The most disturbing issue arising from last week's special meeting of the Muleshoe Area Hospital District wasn't the need for the hospital district and a couple of its physicians to reach an agreement, it was the "us and them" attitude that was readily apparent.
As individuals stepped forward to voice their opinion about the issue of the doctor's contracts, it was clear that for the most part the administration and employees of the hospital were at odds with the residents of Muleshoe and Bailey County.
At one point, one of the hospital employees even stood up and announced that she was glad she wasn't resident of Muleshoe while another employee - another non-county resident, questioned the intelligence level of this community.
