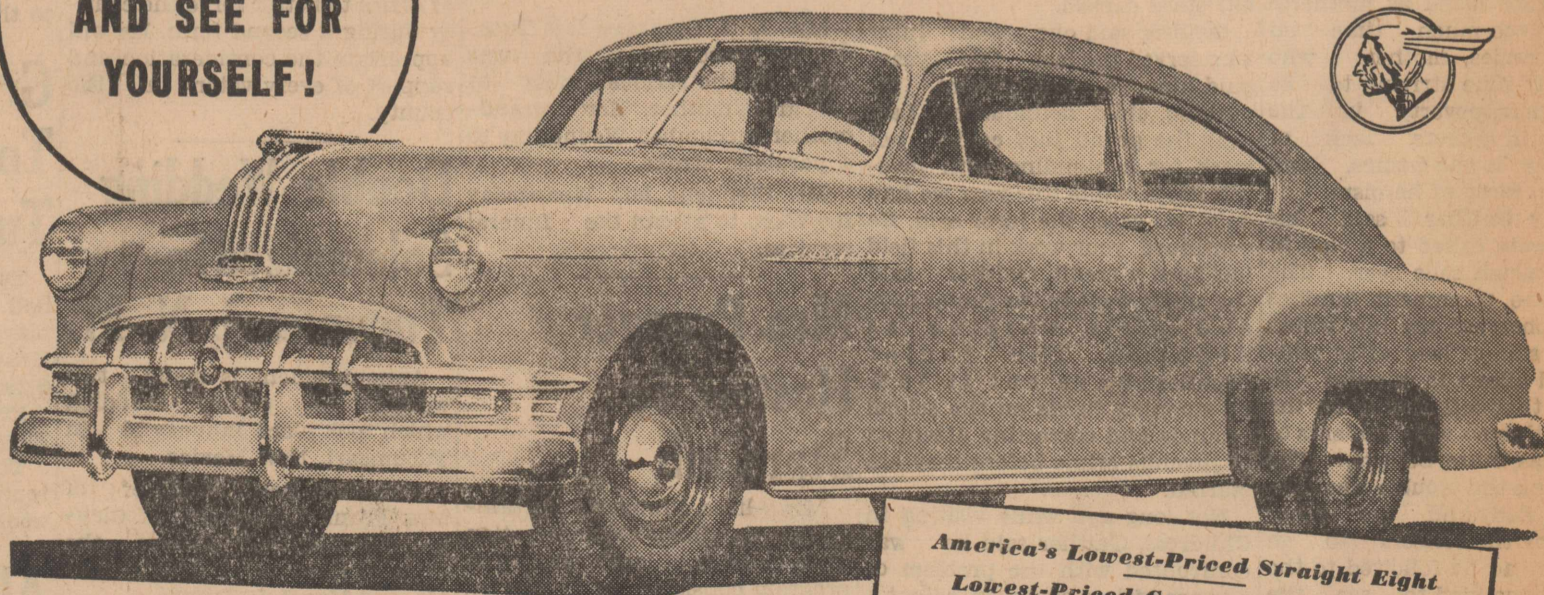

Six of the forty-seven drilling locations made in the Texas Panhandle were allocated to Sherman County. The Tascosa Gas Co., a new incorporated firm, has taken over part of the Phillips Petroleum Company lease and has expressed its intention of drilling out the lease for gas development.

Stanolind Oil & Gas Company McCornica Gas Unit No. 1 is located 1,790 feet from the west line and 1,320 feet from the north line of section 344, Block 1-T.

Stanolind Oil & Gas Company H. W. Starnes No. 1 is located 2,490 feet from the north and 2,140 feet from the east lines of section 401, Block 1-T.

Tascosa Gas Company Bivins No. 1 is 2,490 feet from the north and 2,640 feet from the west lines of section 3, Block 1-C.

Tascosa Gas Company Nusbbaum No. 1 is 2,400 feet from the north and 2,640 feet from the west line of section 94, Block 1-C.

Tascosa Gas Company McCrory No. 1 is 2,640 feet from the south and west lines of Section 233, Block 1-T, 2 miles southeast of Stratford.

Tascosa Gas Company Whorton No. 1 is 2,420 feet from the north and 2,640 feet from the west lines of section 217, Block 1-C, 4 miles south of Stevens.

## New Wheat Uses Sought By Producers

The High Plains Wheat Producers, headed by Carl J. Kuper of Dalhart, met in the Amarillo Hotel Wednesday to discuss finding new uses and outlets for wheat.

This is a research and marketing program in which all U. S. wheat growers are eventually expected to participate, Kuper said.

Growers will be asked to finance it by contributing one-fourth cent per bushel of wheat marketed.

Some wheat producing states have already perfected organizations. Texas is in the process.

Other officers of the organization are R. C. Buckles, vice-president, and W. H. Upchurch, Canyon, secretary treasurer.

"Washington and Oregon are already organized," Kuper said.

"We expect rapid organization in all states from Texas to the Canadian border. And then by that time the various state organizations will be ready to focus their efforts through a national organization with which they can be affiliated."

Representatives of wheat growers in North and South Dakota, Nebraska, Missouri, Colorado and Oklahoma were among those attending the High Plains meeting in Amarillo Wednesday.



**City Ordinance No. 132**

It is hereby ordained by the City Council of the City of Stratford, Texas in a regular meeting on this the 11th day of January A. D. 1950 that the following shall replace and repeal all previous ordinances or sections thereof which may be in conflict with this ordinance.

**FIRST FIRE LIMITS ZONE, SECONDARY FIRE LIMITS ZONE:**

An Ordinance establishing fire limits zone, establishing a secondary fire limits zone; regulating materials to be used in construction and alterations, requiring that permits be obtained before any foundation, or other work is started, and providing a penalty for violations.

The first and main fire limits zone shall include all of block No. 53, 54, 63, 64, 73, 74, and the secondary fire limits zone shall include all of the following numbered blocks: No. 59, 60, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 97, 98, and all of the Rock Island Rail Road reservation and right-of-way between Spruce Street and Grace Street.
