# Weather Whys: Advance Tornado Warnings

Q: How much advance warning time is there before a tornado hits?

A: New technology has improved advance warning times dramatically, says Brent McRoberts of Texas time? A&M University.

Weather Service says that in recent years, the McRoberts adds. amount of pre-warning time before a tornado hits has almost doubled," McRoberts explains.

"It is now as high as 11 to 15 minutes before it strikes. That's up from only 5-6 minutes in the 1980s. Also, there is now something called the Emergency Alert System used by many radio and TV stations. This system automatically takes control of a broadcast and advises listeners and viewers of an approaching tornado. When an alert is sent, a warning is automatically scrawled across your TV screen with a break in programming," he says.




