Bovina with a 19.24 percent Y-T-D increase takes second place, followed by Sudan with an 11.13 percent increase captured third. Littlefield's numbers show a 2.68 percent Y-T-D drop compared to last year's numbers, representing about $\$ 10,000$ less received, but continues to lead in actual dollars, followed by Muleshoe.
April's sales tax allocation reflect sales tax collected by local tax collected by local
