



Electric Pacemaker Starts Heart to Beating Again

BOSTON, Mass. - An artificial electrical pacemaker that has been used successfully in animal experiments to make stopped hearts beat again was announced recently.

The pacemaker applies an elecshock to a small knob-like area of the heart. The shock stimulates this area, which in turn causes the heart to beat. By controlling the regularity of the electrical shock, doctors can thus control the beating of the heart.

The pacemaker is expected to be used for a period long enough to enable the heart to function on its own powers, and in cases of irregular heart beats, to restore the heart's action to a normal rhythm.

proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas amending Article III, Section 51a, providing that the Legislature shall have the power to provide assistance to and provide for the payment of same to residents of the State of Texas who are needy aged persons over the age of sixty-five (65) years, needy bilind persons over the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; removing the Thirty-five Million Dollars (\$35,000,000) limitation upon expenditures for such purposes and providing for a limitation of Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) upon such expenditures; providing a maximum payment of Thirty Dollars (\$30) per month from State funds for old age assistance; prohibiting payment of assistance after disposition of property under certain conditions; providing for acceptance of financial aid from the Government of the United States of America for such assistance; providing that the payment of such from State funds shall never exceed the payments from Federal funds; providing for the necessary election, and providing for the form of ballot, proclamation, and publication.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THES TATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 51a of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended, and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall hereafter read as follows:

"Section 51a. The Legislature shall have the power, by general laws to provide, subject to limitations and restrictions herein contained, and such other limitations, restrictions, and regulations as may by the Legislature be deemed expedient for assistance to, and for the payment of assistance to; "(1) Needy aged persons who are over the age of sixty-five (65) years; provided

"(3) Needy children who are under the age of sixteen (16) years; provided that any child, if otherwise eligible, may not be excluded who has resided in the State for one (1) year immediately preceding the filing of the application for such assistance, or, if said child is under the age of one (1) year, whose parent or other relative with whom the child is living has resided in the State for one (1) year immediately preceding the birth of such child.

"The Legislature shall have the authority to accept from the Federal Government of the United States such financial aid for the assistance of the needy aged, needy blind, and needy children as such Government may offer not inconsistent with restrictions herein set forth; provided, however, that the amount of such assistance out of State funds to each person assisted shall never exceed the amount so expended out of State funds for such assistance to the needy aged, needy blind and needy children shall never exceed the sum of Forty-two Million Dollars (842,000,000) per year.

"Should the Legislature enact enabling laws and provide an additional appropriation hereto in anticipation of the adoption of this Amendment, such Acts shall not be invalid by reason of their anticipatory character."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to the quall-fied electors of Texas at the Election to be held throughout the State of Texas on the Second Tuesday in November, 1951, at which election there shall be printed on such ballot the following clause:



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Section 49-b, Article III, Constitution of Texas, be amended so that the same will hereafter read as follows:
"Section 49-b. There is hereby created a Board to be known as the Veterans' Land Board, which shall be composed of the Governor, the Attorney General, and the Commissioner of the General Land Office. The Veterans' Land Board may issue not to exceed One Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000) in bonds or obligations of the State of Texas for the purpose of creating a fund to be known as the Veterans' Land Fund. Such bonds shall be executed by said Board as an obligation of the State of Texas, in such form, denominations, and upon the terms as are now prescribed by Senate Bill No. 29, Chapter 318 of the Acts of the Fifty-first Legislature (provided, that when the limitation of Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000) is used in said Senate Bill No. 29, the same shall hereafter be construed as One Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000), or as said Act may be hereafter amended, or by other laws that the Legislature may hereafter enact; provided, however, that said bonds shall bear a rate of interest not to exceed three per cent (3%) per annum, and that the same shall be sold for not less than par value and accrued interest.

"In the sale of any such bonds, a preferential right of purchase shall be given to the administrators of the warious teacher

In the sale of any such conds, a preferential right of purchase shall be given to the administrators of the various teacher retirement funds, the Permanent University Funds, and the Permanent School Funds; such bonds to be issued as needed, in the opinion of the Veterans' Land

Board.
"The Veterans' Land Rund shall be used by the Board for the sole purpose of purchasing lands suitable for the purpose hereinafter stated, situated in this State, (a) owned by the United States, or any governmental agency thereof; (b) owned by the Texas Prison System, or any other governmental agency of the State of Texas; or (c) owned by any person, firm, or corporation.

"The lands of the Veterans' Land Fund shall be sold by the State to Texas Veterans of the present war or wars, commonly known as World War II, and to Texas Veterans of service in the armed forces of the United States of America subsequent to 1945, as may be included within this program by legislative act, in such quantities, and on such terms, and at such prices and rates of interest, and under such rules and regulations as are now provided by law, or as may hereafter be provided by law.

"All moneys received and which have been received and which have not been used for repurchase of land as provided herein by the Veterans' Land Board from the sale of lands and for interest on deferred payments, shall be credited to the Veterans' Land Fund for use in purchasing additional lands to be sold to Texas Veterans of service in the armed forces of the United States of America subsequent to 1945, as may be included within this program by legislative act, in like manner as provided for the sale of lands purchased with the proceeds from the sales of the bonds, provided for herein, for a period ending December 1, 1959, to pay principal of and interest on the bonds hereafter issued by the Veterans' Land Board shall be set aside for that purpose. 





There was nothing said against eating what he liked, so they visited the best eating places, too. And they thoroughly enjoyed their visit, almost forgetting what they were there for except at the times they must keep appointments with the medical men.

In three weeks, the doctor who headed the nose and throat department said, "Mr. Henry, we are going to dismiss you today."
"But, Doctor," said Mr. Henry, "you haven't told me yet what was the matter with me.'

"Oh, nothing serious," was the reply. "You began to improve shortly after you got here."

What was the matter with him? Well, as stated above, Mr. Henry says it was nothing but worry working its way out of his system. And he has learned to put aside worry as he would the plague, for it can really bring on all sorts of things to plague a







If a hole in the plaster wall becomes too large to hold the screw, take the screw out, pack the hole with steel wool, and put the screw back in. Or, poke a wooden match into the hole, break it off at the wall surface, and then replace the screw.



FIRST AID TO THE AILING HOUSE BY ROGER C. WHITMAN

Question: I just finished the staggering task of removing some casein paint from a bathroom ceiling, by using a strong water softener solution and a scraper. I am now down to the plaster Do I treat the bare plaster the same as when new; that is, by using sizing, undercoat and then paint? I had to remove the casein paint because it started to peel and let go of the ceiling.

Answer: You did all right, for you succeeded in doing what you started out to do. But the water softening solution should all be thoroughly washed off, for if you let it stay on the ceiling, it will continue to work on your new paint and spoil the job. Use plenty of water for the wash-off. When the ceiling is quite dry, apply two coats of enamel undercoater and a finish of enamel following the directions on the label. Where you made your original mistake was in putting casein paint on the bathroom ceiling. The steam loosened the paint and caused it to peel. Enamel is the right kind of finish for bathroom and kitchen surfaces (unless you are going to use other hard finishes for the walls). Flat wall paints are not supposed to be used for these
