

### Former State Champs Beat Elketts

The Elketts were placed in the strongest bracket at the state tournament with three former state champions, and with the three top teams from last year's finals. One of these teams, the Seagoville Dragonettes, defeated the Elketts in the first go round of the State Tournament. They lost out by 1 point in a thrilling game 27 to 26.

Seagoville has been to state six consecutive years, winning in 1949 and placing second last year. They had only been beaten once this year out of 40 games played until Dimmit made it twice.

The Elketts held Seagoville scoreless for over half of the first quarter, while they were ahead 6 points. They held their lead 11 to 4 at the end of the first quarter and 14 to 10 at the half. In the third quarter Seagoville tied the score several times and the quarter ended 20 to 20.

In the last quarter the score was tied all the way until a free shot put Seagoville ahead, and won the ball game for them after their stalling the last 50 seconds. Avis Parrish was high point forward of the game with 13 points.

The Elketts met up with East Chambers Thursday afternoon in the consolation bracket, and lost another exciting game 37 to 44. East Chambers has come to state five consecutive years, and took third place last year over Cotton Center, and won state in 1947.

The Elketts stayed ahead all the way until the end of the third quarter, then East Chambers was leading 32 to 29. In the first quarter the Elketts led 9 to 6, and at the half they led 20 to 16.

Avis Parrish made 17 points for high point forward while Jean Price and Jean Reynolds each made 9. Margaret Menard made 16 points and Jo Ann Ryan made a high of 24 points for East Chambers. Ryan was placed on the All-State team of the tournament.

The Elketts broke an eleven point lead in the last two minutes of the game to make it seven. Millie fouled out in the last minute of the game.

Vern Reynolds, Ralph Harding, Miss Ila Lewis, and Coach Hugh Stewart each took a car load of ball girls to Waco, going by way of ACC to workout in the college gym. They arrived about 10:30 at the Roosevelt Hotel which housed several West Texas teams and Seagoville.

After coaching at Stratford for four years Coach Hugh Stewart took his team to state where he gave two of the states' best teams a thrilling score and where he placed a guard, Millie Bennett, on the All-State Team. She received a small gold basketball with a white lone star and "All State 1951" engraved on it. There were 12 All-State players picked from the 16 teams in the state tournament.

The Elketts went through the Methodist Home at Waco, visited Cameron Park, took a tour of the Baylor Campus and enjoyed these as well as State semi-finals and finals.

Saturday night the Elketts received carnation corsages for the finals from Vern Reynolds and Ralph Harding.

The gymnasium was packed to see East Chambers win the consolation, Seagoville take third place, and Dimmit and Cotton Center battle it out for the state championship. Dimmit won 36 to 30.

#### Home Improvement

Thrifty and far-sighted home makers will be especially interested in using the cooking utensils they have to best advantage and in caring for them so they will last.

#### Landscaping

Excessive pruning reduces the number of blooms and actually shortens the life of most roses. It's a proven fact that roses that receive little or no pruning at the Tyler Experiment Station produced many more blooms per plant than those that were pruned heavily. Roses are pruned continually for when the blooms are removed, pruning is done. Pruning is done primarily to give the rose plants the desired shape; to remove long and unattractive limbs or limbs that have grown into paths, or to remove dead diseased wood from the plants. It is true that some roses are so hardy that pruning seems to have little effect on them. The radiance roses are in this group. The hardy climbing roses should be treated differently from bush roses.

Minute Meditation

(By Ferguson C. Polycutt) You Can't Run Away from God

The Book of Jonah is not only one of the most interesting and entertaining stories in the Old Testament; but it is also of tremendous significance because of the contemporary nature of its message.

Jonah was a man who tried to

run away from God. However, he was not the first individual, nor the last, who has failed in his attempt to ignore the Divine Will — to escape the exacting requirements of a moral God. We, today, can take a lesson from Jonah in recognizing the futility of ignoring God's commands. expansion is made vertically instead of horizontally, and generally the net profit on a vertically expanded farm is much greater per acre than on a horizontally expanded farm.

He makes the following suggestions for vertically expanding farm production. "Use a balanced cropping system that fits the farm. Avoid the excessive use of row crops. They are more expensive to produce for more labor and usually more farm machinery is needed. The cropping and livestock programs for the farm unit should be balanced. The cropping system should include the planting on the farm of some deep rooted legumes. The acreage devoted to such legumes should be sufficient to furnish high quality forage for the farm's livestock and needed mineral nutrients should be used to insure the successful production of the legume crops.

Thornton says if these suggestions are followed, production on most farms can be increased from 25 to 40 percent without too much difficulty. The greater per acre yields will result in more net income, the maintenance of soil fertility, soil and water conservation and all add up to better rural living and more prosperous rural communities.

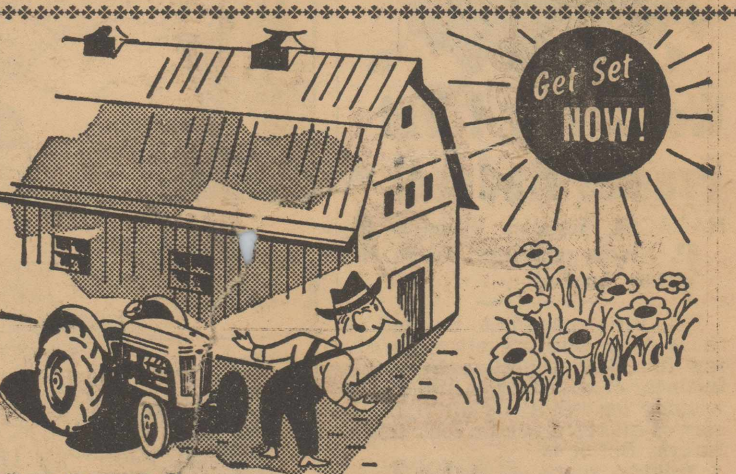

Candy stains, except chocolate, will usually yield to hot water. Cleaning fluid is a better bet on chocolate. Or, peroxide, if the fabric is white.

Always use cold water first on egg stains; hot water may "set" the stain. Soak washables a good long time in clear cold water, then launder with warm soapy water. On non-washables, let the stain dry until you can scrape most of it off with a dull knife. The remains can be removed with cleaning fluid.

After you've washed an ironing-board cover, put it back on the board while it's still damp, it will shrink up some and be smooth and tight.

If wine is spilled on the table cloth, sprinkle salt on it immediately. After it dries, if the cloth is linen, flush the spot with boiling water. Launder other washables in water that's as hot as it can safely be. Sponge non-washables with a damp cloth.

Most manufacturers of fabrics—especially those used in clothing—recommend frequent light laundering rather than occasional hard laundering. There are two good reasons for this: (1) the shorter the washing time, the longer the garment will last; and (2) perspiration contains bacteria which, given a little time to get working, will damage fabrics. So, generally speaking, laundering methods should lean toward gentle methods, neutral soaps and

a minimum of delay before clothes are laundered.

International Uniform Sunday School Lessons

SCRIPTURE: Mark 14. DEVOTIONAL READING: Isaiah 53: 1-9.

Jesus Faces Death

Lesson for March 18, 1951

MANY A STORY has been written around the theme of a man who knows he has only a short while to live. But the best of these is the story of Jesus. It is the best not only because it is true; it is the story of the best man known to history.

We Christians go further than that. We believe he was Perfect in all his human life. Jesus' way of facing death is the right way to face it, the way his followers too will choose.

Heart at Leisure FOR ONE thing, Jesus did not try to conceal from himself or others the fact that he would shortly die. Through all that happened, he was aware of his death. He neither shut his eyes to the inevitable, nor mourned over it.

Now in our sad times, with death so near to all of us, the approach of death is not something to talk about as if it were an event of the 21st century. Death may come to any of us soon; death is very likely to come to many of us soon; and sooner or later, death is certain to come to all of us. Facing death may bring out all a man's hidden selfishness. From the moment he knows his days are limited, he may think of nothing but himself and his "chances" to escape.

Jesus, on the contrary, under no illusions about escape, accepting death quietly, day by day thought of others rather than of himself.

His Friends and God MANY PERSONS, in the face of the presence of death, withdraw into themselves. They cut the ties that have bound them to others, they set their faces "outward bound." Not so with Jesus. While it was still day, he would not act as if it were night. So we find him tightening up the bonds of friendship.

It is an interesting fact that of all Jesus' living days, those which were remembered best were those which came just before his death. Part of the reason for this may be that his friends came closer to him in those days; there was a intimacy, a greater warmth, between him and his old friends than there had ever been. Even when he prayed in Gethsemane he was not content to pray alone. If there was none to watch with him and in some dim way share his agonies, it was because his friends were not awake to his need, not because he in any way turned his back on them.

Again, we find Jesus' prayer-life growing intense in those last days and nights. Nowhere else from Jesus' whole life is such a long prayer recorded as the one John puts into the story Mark tells so briefly of the last supper (John 17). Not in Jesus' whole life before, though he prayed early and often, do we hear of such agony of prayer as that in the garden before Judas came. He not only turned to his friends, and turned to God, but it is plain that he wished of all things most to bring his friends nearer to God.

Yet how many Christians are there who, if they knew death would be coming for them within the week, would think of others' spiritual welfare rather than their own? How many would help to prepare others for God, and not themselves alone?

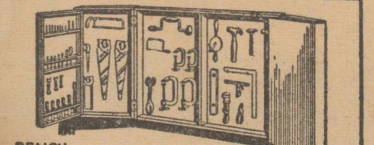
First, a Good Life THE CHURCH has always been a bit suspicious about "death-bed repentance." We know it can be real; but over a period of two thousand years it has been noticed that most people who suddenly turn good in the presence of death are likely to be just as bad as ever if death postpones his visit.

Jesus' last days were not those of a sinner trying to make up in a few short days the lost opportunities of a mis-spent lifetime. On the contrary, Jesus' last days were all of a piece with the rest of his life. Prayer, friendships, appreciation and help of others, even sacrifice, were not strange to him.

So with each of us. We all know how we ought to live if death were hovering near. But we shall have a hard time living and acting so, then, unless it is our habit already. It is well to pray for a "good death;" but the best way to have a good death is first to live the good life.

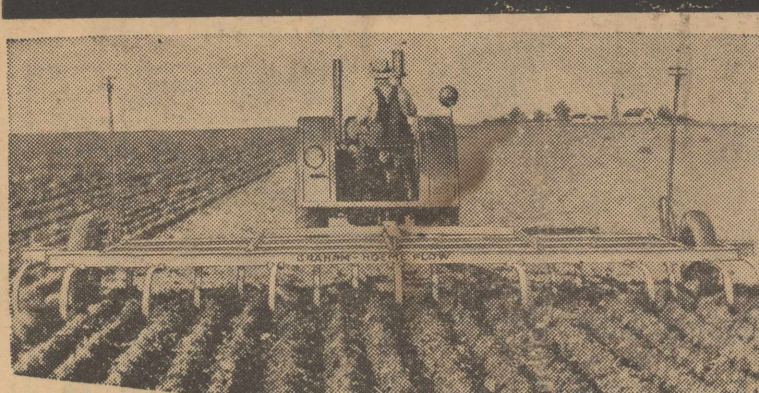

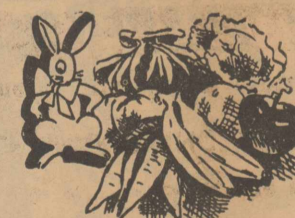
