin misfigured. "The high salaries now being earned may be due more to dentists having to work overtime because of the tremendous demand than to high rates," said E. D. Cox, secretary of the British Dental asso-

#### What Is Justice?

Lesson for September 4, 1949

EVERYBODY is in favor of justice but not everybody knows what justice is. Justice is more fundamental than democracy. If we believe that democracy is the best form of government, it is only because we believe that justice can be better secured in this way than in any other.

Justice is as old as God Since for at least 3,000 years historians, politicians, philosophers

and theologians have been wrangling over the meaning of justice, you won't learn the last word about it merely by studying one Sunday school lesson. But this is the and democracy as

Labor Day will recall the great services rendered to democracy by the organized workers of the world, for example, in the push they have given to free and universal education. But democracy is older than the labor movement, is older than July 4, 1776, is older than the Magna Charta, is older than the Roman empire, in which one of many mottoes was "Let justice be done even if the sky caves in!"

Justice and democracy go back to the ancient Hebrews, the people who wrote the Old Testament. It was written in their laws, preached by their prophets, sung in their called godly.

us some valuable light on what justice is. Some people think that if everybody were rich, that would be justice. Parker of the edible olive oil used in the United States from 1935 to 1939. be justice. Psalm 49 shows how foolish that notion is. It says in almost so many words, "You can't take it with you."

Riches do not spell happiness. mean making many people miserable. Money by itself does not cure the ills of life, it may make them worse or even create new ones. Many a family in the "upper brackets" has troubles that would vanish if they had less money.

Psalms 72 and 82 give us more positive suggestions. Psalm 72 sees it as the king's main duty to judge the people with righteousness and justice. The king was the government, in those days; he was the executive and the legislative and the judicial branch of government all rolled into one. In modern terms, the business of government is something more than furnishing police to lock up and punish wrongs after they have been done.

The welfare of the people is the concern of government. When public officials take any other view of their job, they are off the beam. In a democracy, the government is the people, that is to say, ourselves.

If things are bad we are to blame for it; if they are going to be any better, we shall have to work for it. Every appeal to a king, in the Old Testament, when translated into terms of a democratic country, means an appeal to the people.


The Little People

TUSTICE always has to be concerned with the little people. It was true in the simple little world of the ancient Hebrews, it is just as true in our global complex world, that the strong will always exploit the weak if there is not a hand to stop them. God is always for the "poor,"

the "children of the needy," and he is always against the "oppressor." In ancient Israel the oppressor was usually the big land-owner who treated his slaves with cruelty or underpaid his workers. Nowadays the oppressor is any exploiter, any man or group of men who will use power to squeeze out or crush down the little man. But justice is positive, not negative, prevention and not cure only.

Concern for social justice includes taking care of people laid low by an epidemic or made homeless by fires; but it goes far beyond this. It will mean working for conditions such that no one will be forced to live in unsanitary firetraps.



#### Tires 75,000 Miles Goal

CAMBRIDGE, MASS.-Motor car tires good for 75,000 miles may be expected on the market before long, Dr. Charles P. Fryling of the Phillips petrolcum company has reported.

Addressing the Northeastern section of the American Chemical Society at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Dr. Phillips said that further improvement in a new synthetic known as "cold rubber" would make the long-lived tires possible. He asserted that a production capacity of 200,000 tons of cold rubber would be available by the end of this year, enabling synthetic rubber to compete on favorable terms with the natural product.

In addition to making possible better rubber, Dr. Fryling said, the new process has reduced the cost of the synthetic product, since faster reactions with reduced overhead costs were now possible, and that fewer raw materials need be used.

#### Old Boy Scout Trick Works to Bring Back Man Dead 15 Minutes

LOS ANGELES .- Reid C. Lewis, 46, round-faced, slightly bald aircraft inspector, jokes about his return from the dead as the result of a doctor's recalling an old Boy Scout first aid trick.

"I thought the doctor was kidding when he first told me I'd been dead and brought back to life," Lewis said in his hospital bed. Lewis was brought back to life after he "died" on the operating table when undergoing minor surgery in the doctor's office.

The physician, who would not permit use of his name, said Lewis showed no signs of life for 15-minutes despite injections of a stimulant, coramine, directly into the heart and artificial respiration with pure oxygen pumped into the lungs.

"Then I recalled an old Boy Scout handbook first aid trick that said persons who had been drowned sometimes were brought back to life by breaking a bone," the doc-

#### South Declared in Need Of More Skilled Workers

NEW ORLEANS.—The South is in need of additional skilled labor for industrial expansion, delegates from 10 states were told at the first annual southern states apprenticeship conference here.

William F. Patterson, Washington, director of the U.S. labor department's bureau of apprenticeship, declared that if the industrial growth of the South continues. "There must be a great deal of punch put behind the apprenticeship program."

He said the skilled labor force of eight million in the United States was depleting itself by 5 per cent each year through the death of skilled laborers, retirement of others, and departure of some to other fields.

"The apprenticeship programs are feeding new men into the fields," Patterson added, "but there is not quite enough of them to retain the skilled labor force of the country."

He added that the unions are co-operating to build up the number of apprentices in each trade and the best job is being done by the building trades.

CARACAS.—In a triple crash recently in the municipality of Camunare, Urachiche district, Estado Yaracuy, a dog, a donkey, and an automobile got tangled up in such a fashion that the dog died beneath the hooves of the donkey, while the donkey died beneath the wheels of the car.

When the donkey passed the house where the dog lived, the dog ran out barking. The donkey took to its heels with the dog after it and arrived at a bend in the road at the entrance to the village just as a car approached round the bend. The donkey lashed out with its hind legs and struck the dog, killing it a second before the car, unable to pull up, struck the don-

key with its front wheels, killing it. The car was wrecked—its radiator smashed in, headlamps broken off, its mudguards snapped, and its bumper broken.

cians. In the past the only possible relief came from the manual turning of the patients, so as to relieve body pressure points on the mattress. With the shortage of nurses in many cases preventing proper attention to this detail, a mechanical solution to the problem which is plaguing hospitals all over the nation was sought.

Clinical tests have been made with the mattress since July, 1947, with very satisfactory results. Numerous patients, whose condition predisposed them to bedsores, have been placed on the mattress. Some were suffering from paraplegia, others had traumatic spinal lesions, others were recovering from fractures. Some could not be turned manually because of the traction employed in the treatment of their

In the group placed on the alternating pressure mattress no additional precautions were taken to prevent bedsores and none developed. Many patients with already developed bedsores have been placed on the mattress and their sores have healed well.

In addition to serving as an aid in the prevention and treatment of bedsores, the mattress reduces considerably the amount of nursing care required in these cases.







#### **Nichols Grow** Giant Squash

Another first for Texas is the squash vine which Rev. and Mrs. Nichols have in their back yard. The Nichols' were given the seed of the squash by Rev. Nichols' sister who lives in Ft. Worth. The seed was planted this spring in their back yard. The vine began to grow much as any other squash vine, except for the fact that it continued to grow, and is now a "Jack in the bean stalk" size. The squash vine is growing in a caliche soil.

The vine has two main runners which are thirty and forty feet in length. Most of the leaves of the plant are eighteen and twenty inches across. As the vine runs on the ground it roots at intervals. The squash are forty-five inches long, and are still growing. During the summer the vine grew as much as an inch a day.


