Texas Milk Production Drops Slightly

Texas milk production totaled 772 million pounds during October, down 5.0 percent from last year's production of 813 million pounds.

September 2012 production totaled 738 million pounds.

The number of milk cows during October averaged 430,000 head, down 5,000 thousand head from last year and down 3,000 from the September 2012 number.

Production per cow Cruijsen, Maysun averaged 1,795 pounds during October, 75 pounds lower than last year but 90 pounds higher than September 2012.







The Lady Mules kept their home record spotless by defeating both Springlake-Earth and Brownfield this past week. The Lady Mules are 3-1 early in the season.


The Springlake-Earth Lady Wolverines jumped out to an early lead Tuesday night and led 15-9 after one quarter.
