A reviewer of my "How To Measure a Rainbow" book once called me a capable "storyteller." Alas, that's far too grand a title for me, but one I'd love to deserve.

The man I'm thinking of is the real deal. Most of his stories have come to me via the written word, but on one occasion I listened to him in person.

For two hours Walter Wangerin, Jr., spoke, and it seemed like only minutes. I'd have gladly listened for many more hours as this amazing Christian man, a Lutheran pastor and writer and father, wove seamless stories of life

and faith. Therein lies much of the beauty of his stories, I think — that in them life and faith are so completely undivided, and every part of life itself, from the mundane to the sublime, is seen as a sacred and holy whole,

a gift from God. It's when we allow our lives to be cut up and divided — never more fatally than when we separate the "religious" part of our
