

Q. I tried to buy something and the clerk said they accept only cash or a credit card. Is it legal for a store to refuse to accept a check? I thought a check was just like cash?

A. When you buy something at a store, you are entering into a contract. You and the store determine the terms of that contract.

If the store wants to accept only cash or a credit card, it may do so. In fact, the only "legal tender" is cash.

Of course, you can offer to pay by a check and see if the store accepts your proposal. If it does not, your choice is to deal on the store's terms, or shop elsewhere.
