## PMC Decides

After preaching recently, I found myself doing just that. Most of the time, it's just mental, but some of my postsermon analysis this eek I did out loud.
My wise wife (most pastors' wives are wiser than most pastors) finally just smiled, "Okay, that's enough.

Second, the beautiful feast ("Thou preparest a table before me") is wonderful, but what we often miss is that the food on God's table tastes even better to the psalmist because his enemies are having to watch hungry while he eats ("in the presence of mine enemies").
I still have no doubt that's part of the picture. What I didn't say out loud, but what is obvious from our Lord's teaching, is that we should ask God to help us forgive our enemies (at least, for help to want to try) and not spend a

ot of time enjoying their "comeuppance" when it comes up. I should have said that.
Still, don't read what I just said here psalmist too much the not that nice. I like his hot that nice. I like his honesty, and I like it a lot. (If this psalmist is
indeed King David, it's indeed King David, it's
a lot less than rotten old a lot less than rotten old King Saul deserves if
he has to stand hungry and watch while David enjoys a good meal.)
I like very much the fact that the writers of the psalms tell us how they feel instead of how they ought to feel. We they ought to feel. W
can learn from that.
Ratherthanagonizing over how we ought to feel, we're better off just being honest with our ather about how we do feel.
Then we can ask him tohelpus act toward our enemies, and others, in he way he wants us to whether we feel like it or not.
Better that our cups runneth over" with a little genuine honesty than our buckets be full of pious sanctimony
